4. **Searching for Courses**
 - a. For full course info, use the search box at the top of the page.
 - b. Search for a course by course number (full number) or by course name (you may enter part of a name if unsure of the full name).
5. **Selecting your courses**
 - a. When you find the course you want, select it and click the **Add to Grade 9** button within the search results.
 - b. The course (and any related courses) will be added to your Academic Plan.
6. **Quick Search**
 - a. You may also search for a course right in the Academic Plan.
 - b. Selecting the course from the search automatically adds it to your Academic Plan.
