National Automotive Technology Education Foundation (NATEF) standards are taught through the basic curricular units of Engine Performance, Brakes, Steering, and Electrical. Students who successfully complete the course have the opportunity to obtain college credit and scholarships for an industry training program or a community college program. Transferable college credit is offered through Portland Community College. Students that are accepted into the Auto Tech Program at Aloha must attend 2 classes each day at Aloha High School, either in the morning section or the afternoon section.

TRANSPORTATION: Automotive Technology courses are coordinated with a student's home high school schedule. All students take Automotive Technology at Aloha High School. Students need to communicate with their counselors to sign up for District provided transportation, if needed. The afternoon class has transportation provided to Aloha High School by the District and then provides Tri-met fare for the return home.

ADVANCED AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY: Students returning for their second year of Automotive Technology DO NOT fill out an application but need to make sure they forecast for Advanced Automotive Technology.

Important Dates and Application Timeline

Date	Application Process
February or March Check with your high school for the high school forecasting deadline date.	Students may apply online or by paper application. Online applications must be completed no later than March 13, 2020. For students applying online, your counselor will be notified of your application. It is not necessary for them to sign off. Paper applications are due no later than March 13, 2020. Applications submitted after the deadline will be considered on a space available basis.
Friday, March 13, 2020	Home school counselors will send any paper applications to the District Learning Options Placement Office by March 13, 2020, 4:00pm. Applications submitted after that date will be late for the first round of placement and will be considered on a space available basis.
Tuesday, March 31st 6pm-8pm OR Thursday, April 2nd 6pm-8pm Automotive Classroom at AHS	First year students <u>must attend</u> one of the required meetings in order to be considered in the lottery. At the meeting, students and parents will learn more about expectations of Automotive Technology. Students will also take a placement test required for NATEF certification. Students who do not attend one of these meetings <u>will not be</u> considered for the lottery.
Monday, April 6, 2020	If applications exceed space available, a lottery will be conducted.
Thursday, April 9, 2020	Commitment <u>emails</u> offering enrollment via lottery or notification of wait-pool status will be emailed to applicants.
Monday, May 4, 2020	Deadline to accept lottery assignment via the online response form or paper acceptance form must be received online or at the Learning Options office no later than 4pm on May 4, 2020

Students, working with their high school counselor, can continue to enroll in the Automotive Class after the forecasting deadline, as long as space is available. Applications submitted after the forecasting deadline should be returned to your counselor.
