# Future of Learning Principles (1 of 2)



- All WBLAS stakeholders (Students, Staff, Administration, Parents, and Community Members) are lifelong learners.
- We will build and develop a culture that is grounded in trust, inclusive of all, and supportive of all stakeholders.
- We will always be responsive to a learner's needs.
  - Use of time will support the developmental needs of our students
- We believe collaboration is an essential part of learning.
- We will create inclusive structures, systems and traditions to deliver the best education for every student to learn without restraint.
- Students lead their learning.
  - Students will be the driving agents in determining and exhibiting / demonstrating their mastery.

- All staff lead their learning.
  - We will provide consistent and relevant professional development of the highest quality for all staff.
- Educators will be empowered facilitators who are flexible, collaborative coaches of student agency.
- Students will be exposed to a robust variety of learning opportunities and experiences.
  - Curriculum will be standards-based, interdisciplinary, culturally relevant, and developed collaboratively.


