

Winter Break 2021 in Québec

Explore Québec in all its winter glory with Monsieur and Madame Simpson during Winter Break 2021 (February 11-14)! This trip is open to all students who will be in 8th grade or above during the 2020-2021 school year. Knowledge of French is not required, but French students of all levels will have many opportunities to use the language. Our four-day stay includes comfortable lodging in a centrally located hotel, a historical tour of the city center, tobogganing at the Château Frontenac, a walkthrough of the Hôtel de Glace (Ice Hotel), dogsledding through the forest, an excursion to Montmorency Falls and the Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré Basilica, and an afternoon of snowtubing and other activities at a winter sports village. We'll also visit a Huron-Wendat village to discover the life and culture of local Native Americans and head out of the city to a *cabane à sucre* (sugar shack) where we'll enjoy a hearty Québécois meal, an evening of live traditional music and tons of handmade maple syrup treats. Best of all, we'll arrive just in time for the Carnaval de Québec, the city's fun-packed winter festival! This trip is closely aligned with topics of culture and history in Webb's French curriculum and is uniquely designed by Language & Friendship, the official travel partner of the Department of World Languages, to provide an unforgettable hands-on experience that's both educational and entertaining.
