Introduction to Reading

Understanding the assessments.

Guided Reading Level: Assessment of accuracy, fluency and comprehension in relationship to students' independent reading level. Reading behaviors are supported at each level.

- GRL: In Grades K-4 the student's Guided Reading Levels are assessed three to five times per year. This is due to the number of levels a student must move through by the end of the year. The data is used for progress monitoring.
- STAR: In grades 2-10 the STAR assessment is utilized three times per year.





Overall Trends

In 2018-2019 58% of students completed the year reading at benchmark.

This was an increase from 51% in 2017, but down from our 2014 high of 72%.



STAR Reading

A Student Growth Percentile, or SGP, compares a student's growth to that of his or her academic peers nationwide. Academic peers are students in the same grade with a similar scaled score on a STAR assessment at the beginning of the time period being examined. SGP is reported on a 1–99 scale, with lower numbers indicating lower relative growth and higher numbers indicating higher relative growth.

Specifically, SGPs tell you whether a student's growth is more or less than can be expected.

STAR Reading (cont.)

Since 2015, the average June Percentile Rank of students has remained consistently around the national average of 50.

This is noteworthy, given that our initial GRL numbers have decreased over the same time frame.

- Increase in the number of students at Goal over 2017.
- Only 1% of students in grade K finished in need of intensive support.


In 2018-2019 56% of students left Grade 3 reading at the identified benchmark levels

- 2019 cohort shows 48% of students at benchmark and 25% of students at intensive.
- Note the drop of students at the initial benchmark since 2017.

- Higher initial cohort then 2017-2018.
- While GRL did not show a higher % of students reach benchmark SBAC improved 3%.
- 2019 cohort shows 53% of students at benchmark and 32% of students at intensive.

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
Reading Supports

2019-2020 Focus




Early Literacy:

- Coaching focus on early elementary teachers in a cycle approach.
- Embedded skills in the writing process, supports grammar and spelling. IAB focus on editing.
- Focus on Standards in grade 3 to 4 cohort transition.
- Continue with the implementation of Readers/Writers Workshop (K-8).
- Providing ongoing PD for new teachers in Readers Writers Workshop (RRW) (K-8).

Monitoring Points

- STAR data reviewed and analyzed three times per year at the district level to determine growth and progress.
- Guided Reading Levels monitored year round by teachers K-8
- Analysis of IAB data, to calibrate for rigor and student SBAC readiness.
