






Graduate Profile Work

One-on-One Counseling Sessions

Counselors will meet *individually* with each student for a 30-minute academic planning session.

Parent meetings for **rising 9th-11th grades** will be scheduled *after April 15tb* if needed. For **rising 12th grade**, Mrs. Latta will schedule meetings in **May**.

Registration

- Registration will occur during the *one-on-one counseling session*.
- Once students select their courses and register with their counselor, *parents will be able to view those selections in Renweb* for a period of time.
- If a student has been approved for an Honors course, they will be able to register for the course.
- If a student is approved for an Honors course during the reconsideration period in May, their course selections will be changed at that time.

A Few Things to Remember

- Colleges are looking for students who have demonstrated not just academic achievement, but intellectual curiosity and a desire to make an impact in their school and community.
- As one college website stated, "This could look like doing one thing brilliantly, or several things exceedingly well."
- Honors courses will not make or break a student's college opportunities.
 Take them when they are a natural fit and challenge.
- Grades and ACT /SAT scores are important but they are not the only thing that colleges consider when admitting students and awarding scholarships. Teacher recommendations are important — strong candidates for admissions and scholarships cultivate relationships with your teachers.

A Few Things to Remember

As you consider what you want your high school experience to look like, strive for a healthy balance.

- Church and Youth Ministry attend, participate, serve, grow
- Join a team or sport band, choir, an athletic team
- Explore an interest through clubs at school and in the community
- Invest time and energy in healthy friendships
- Serve regularly at the local level and consider a mission trip
