- Reflective Project
- Service Learning

  - one IB course must be 2 years
- Requirements to receive the Career-Related Diploma:
  - Complete career pathway requirements
  - score of 3 or more on two IB exams
  - Pass Reflective Project
  - Service Learning portfolio completed
  - Language Development portfolio completed
  - PPS class completed successfully

## ib Diploma Programme



- Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) for 18 months
- Extended Essay (EE)
  - 4000-word independent research project
- Theory of Knowledge courses junior (ToK I) and senior year (ToK II)
  - Essay on prescribed title + presentation
- Requirements to receive the IB Diploma
  - 6 Exams totaling 24 points from 6 IB courses
  - Exams must be taken from across the curriculum and the student's IB plan will follow IB protocols
- CAS, ToK, and EE passed successfully

- Group 2** – French SL/HL, Spanish SL/HL
- Group 3** – Business Management SL/HL, Geography SL, Environmental Systems and Society SL\*\*, History of Americas HL, Psychology SL/HL
