
Remembrance Day, 100 years on

November 11 marked Remembrance Day and was particularly poignant in this centenary year. We held special assemblies throughout remembrance week both to pay our respects and to educate pupils of all ages.

We know that 652 Allanians served in the First World War, and to mark the centenary our WWI research club has been tracing the history of the 84 boys who died in the war. The club has discovered some really interesting information from the school records such as which Dame Allan's sports teams the boys represented. The club aims for special Dame Allan's

memorial crosses to be placed on the memorials of the 84 who died in the war by staff, pupils and friends of the school. If anyone plans to visit a war cemetery or memorial please get in touch - we may have a cross for one of our Allanians to be placed there. We have also launched our Lest We Forget project, which offers prizes for poetry and art and which will run across the next two years. We hope all our students will be involved.

Inspiration for future philosophers

Philosophers of the future were given the opportunity to question moral and ethical dilemmas in a lesson with a difference at Dame Allan's. Year six students from Knop Law Primary School,

Wingrove Primary School and Stocksfield Avenue Primary School explored what makes something right or wrong and questioned their own actions during the interactive lesson, using the Ring of Gyges as a

case study. The session is part of a series of master classes at Dame Allan's, held to introduce children to different subjects and technologies they may not have at primary school.

We are thrilled that our Year 12 student Rozita Leetham has been elected to the Newcastle Youth Council. The purpose of the Youth Council is to represent the views of young people aged 11 to 18 who live, study or work in Newcastle upon Tyne. Rozita has attended her first meeting and hopes to focus on child poverty during her year on the council. Rozita will be holding regular surgeries in school so that students get their opportunity to voice what is important to them, and these views will be passed on to the Youth Council. GCSE Geography students were treated to some spectacular sights on their trip to Iceland over October half term. 28 year 11 students went on the week-long trip which involved them climbing a dormant volcano, taking the Golden Circle tour and visiting geothermal pools. Dame Allan's Schools competed in the Kids Lit Quiz again this year. This is an international children's literature competition which involves teams answering a number of literature questions. We sent Year 7 and 8 pupils

from the Boys' and Girls' Schools in two teams to take part and they came 8th and 9th out of 35 teams competing. This was a very impressive result – congratulations to both teams!

Year 3 had an exciting lesson with Maximus the Roman Centurion this half term. Children learned about Roman

language, dress and the army in the energetic session which formed part of their history curriculum.

This term Dame Allan's Schools took part in the Shakespeare Schools Festival for the first time. It is the UK's largest youth drama festival, offering students the opportunity to perform Shakespeare on a professional stage. In November 18 year 7 and year 8 students, both boys and girls, performed an abridged

version of Romeo and Juliet at the Whitley Bay Playhouse. It was the culmination of eight weeks of rehearsals and our students did an excellent job. Kristy Clark, Head of Drama said: "Our students did a fantastic job and had a brilliant time performing at the playhouse. I'm so proud of them all."

The Dame Allan's Schools U13 rugby team had an excellent time on a week-long tour in Prague over


October half term. A fantastic time was had by all 27 boys who went. They played some excellent rugby
