#### NIS WINS INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL AWARD

Mr McLellan was in London for the International School Awards 2020 event on January 20. The panel of 14 judges was chaired by Emeritus Professor Jeff Thompson CBE, University of Bath. NIS was shortlisted and won the Strategic Leadership Initiative Award. Our Initiative was described as 'An initiative designed to transform learning and develop talent by focusing on strategy, embedding it around the key ideas of inclusion, creative thinking and personal excellence which has led to student-centred improvements including a student-led inquiry programme, partnerships with industry, and the development of service-driven social enterprise.' NIS was the only China based school to win an award.

#### **Novel Coronavirus----Practice usual precautions**

Recently an illness, identified as a "novel coronavirus," has had an occurrence in China. Though transmission potential and modes of transmission remain unclear, practicing the following usual precautions is advised:

- Avoid close contact with people suffering from respiratory infections
- Wash hands frequently
- Cook food and reheat the food thoroughly
- Practice good cough etiquette (wear masks, maintain distance, cover coughs and sneezes with tissues or clothing, and wash hands)
- All individuals planning travel should seek advice on the potential hazards in your chosen destinations and understand how best to protect your health

Unfortunately, even with the best care, viruses can make us sick. If symptoms appear, see a physician. Please keep in mind the guidelines below when deciding if your child should come to school. Any child with the following symptoms should stay home:

- A fever 100 degrees or higher. A child should not come back to school <u>until the</u> temperature is normal for 24 hours without medication.
- Vomiting or diarrhea
- A frequent cough
- Any rash accompanied by a fever
- Ear pain and/or eye drainage
- Sore throat with a fever and/or rash

Here at school, we have put additional infectious illness protocols in place and are in constant communication with the local Board of Health as well as iSOS in Beijing. Please feel free to contact our School Nurse with medical queries and Mr. Bratton with any other questions.

#### Planning

#### Process

All students/staff/parents collect sponsor names on the sponsor form outside school hours.

Sign up for a time slot on Veracross. Click here to sign up, first come first serve for each time slot. Advanced swimmers may sign up for several time slots (11.00-14.30).

Swim laps / widths & pick up your participation band from the friendly NIS pool staff.

Collect all the promised money in a sealed labelled envelope (name, amount raised) & hand the money to the cashier window for Account: Grace Jiang Fund.
