Two of our Sixth Form pupils have been selected to be a part of the Young Creatives scheme at the Royal Ballet School.

Niamh McBride has been chosen as one of eight choreographers nationally to take part and Richard Tyson has been selected as an associate, meaning he will be

involved in the scheme as a dancer for the choreographers. Young Creatives is a national programme managed by Youth Dance England in partnership with The Royal Ballet School and the Royal Opera House and supports young people in developing and deepening their choreographic skills.

New venture Youth Link

This term, six of our Year 12 students were selected to join Youth Link, a new venture by Children North East. Youth Link trains volunteers aged 16 – 25 from a range of backgrounds to become peer mentors. Mentors are linked with young people

who they help to explore their difficulties, provide support and identify solutions. Mentors are supported by a co-ordinator from Children North East. This is a fantastic opportunity for our students and we wish them the best of luck.

A lucky group of our Sixth Form politics pupils took part in a mock trial at Northumbria University as part of National Careers Week 2015.

The students were able to make use of the real life courtroom at the university, which has been used as the set for a host of TV programmes, after it was removed from Bedlington

Magistrates Court. The workshop involved students acting out the trial of an assault case by taking on a number of roles including lawyers, clerk, police officers, jury and witnesses. They were also given a talk by Kevin Kerrigan, Dean of Northumbria's Business and Law School, who discussed the wide range of careers which result from a law degree.

For the second consecutive year Dame Allan's Schools' Under 15 girls squash team has been crowned national champions. The five strong team won the 2015 National Squash Championships in Manchester after beating Kenilworth 3 -2 in the final. The Under 15 boys' team won the trophy competition and the Under 19 girls' team narrowly lost out on a second title to highly ranked British players.
