Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2018-19 educational progress for Parkview Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2018-19 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

In April 2018, the Michigan Department of Education released a new, *Parent Dashboard for School Transparency*. The dashboard is meant to be a "living" tool to show parents accurate and objective data about all schools in the state. You can view our school's Dashboard at <http://bit.ly/2RGexmK>.

Despite being proud of our many achievements, Parkview continues to closely monitor the progress for each student. We have identified achievement gaps that we will focus on closing between our students with and without disabilities. Additionally, our students who are learning to speak English need additional intervention and support in order to increase their proficiency and to close the achievement gap in the targeted areas. In addition, ongoing professional development and dialogue focusing on strategies to support struggling learners take place regularly. We also concentrate our efforts in an ongoing analysis of formative assessments to determine the needs of all students, followed by the provision of targeted learning intervention to students in need.

Process for Student Assignments

Novi Community School District has five elementary K-4 buildings. Students are assigned to each building based on residency within the geographic boundaries determined by the district.

School Description

Parkview Elementary School currently has about 575 students. Approximately 64% of those students are Asian American. About 28% are White, 5% are Hispanic, and 3% are African American. There are 27 home languages spoken by our students, and about 54% of our students are English Learners. About 5.0% of the students at Parkview are considered economically disadvantaged and are on free or reduced lunch. Approximately 27 students at Parkview are students with active, special education Individualized Education Plans.
