

Advanced Learning Opportunities at MCI

At MCI, there are many opportunities for academically motivated and prepared students to engage in college-level learning in on-campus, online, and blended learning pathways designed to enrich student learning and accelerate coursework.

On-campus Advanced Placement

MCI offers courses in **Humanities, STEM, Visual and Performing Arts, Human Development, and World Languages.**

On-campus Advanced Placement courses include:

- AP English Language and Composition
- AP English Literature and Composition
- AP United States History
- AP Calculus AB
- AP Calculus BC
- AP Biology
- AP Physics
- AP Environmental Science
- AP Computer Science A
- AP Computer Science Principles
- AP Chemistry (2020-21)

Students who enroll in AP courses at MCI are required to take the corresponding AP exam in May. The exam cost for the 2019-20 school year is \$94 per test.

Online Advanced Placement

Online Advanced Placement courses are available through AP4ME and EdOptions Academy. Courses include AP American Government and Politics, AP Music Theory, AP Psychology, AP Statistics, AP French, and AP Spanish.

These independent study courses are “live” with a remote teacher. Grades are recorded each semester. Online courses are not considered in class ranking.

Independent Study Online Courses

Additional online options may be available through EdX courses based on the student’s academic needs or course study pursuits. Visit edx.org for course listings.

Credit-bearing courses must be classified as Current or Upcoming courses. Students may not use Archived courses for credit. Approval required from the Dean of Academics.



Concurrent and Early College Courses

Concurrent and early college courses are 100-level courses for which juniors and seniors may receive high school and college credit hours. MCI partners with the University of Maine system, Kennebec Valley Community College, and Colby College. Course availability is determined by the college or university. Classes begin each semester.

Some courses are available on MCI’s campus and are taught by MCI faculty. All concurrent and early college courses are taught by faculty with a master’s degree or doctorate in their disciplines.

Each college charges a reduced fee per course, which may range from \$100-250 per credit hour. The fee is paid to the university. Students may register for on-campus, online, or blended college courses. Some benefits to concurrent enrollment is early college exposure and it saves time and money in college.

Transportation is required for university campus-based and blended learning courses. Approval and recommendation required from the Dean of Academics.
