BOARD MEMBER REPORTS

- Board Member Mrs. Layla Spanenberg provided a legislative update. She reported there are 170 education related bills that are active in the Statehouse and that the district continues to monitor these pieces of legislation. On February 11, Mrs. Spanenberg shared that she will be attending the ISBA Statehouse Day. Mrs. Spanenberg mentioned that the CCS website has been updated with the 2020 CCS Legislative Priorities and areas of common interest and focus.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- Dr. Beresford congratulated CHS athlete Katie Mattingly who became Carmel's first Wrestling Coaches Association Girls State Champion. Katie dominated the regional competition and came into the state finals ranked #2. Her finals match was against a girl who defeated Katie last year, but this time, Katie scored a late take-down and near fall to claim the title of state champion in the 126 lb. weight class. Katie and her sister, Haley, are both part of the wrestling program and wrestle with the team every day. Haley is also a talented wrestler and placed state runner-up in the 120 lb. weight class.
- Dr. Beresford mentioned that Carmel Clay Schools will be offering another round of Parent QPR Training on February 11th. Similar to CPR, QPR is a 90 minute training course designed to assist participants with recognizing a crisis and warning signs for someone who may be contemplating suicide. Each participant will learn and practice the Question, Persuade, and Referral method and will be provided with resources and supports that are available in the community. - Dr. Beresford reported that tickets are on sale for the 17th Annual Taste of Carmel. This event is Orchard Park Elementary's biggest fundraiser of the year and helps support the costs of classroom materials, field trips, and school-wide programs for students. The event will be held on March 5th at 502 East Event Center in Carmel. More than 1,000 guests will come together to sample food and drink from nearly 50 vendors. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT (CONT.)

- Dr. Beresford shared with the Board that there is a critical bus driver shortage facing the school district. He stated that the district has been actively recruiting drivers, identifying new ways to connect with potential drivers and traveling to hiring fairs across the state. Despite these efforts, the district is receiving only a few applicants. He mentioned that due to the bus driver shortage, the transportation department struggles each morning to cover multiple routes. The district began "double-routing" as a stop-gap measure last year, and unfortunately, this "double-routing" pattern has continued into this school year. Dr. Beresford warned that if the bus driver shortage continues, the district may need to lengthen bus routes, establish walk zones around our schools or go to multiple school day start and end times to be able to cover bus routes. The district is forming a bus driver recruitment task force to evaluate the situation and make recommendations. Dr. Beresford encouraged the public to reach out to friends, neighbors and anyone that might be interested in driving a school bus. He stated the district provides paid training for you to earn a CDL license and has experienced bus trainers that will travel routes with you until you are comfortable to drive alone. He shared that the transportation department is an exceptional group of people who make a positive difference in the lives of kids and families across the district. 
