### Resolution 19-20-11 Accepting/Appropriating a Ford Family Foundation Pre-K Grant

### <u>Student Leadership</u> <u>Report</u>

RHS students Bailey Allen, Marin Gray and Chelsea Miller reported on current activities at RHS, including preparations for Homecoming events to include Spirit Week and a Wizard of Oz themed Assembly that will encourage more student engagement. Fall sports will be wrapping up the season before long and senior nights will recognize accomplishments of the senior athletes on those teams.
