Many of our students will be using the following apps or websites. Some of these programs may require account logins; students will be using their standard MRIS credentials. The accounts will be created by the students and/or MRIS staff. Some provide student access using a class code (not an individual student login) but may provide a location for students to post work.















All students will not use all sites; if you have specific questions about which sites your student will be accessing, please ask your child or his/her teachers. If you would like to login to any of the sites, just ask your student for his or her login information (when applicable). Please visit a site's privacy policy or terms of use links for additional information. Also, some apps/sites are parent communication tools and may contain pictures or videos of your child. Other sites and apps that do not require a login or include student work may also be used in classrooms.
