CAMP HOURS:

Most of our camps are 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. Please check the camp descriptions carefully as we do offer several half-day camps.

HALF-DAY CAMP TIMES:

9:00 a.m. – 11:45 a.m. 12:15 p.m. – 3:00 p.m.

Note: All half-day campers will eat lunch

at 11:45 a.m.

HALF-DAY CAMPS:

If a camper is attending a morning camp only, parents may pick up at 12:15 p.m. If a camper is attending an afternoon camp only, parents may drop off at 11:45 a.m. for lunch. Pick ups and drop offs will be at the SUMMER at the Academy office located in the Lower School.

AGES:

Please see camp descriptions for grade level requirements. Our youngest campers must be at least 5 years old by September 1, 2020, in accordance with Virginia state licensing requirements.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS:

A copy of your child's birth certificate and most recent physical or health form (State of Virginia: MCH-213E) are required. Please email both documents to summer@norfolkacademy.org.

MEDICAL:

We have a registered nurse on campus from 8:45 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. Medications needed during camp must be brought to the clinic in their original containers, by a parent or guardian, along with documentation signed by a physician indicating administration and dosage.

REGISTRATION & FEES:

Applications may be completed online: www. norfolkacade my.org/summer. You will be prompted to enter the "Campwise Registration System." \$100 deposit per camp is due at the time of registration. Payment plans will be set up in equal payments to be fully paid by June 1st, 2020, and charged automatically to the credit card on file. If registering after June 1st, camp registrations must be paid in full. Campers with an outstanding balance will not be permitted to participate in SUMMER at the Academy. Visa, American Express, MasterCard, and Discover are accepted.

BEFORE/AFTER CAMP CARE:

This program is a service provided for parents requiring extended care for their children. We offer quality supervision from 7:30 a.m. – 9:00 a.m. and from 3:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. A snack is provided in the afternoon. Parents are required to sign their children in and out each day using the Kinderlime Registration System. New users will be directed to create an account.

FEES:

Before and After Care (Weekly): \$100.00 Before Care Only (Weekly): \$40.00 Before Care Drop In (as needed/daily): \$10.00 After Care Only (Weekly): \$70.00 After Care Drop In (as needed/daily): \$18.00

REFUND POLICY:

A refund will not be given unless requested in writing two weeks prior to the opening date of the session(s) for which your camper is enrolled. No refund will be given for a camper dismissed due to disciplinary action. Camp fees will also not be prorated for illness or other reasons camper is unable to attend the full week(s).

- Cancellations before June 1st, 50% of the per camp deposit is non-refundable.
- Cancellations after June 1st, 100% of the per camp deposit is non-refundable.

All camps and course offerings are subject to maximum and minimum enrollments. Under-enrolled programs may be cancelled.

LUNCH:

Lunch is included in most of the camp registrations. SAT, ACT, and Driver's Education may purchase lunch. Campers may bring a bagged lunch or eat a hot lunch in our Refectory. Lunch service includes an entree, side, dessert, and

drink. We also have a deli bar available and a fruit and yogurt bar. The Summer lunch menu will be available online June 1st, 2020.

SWIMMING:

The Norfolk Academy indoor pool (depth 4' to 13') is used for both swimming lessons and free-swim periods. The pool staff consists of certified lifeguards and instructors. Lifeguards will review the pool rules at the start of each week.

CLOTHING:

All clothes and equipment should be labeled with your camper's name. Most camps include a swim period so campers should pack a swimsuit and towel daily. Campers must wear athletic shoes for both indoor and outdoor activities. Norfolk Academy will not be responsible for any items lost while participating in summer camps.

T-SHIRTS:

Each camper will receive one T-shirt with his or her summer registration. Please remember to indicate size preference on the application.

FIELD TRIPS:

Your online signature on the camp registration form gives your child permission to participate in sponsored field trips and to travel in authorized Norfolk Academy owned or contracted vehicles. Participation on field trips and riding in camp transportation is a privilege. Please review the bus conduct rules with your child.

Norfolk Academy does not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, religion, color, national or ethnic origin.

CAMP TRANSPORTATION: BUS TRANSPORTATION SERVICE: FREE!

Round-trip bus service is available for full-day campers. Registration is required. Bus service is available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Transportation is not guaranteed to campers who do not register. Half-day campers may ride the bus one-way as applicable. Mid-day transportation is not provided.

PLEASE NOTE: All campers under the age of 11 must be met at the bus by an adult. Permission to walk from the bus stop must be submitted in writing for children older than 11.

BUS CONDUCT RULES:

No fighting, swearing, or abusive behavior. Children must remain properly seated with seat belts (when available) at all times. Children must not have any part of their bodies out of the vehicle. No eating or drinking on the vehicles. Potentially dangerous actions will not be tolerated.

CARPOOL:

Morning Drop Off: Cars will be loaded and unloaded on the curb between 8:35 a.m. and 8:55 a.m. Please follow all directions given by staff and traffic guards on campus.

Afternoon Pick Up (Full day camps):

Campers should be picked up no later than 3:15 p.m. All campers with last name A-L will be in the lanes closest to Norfolk Academy (odd lanes). 



Swim Academy and Stroke Development is a 45-minute swimming program offered Monday-Friday in two convenient sessions. This program is for beginners and advanced swimmers. 
