MUST READ/DO FOR ALL PARENTS!

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Billings Public Schools is excited to announce we are moving to an online system for registration and annual updates for the upcoming 2020-21 school year! This process will replace paper registration and the paper annual update packet sent home each year. **A PowerSchool Parent Portal Account will be necessary to register any new incoming students, as well as to complete the back-to-school/annual updates for each student. At least one parent per student will be required to have an account to complete these processes.**

If you already have an account to the PowerSchool Parent Portal you will be notified when these online forms become available. If you do not yet have an account, please go to the Billings Public Schools website to create a parent account in Power School.

Benefits of this system include the following:

- Allows you to register your students or update yearly information at home
- Reduces paper forms to fill out
- Manage contacts and keep demographic information up to date
- Allows you to update information for all siblings at the same time
- If your information remains the same, it is saved for next year
- Allows you to check your student's grades or standards and attendance

***Students will also be able to see their fall schedule in August. If a parent account has not been set up, those students will not get access to their schedule until the first day of school! Another bonus to get set up now!**

Locking Away Cell Phones, Reducing the Distractions

Every day we see positive feedback from our "no cell phone policy". We've seen student interaction increase significantly, and our students seem less anxious without their phones, (and all the notifications that distract them during the school day).

More middle schools are going phone free this school year, requiring students to lock up, or turn off their cell phones during the school day. This removes the electronic distraction, and refocuses the student on instruction and encourages positive social interaction, face to face.

In the past, we saw students constantly checking their devices during the school day, and raising their anxiety due to a "fear of missing out" on what is being posted online.

We are also seeing a decline in depression amongst students, less time on social media has the effect of raising their self-esteem, instead of knocking it down.

As a School Resource Officer, I encourage parents to support us in our no cellphone policy, giving our kids a breather in today's intense 24-hour digital environment.

We have a responsibility to work together in protecting our kids from the negative effects of online social media engagement. The school ban is helpful to that end, but it shouldn't stop there. Parents should really have cell phone-free zones at home too! A family meal, doing homework, and bedtime, are just a few examples of beneficial "cell phone-free times".

SMART PHONES AND OTHER ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Students are encouraged **not** to bring items such as smart phones, cell phones, i-pads etc. However, if they are brought to school they are to be promptly **TURNED OFF**, put in a safe place, and not used until school is dismissed. No explicit music or violent video games are permitted.

The following consequences will occur for violation of this policy:

First Offense: Phone confiscated, phone back at end of the day in the office

Second Offense: Phone confiscated, lunch detention, phone back at end of the day in the office

Third Offense: Phone confiscated, after school detention, phone back after three school days or parent pickup

Fourth Offense: Phone confiscated, one day in school suspension, parent pickup required

Fifth Offense: Parent pick up and conference required, device must be checked in at office daily if brought to school

Further Offenses: Subject to the discretion of administration as per the Billings Public Schools District Acceptable Use Policy.

Card payments cannot be made at the office or over the phone – only online!

Session 1 Class Dates and Times: May 18, 19, 21 & 26 from 4:15 - 6:15, June 1st - 26th M-F at the time chosen at registration - either 8:00am - 10:00am or 10:00am - 12:00pm. Students who attend, Ben Steele, Castle Rock, Lewis & Clark, Medicine Crow, Riverside or Will James will be buses to the high school for class on May 18th, 19th, 21st & 26th. Transportation after class on those dates and both ways in June is the responsibility of the parent/student.

Students must be born on or before November 18, 2005 in order to take Session 1.

Session 2 Class Dates and Times: July 7th – August 7th 10:00am – 12:00pm

Students must be born on or before January 7, 2006 in order to take Session 2.

Fee: \$265.00

Students will drive 6 times outside of class time at times scheduled with the instructor.

Students are allowed 3 absences during the session which must be made up. If a student misses more than 3 classes or fails to attend the make-up session scheduled by the instructor they AUTOMATICALLY FAIL THE COURSE.

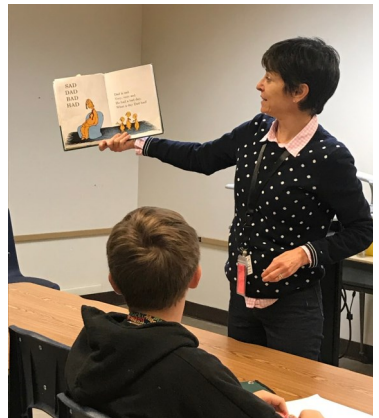

The Lewis and Clark Library tab on the L & C website features resources accessible from

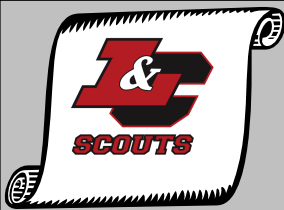
