

Composition of **Faculty Research Grants (FRG) Committee**

- 1) The committee should comprise faculty members with clearly demonstrated *significant, ongoing, and active* scholarship (to include research resulting in presentations and publications) and/or a history of successful external grant funding.
- 2) The committee shall include members from each College.
- 3) The College Deans will put forward names of candidates for election based on clearly demonstrated *significant ongoing/active* research/presentation/publication records and/or a history of external grant funding.
- 4) Committee members should hold terms for 4 year periods. Terms can be renewed for additional 4 year periods subject to election by the respective College.
- 5) The Chair of the committee should hold a 4 year term that is renewable every 4 years by vote of the FRG committee (The Chair term can only be renewed if he/she is elected by the College after the 4 year term is complete).
- 6) The review committee will comprise the college deans as ex-officio members and six full-time faculty members. The faculty membership will consist of one representative from the College of Business, two representatives from the College of Health Sciences & Education, and three from the College of Arts and Sciences (with one representing the natural sciences, one representing humanities, one representing social sciences and/or mathematics, and one representing the arts).
- 7) The Faculty Research Committee receives proposals for research grants and makes recommendations to the Vice President of Academic Affairs (VPAA) regarding their funding acceptability. The VPAA makes the final decision.
