**NOTE:** Students who have been approved for **The FLASH** should also sign up for one quarter of reading and one quarter of writing. For course numbers 0358-0359 The FLASH C & D, elective credit only is earned and do not count as an English/Language Arts credit.

3.  On my registration card I have placed an "X" in front of the required **Economics A** and the appropriate social studies courses.  
**NOTE:** Seniors are required to complete four quarters of **Social Studies** courses to graduate. All seniors will take Economics A for one quarter and most will take Economics B for one quarter. For the other two quarters, seniors may select either Sociology A-B or Psychology A-B. Seniors who are recommended for **Developmental Psychology**, or are requesting **AP: Psychology and/or AP: Microeconomics/AP: Macroeconomics** should not register for Economics A. This requirement will be embedded these courses.
4.  Students are required to complete a one quarter arts course anytime during grades 9-12 to meet the "**Minnesota Arts**" requirement. This course may be any course in the art or music departments for students in grades 9-12. Students in grades 10-12 may fulfill the requirement in any of the following: Dance Tech, Fashion Design Trends, Interior Design A, Acting, Marketing C-Advertising, or any Multimedia course.
5.  It is strongly recommended for students planning to attend a post-secondary educational option to register for a 4<sup>th</sup> year of **Math and Science**. For **Science** the core course recommended option is Physics. Additional elective options include Applied Mathematics, Applied Science and Anatomy and Physiology courses. **NOTE:** *Designated students will be directed to take a concept level course. These are permission only math and science courses.*
6.  On my registration card I put an "X" in front of the appropriate **Physical Education** course. **NOTE:** *Students must complete/pass 5 quarter courses in physical education in addition to Wellness 1, Wellness 2, Wellness 3, and Safety Ed to be eligible for graduation.*
7.  For students who registered for courses under **Student Work Program**, a work program coordinator has initialed my registration form to verify that I have been accepted into the program.
8.  For students who registered for courses **Special Education** courses, my special education teacher/case manager has signed this registration form.
9.  Teachers have initialed my registration form for "permission only" courses.
