UNITY IN DIVERSITY

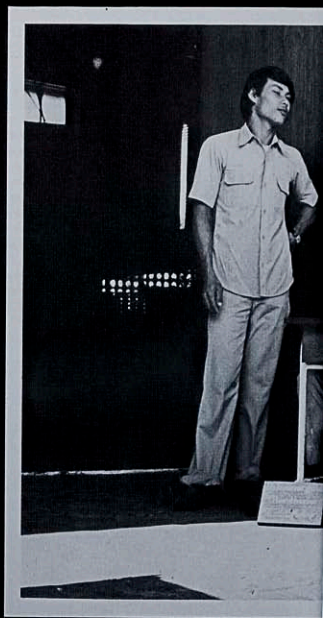
We should all see how a people that is diverse in culture, geography, and resources is united under this motto.

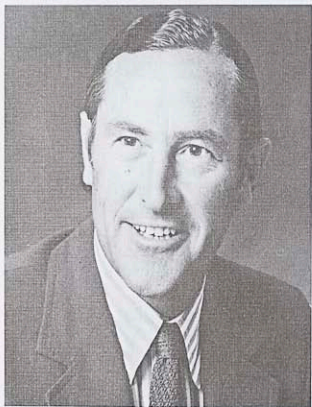

BOARD OF EDUCATION

Originally founded in 1951 as the International School, the Joint Embassy School was formally established in 1969 under the joint sponsorship of the embassies of Australia, Great Britain, the United States, and Yugoslavia.

The school is governed by a twelve-member Board of Education. Four members represent the sponsoring embassies, four are co-opted by the embassies from the foreign community at large, and four members are elected by the JES Parents Association.

Beginning in 1969 with five modules containing only 16 classroom, 3 science labs, music and art rooms, a library, and an administrative office, the Cilandak campus has since grown to include 17 modules, a gymnasium, and tennis courts. The final phase of the campus will be completed in 1977 when the swimming pool is finished. The Pattimura Elementary School is still maintained for some of JES's kindergarten - third grade students.

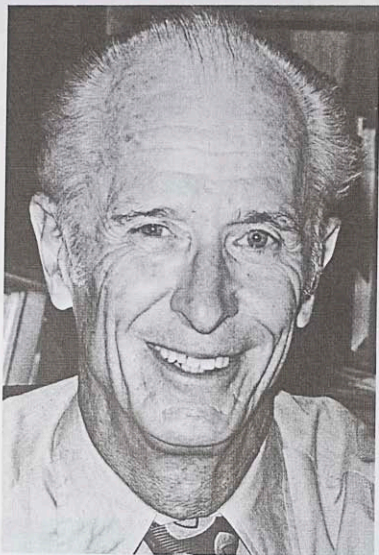
Along with the growth in facilities, the student population has also expanded. Enrollment reached a peak in 1975-76 with 1735 students attending JES from 41 different countries. The Class of 1977 has 109 graduates compared to the Class of 1970 with only seven. Approximately 50% of the student population is from the United States, with the other half representing countries throughout the world.

The 1976-77 school year marks an important stage in the history of the Joint Embassy School. Board of Education members have been preparing for the transition in September when JES receives a new legal status and a new name - the Jakarta International School.

workshop. This gave StuCo members a chance to become better-acquainted with each other and with Council Adviser, Dean Clemson.

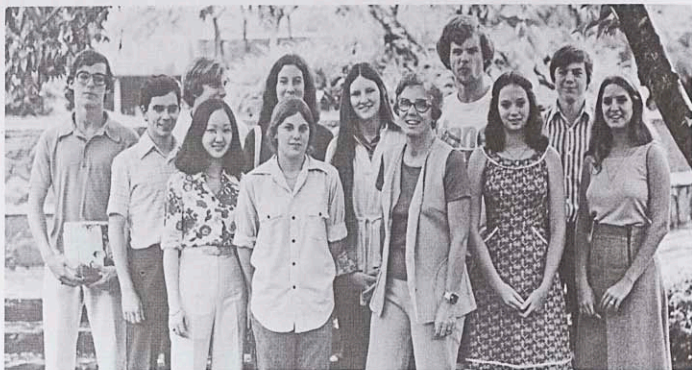

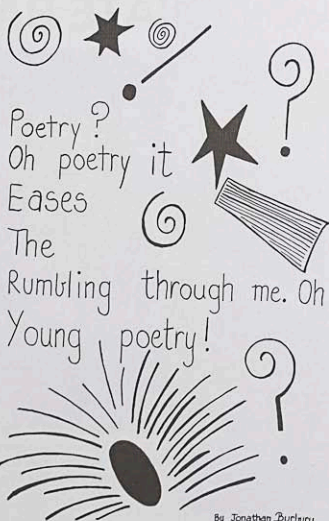
TOLONG ANAK ANAK

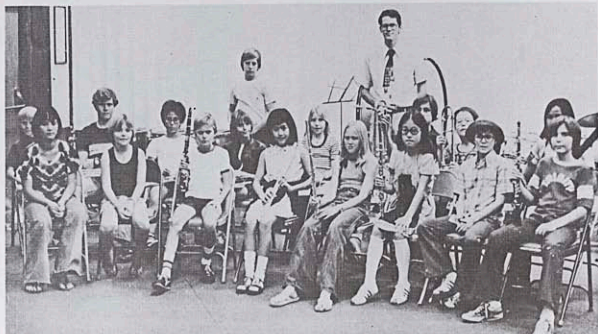

JOINT SOUNDS



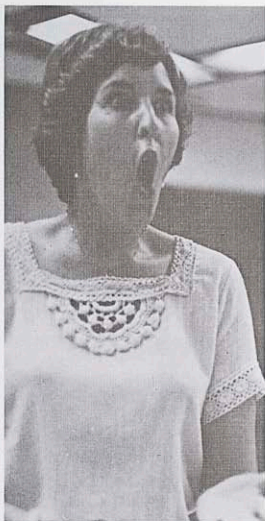

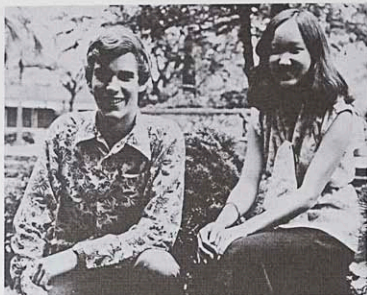

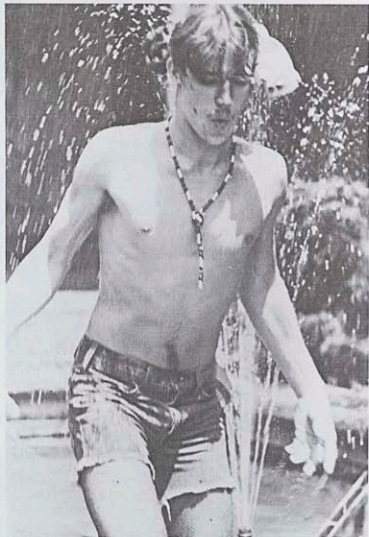


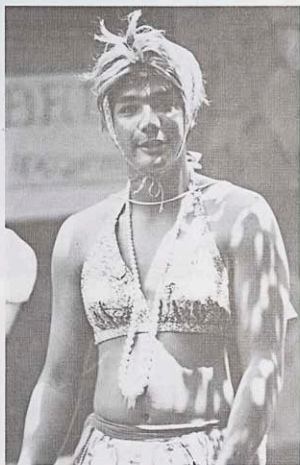


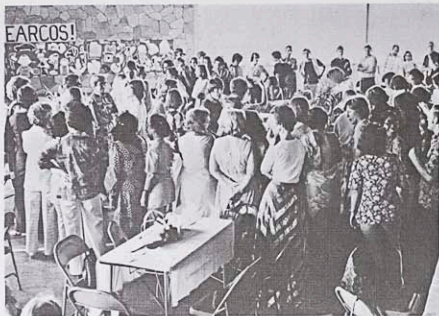
SENIOR SLAVE DAY

The Slave Sale culminated a week of demonstrations of senior superiority, including a Senior Power Proclamation Rally, a Senior Party, and a Senior Tribunal.

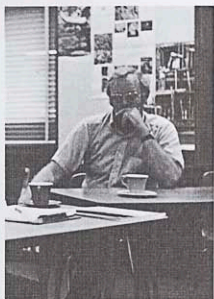






E A R C O S

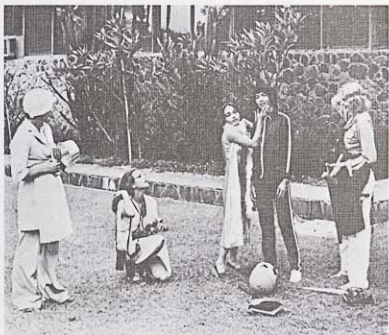

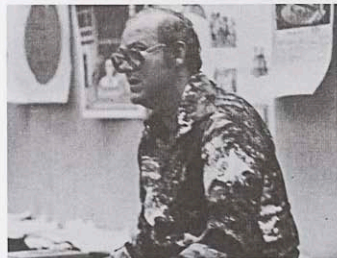

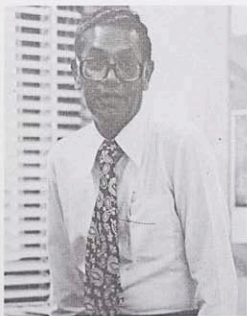

Although the celebrations were not as festive as the previous years, the atmosphere that prevailed was, nevertheless, one of "brotherhood, unity, and understanding."

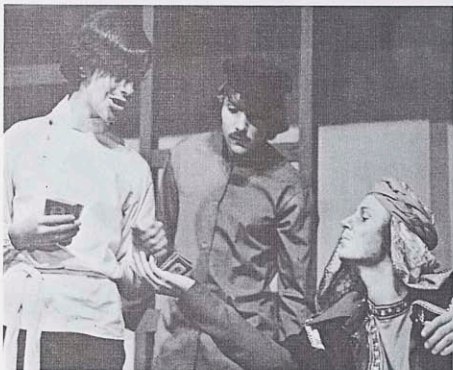
