SENIOR BANQUET



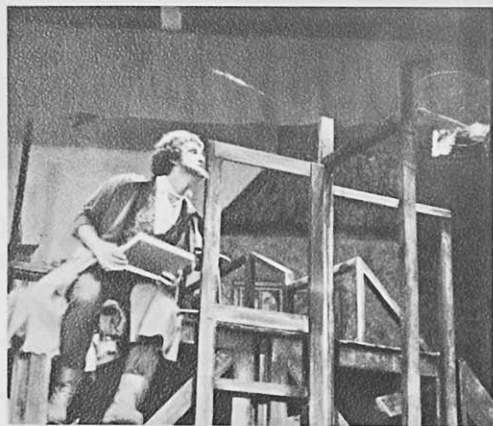
