Please Help Us!

I’m sure you are all aware of the difficult funding situation schools face from the coverage in the media. If I explain how school dinners and free school meals work, then you might be able to help us.

Cancel School Meals when your Child is Absent

Children in Reception, Year One, and Year Two are entitled to free school meals. Additionally, there are many other children who have free-school-meal entitlement. This is entirely supported by the school and our staff. School claims the cost of these particular meals from the Council but we can only claim for those meals that are ordered and eaten.

When a dinner is ordered and the child is absent from school—or decides to have a packed lunch instead—without cancelling their school dinner, school is still charged for that dinner by the catering company and we cannot claim the money back from the Council. This extra cost is paid for from school funds. Ouch!

Please cancel your child’s dinner if you possibly can when they are absent so school does not have to pay for it. Thank you very much for helping us with this.

Registering for Free-School Meals

For families who are on low income, the Government gives their children’s school extra money and it also gives the children free school meals. This is called Pupil Premium money. This money makes a real difference to our school. It helps us pay for a Teaching Assistant in every class every morning of the week. It also helps us to run catch-up groups for children who need it.

Children in Reception, Year One and Year Two receive free school meals but this alone does not make the Government give us Pupil Premium money. For this to be paid, parents must register on-line using the link below. It is quick, confidential and benefits your child and other children in the school enormously.

Scabies—Please look out for an itchy rash on the skin

We have had one case of scabies in school. We know the source of this parasitic infection was not from the school and the person concerned has sought medical attention and is keeping away from school. Like other parasitic infections, this was caused purely by being in contact with someone else who was infected.

If someone in your family has an itchy rash that spreads, and they feel well, then please visit your GP to check it out. Scabies is highly contagious so please don't ignore any signs of a spreading itchy rash.



Wasps!

At the end of Thursday lunchtime, a wasps' nest was disturbed on the playing field resulting in some children being stung by angry wasps.

Staff acted immediately by removing the children from the playing field, very quickly applying first aid and contacting parents. Our afternoon playtime was cancelled (sorry children) and the field was immediately cordoned off.

Dave 'The Exterminator' was called straight away who treated the wasps' nest within 2 1/2 hours. Dave advised that the wasps would all be dead within 2 hours. We scoured the school grounds and could not detect any other nests.

Our field was soon safe for the children to play on. Children often panic when wasps are about, so please advise them not to approach a nest should they see one and certainly not disturb it. We will also be talking to the children about this in school.

Dear Parents,

One of the pupils in our school has recently been diagnosed with a serious medical condition. They are being treated by the medical staff at University Hospitals Coventry and Warwickshire.

Due to the intensity of the treatment, some simple precautions are necessary to help them stay well and we need your help to do this.

This pupil is much more likely to catch infectious diseases from other pupils because the medicines used for treatment weaken the body's natural immune system. Of particular concern, is chicken pox and measles.

Serious complications from chicken pox can be avoided if the pupil receives preventative treatment within 72 hours of being exposed to the virus. The important factor will be determining whether or not this pupil has been exposed at school. This will require the cooperation of all of our families.

If you believe that your child has contracted or recently been exposed to chicken pox, shingles or measles, please contact the school office as soon as possible. We will then alert the family so they can be advised to take the proper precautions.

Please do not allow children with suspected chicken pox/measles to attend school until all of the blisters have dried and formed into scabs. This is usually about 7-10 days after the onset of the rash. Pupils with unexplained rashes should also not attend school until the rash has been identified as non-infectious by a doctor.

The best way to protect a child from measles is for all children to be immunised against the disease. If you child has not already been vaccinated, I urge you to please discuss immunisation with your GP. If you suspect your child has measles you should let the school know immediately.

If your child has sickness of diarrhoea, then please do not allow them back into school until 48 hours have passed since their last episode. This is to protect not only this child, but our whole school community.
