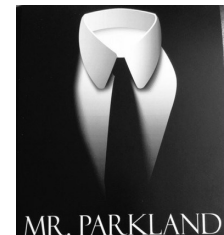

from 8 – 10:30 AM in the Parkland High School Library.

No student can participate in a spring sport without a full PIAA physical. Recertification forms may be used for a spring sport if the athlete had a full physical for a fall or winter sport in 2019. The Parkland Athletic Department understands that it may not be convenient to come to our scheduled free physical event. However, those who miss must get a PIAA physical on their own prior to March 2, 2020. Paperwork for this is on the PHS website <https://phs.parklandsd.org/> under Departments - Athletics - Forms. All Parkland athletes must get an ImPACT test once during their four years at PHS and before participation.

The first day of spring sports is Monday, March 2.

INFORMATION FROM THE HEALTH ROOM

PREVENTIVE MEASURES

The cold and flu season is in full force and the Health Room would like to remind you of some information about prevention:

- Wash your hands frequently.
- Cover your cough.
- Get a flu shot.
- Get adequate rest.
- Eat healthy, nutritious food.

GUIDELINES FOR ILLNESS

Please keep your child home from school, despite scheduled tests or sporting events, if he or she is experiencing any of the following symptoms:

- fever of 100 degrees or more
- vomiting/diarrhea
- severe head cold
- persistent cough
- severe sore throat

Students should not return to school until they are fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications.

These are the same criteria the Health Room uses as a guideline when sending students home ill from school.

The Health Room does not have cold or allergy medicine.

JUNIORS — 11th GRADE PHYSICALS

All eleventh grade students should return their physical forms to the Health Room as soon as possible. If you would like the physical performed by the School Physician, please contact the Health Room as soon as possible.

NEW IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENT

The Meningitis Vaccine is required on or after the student's 16th birthday. Students in the 11th grade will be required to have this immunization on the first day of their senior year. The 11th grade physical is a good time to be sure this immunization is completed.

SOPHOMORES

All tenth grade students will soon receive paperwork for completing their mandated physical for the eleventh grade. This can be done at the time your student gets their physical for their driver's permit, but it may not be completed before July 1, 2019. The form for the school physical you receive is the preferable paperwork to be completed. However, copies of the physical forms used for the driver's permit are accepted for the student's school physical. **Please return the choice form to the Health Room as soon as possible to indicate how the physical will be completed.**

OVERDRIVE IS NOW SORA

Did you know that the library offers access to over 8,000 e-book titles, including 360 classics, as well as 440 audio books? Through the Overdrive app in CLEVER you will be redirected to SORA. This new app is much easier to use and allows you to browse by collections such as: genres, Reading Olympics, nonfiction, poetry, audio, classics, young adult, award winners, new titles, and what's available now. Once you click on the app you simply choose Parkland as your district, and sign in with your active directory ID number (computer) and password. You can also link SORA to a public library account using your library card number. See a librarian if you have more questions.

DRIVER'S EDUCATION

10th GRADE DRIVER EDUCATION THEORY CLASS

All students are required to complete a driver education theory class as a graduation requirement. There are three options. Each option will provide your child with a Certificate of Completion — **save** this certificate. Give your insurance company a copy of it; you are likely to obtain an insurance discount for your new driver.

Option 1

In-class Driver Ed Theory

- ◇ One semester course, either marking periods 1 and 2 or marking periods 3 and 4 (depending on schedule availability).
- ◇ Classes meet 4 periods for each 6-day cycle during a student's scheduled semester.
 - ◇ 2 double periods each cycle OR 4 single class periods each cycle.
- ◇ Students receive a certificate of completion after passing a midterm and final exam.
- ◇ Class provides a variety of learning experiences including but not limited to:
 - ◇ 'Share the Road' tractor trailer/blind spot demonstration.
 - ◇ LVHN Driving Simulators.
 - ◇ Gift of Life Presentation on the facts on becoming an organ/tissue donor.
 - ◇ Survival 101 program, presented by South Whitehall Police Department School Resource Officer, Tom Bammer.
- ◇ Students are eligible to get their permits on or any day after their 16th birthday; this class does not need to be completed for them to get their permit (although it helps).

Students wishing to register for other electives during the school year may select one of these two options:

Option 2

Summer Enrichment Program

Pennsylvania State Approved in-class theory course is an accelerated version of the semester offering. Due to time constraints, guests and demonstrations are not likely to be included but all aspects of safe and defensive driving procedures are completed.

This course **must** be completed in the summer between 9th and 10th grade or your child will be enrolled in the semester course in 10th grade. Summer Enrichment course registration is likely to be open in late April. Look for specific registration details in upcoming PHS Parent Newsletters under the title 'Summer Enrichment Programs'. There is a \$150 fee for this 30-hour classroom theory program. Students receive the same certificate as the students of the In-Class Driver Ed Theory course upon successful completion.

Option 3

Online Theory Course Offered Through the CLIU-21

A Pennsylvania State Approved program allows students to complete driving theory information at their own pace. This course offers no human component, speakers, nor demonstrations.

There is a \$150 fee for this online option and students receive a certificate upon completion. This certificate **must** be forwarded to the PHS Guidance Office or students will automatically be scheduled for the in-class theory course.

Behind-the-Wheel Instruction

Optional Program Offered through the CLIU-21

- ◇ Students **must** complete one of the 3 options listed above **and** possess a Pennsylvania Learner's Permit prior to registering.
- ◇ There is a \$290 fee for this program but it offers many benefits:
 - ◇ Students will receive 6 hours of behind-the-wheel practice with a certified instructor.
 - ◇ Lessons/Skills practiced are well-planned and structured to expose new drivers to a variety of road and traffic situations.
- ◇ Once enrolled online, students may choose the day, date, time and instructor of their choice. Weather permitting, cars are out every day after school, Saturdays, Sundays and many holidays. This program is offered all year, including during the summer months.
- ◇ When students complete their 5th lesson successfully and their 6-month practice period has passed, they **can take their behind-the-wheel Driver's License test here at PHS.**

SPRING 2020 SAT PREP CLASS

Parkland High School will be offering a Spring SAT Prep class to prepare students for the SAT Exam on Saturday, May 2.

- ➔ This course will help students **prepare for the verbal section** of the SAT by providing practice, test taking strategies, and test simulation in the areas of critical reading, evidence based writing and contextual vocabulary.
- ➔ This course will help students **prepare for the math section** of the SAT by providing practice, test taking strategies, and simulated test taking in the areas of algebra, geometry and trigonometry including problem solving; data analysis and practice in ratios, rates and proportional relationships.

Important Information about the class:

- This 10-class session course will begin on Monday, March 23, 2020 and continue until Wednesday, April 29, 2020.
- Classes will be held on Mondays and Wednesdays. Students will have a choice of an after-school session from 3–5 PM or an evening session from 6:30-8:30 PM.
- **Students must provide their own transportation home from the afternoon session at 5 PM and transportation to and from the 6:30 PM evening session.**
- In the interest of scheduling, students must select one session and may not combine after school/evening sessions.
- The cost for the 10-class session course is \$90.00 to cover class materials; checks should be made payable to **Parkland School District**.
- The course is open to interested **Sophomore and Junior students**.
- **Course registration is open beginning Tuesday, February 18, 2020 through Thursday, March 19, 2020.**

To provide our students with an additional way to prepare for the **SAT Exam**, Parkland High School is offering a SAT prep course during the Spring 2020 semester.
