

 - Provide Exploration, Acceleration, and Remediation
- Roo Time
 - Currently every Wednesday and Thursday

7 PERIOD DAY

- Exploration Enrolling of different or additional elective courses
- Acceleration Taking accelerated courses such as Advanced Placement (AP), or dual credit opportunities like Running Start or College in the High School
- Remediation Getting additional support or making up credit
- All students will register for 7 classes

GRADUATION PATHWAYS

- House Bill 1599 changes graduation requirements.
 - Students must complete a high school and beyond Plan, meet all district and\or high school requirements and meet the state 24 credit requirement.

GRADUATION PATHWAYS

- Meet or exceed the Smarter Balanced Assessment in ELA and Math
- Complete and qualify for college credit in dual credit courses identified as Running Start or College in the High School Courses.
- Earn credit in a high school transition course like Bridge to College.
- Earn high school credit with a c+ grade or a score of 3 or higher on a math and ELA AP exam.
- Meet or exceed the scores on SAT or ACT as established by State Board of Education.
- Meet Standard on the Armed services vocational aptitude Battery
- Complete a sequence of CTE courses that are relevant to a students post secondary pathway.

GRADUATION PATHWAYS

- Take SBA in sophomore year. Most of our students pass ELA.
- In junior and senior year, start looking at other options if necessary.

HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT IN MS


 Students who have completed high school courses before attending high school shall be given high school credit which will be applied to fulfilling high school graduation requirements. Students and parents may request this not be added to transcript.

ATTENDANCE

- Consistent attendance = academic success.
- Students with excessive absences fail classes.
- Parents must excuse absences within 48 hours.
- By the Washington Administrative Code: Excused absences are defined as illness, doctor appointments, legal appointments and religious holidays.
- Students who are tardy will receive detentions.

WHAT IS SIMILAR ABOUT EVERY HIGH SCHOOL IN THE DISTRICT?

Common district high school graduation requirements:

- State Requirements
 - Smarter Balance Assessments
 - High School and Beyond Plan
 - Washington State History
- Credit-Based Requirements
 - 24 total credits

DEFINITION OF CREDITS:

In high schools in the United States, where all courses are usually the same number of hours, often meeting every day, students earn one credit for a course that lasts all year, or a half credit per course per semester. Credits are earned each semester for a course if the course is passed. Passing grades are A's, B's, C's and D's. An F grade is failing and will not earn credit and the course will need to be repeated and passed to earn credit.

Parents will receive a report card notifying them of the courses and grades students have earned at the quarter and the semester.

Students need to earn 24 credits to graduate from high school. Students can earn 3.5 credits per semester or 7.0 credits per year. A 7 period day schedule will provide the opportunity to earn a total of 28 credits.



AP CAPSTONE PATHWAY (NEW)

AP Capstone Pathway:

(Available to Sophomores-2021/Juniors-2020/Seniors-2019)

- Earn a AP Capstone diploma
 AND your high school diploma
- The program includes a twocourse sequence: AP Seminar and AP Research, PLUS 4 other AP courses of your choice
- Students must score at least a level 3 on all 6 AP exams to earn the AP Capstone Diploma
- Students must be co-currently enrolled in AP Seminar/AP Research AND another AP course

- Students who only take AP Seminar and AP Research, but not 4 other AP courses, will earn an AP Capstone Research Certificate
- AP Seminar=Sophomores/Juniors
- AP Research=Juniors/Seniors
- AP Seminar is the prerequisite
- Both <u>VERY</u> large group and individual, projects required
- College-level research courses
- TALK WITH YOUR COUNSELOR ABOUT THIS IF YOU ARE INTERESTED!

WHAT IS THE HIGH SCHOOL AND BEYOND PLAN?

- A plan for a 4-year high school program of study, aligned to a student's interests, goals, and plans for post high school
- A plan that gets revised and updated through a student's high school experience
- A process that requires students, parents, and school personnel to review and potentially revise a student's program of study regularly over the course of high school

COMPLETING THE HIGH SCHOOL & BEYOND PLAN

- Our district uses Xello which is an internet based career exploration & planning tool to develop a post-high school plan
- Starts in 8th grade
- In high school, students are assigned activities each year that they are required to complete
- Grade level advisors help with: completion of activities, meeting with students to develop a plan, support students through the process
- We are supportive of all post-high school plans and look forward to working along side your students to find the right fit

REGISTRATION REQUEST FORM

- Students will be given a form with required courses filled in.
- Students should review the course catalog and talk to their teachers and parents about their course choices.
- If necessary, students should make changes to the form so they are placed in the appropriate level of required courses.
- Help your student choose remaining elective courses that are available to freshmen.
- Think about other commitments and balance.



EXAMPLE SCHEDULE FOR 9TH GRADE

7 period day

- 1st period-Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2, or other math
- 2nd period-Biology
- 3rd period-Elective or World Language
- 4th period-English 9
- 5th period-Health/PE
- 6th period-Modern World History 1
- 7th period-Elective

Elective Examples for Freshman year:

- ➤ Fine, Visual or Performing Arts
- ➤ Career and Tech Education (CTE)
- ➤ Additional PE
- ➤ Social Studies electives
- ➤ English electives

AN EXAMPLE OF THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

- 9th graders arrive at 8 AM before 10-12 graders arrive on campus.
- Student will receive their schedules on the first day of school at 8 AM when then arrive.
- 9th graders attend an orientation followed by an opportunity to follow their schedule. Leadership students will be available to help students navigate the building.
- At 10 AM the 10-12 grade students arrive.

FALL SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENT PROCESS

- Students receive final schedules on the first day of school.
- Students follow schedule for first two days of school
 - If student has "See Counselor," is missing a period, or two classes are scheduled at same time, she/he should come to the Counseling Center during that period to select a class.
- At end of second day, students may download a Schedule Adjustment Request form.
- It's possible that counselors will need to balance class sizes at the beginning of the second week.

REMINDERS!

 Have your student think very carefully about course selections.

 It is very difficult to adjust schedules in the fall since any changes are subject to space availability.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR INVOLVEMENT

Students who engage in school activities tend to have social/emotional and academic success

- Wide selection of clubs there's something for nearly everyone.
- All students participating in any extracurricular activities (all clubs, drama, sports) need to have an ASB card. ASB cards can be purchased online in August before school starts.

LWHS ATHLETICS PHILOSOPHY

 Sports should be a fun and rewarding experience.

- SPALDING STATE OF THE STATE OF
- We encourage multi-sport participation over specialization in a single sport year-round.
- Coaches are committed to providing a safe, nurturing, positive atmosphere for all athletes, regardless of ability level.
- Coaches promote and expect excellence in the classroom, as well as character and integrity always.
- School administrators, the athletic director and our coaches expect LWHS student-athletes to be role models in the school, on the playing fields, and in our communities.

SPORT SEASONS

- Fall (mid August mid November): crosscountry, football, boys' golf, girls' soccer, girls' swim & dive, boys' tennis, slowpitch softball, and volleyball
- Winter (mid November late February): basketball, gymnastics, boys' swim & dive, and wrestling
- Spring (late February end of May): badminton, baseball, girls' golf, boys' soccer, fastpitch softball, girls' tennis, track & field
- Other activities: cheer squad, dance/drill

WHY SPORTS AND ACTIVITIES?

Studies show that students who participate in extra-curricular activities, versus those who do not, are more likely to:

- Have higher grade point averages
- Have fewer absences from school
- Graduate on time
- Have fewer discipline problems
- Have a positive self-image
- Learn to handle adversity and overcome failures
- Learn the importance of discipline, hard work, dedication and commitment

ELIGIBILITY & PARTICIPATION FEES

Students and parents need to understand the requirements of eligibility, including:

- ✓ Pass at least 6 of 7 classes
- Be aware that playing sports has inherent risks including concussions
- LWSD drug/alcohol/tobacco and behavior policy
- ✓ Proof of insurance
- Proof of current physical exam (good for 2 yrs)
- ✓ Participation fee \$200 per sport (\$400/\$725 cap)
- ✓ ASB fee one time per year \$50

REGISTERING FOR SPORTS

- Registration is done seasonally, via "Final Forms" on LWSD website.
- Summer: Some sports programs have a summer offering. They are completely optional. Incoming 9th grade students may participate beginning June 8th (after MS Season 4).
- Registration for Fall Sports begins August 3rd.
- Sports Fee payment and ASB purchase is made via online payment system or at ASB Bookkeeper window.


