A true legend

Every time we use the new yurt at the Junior School and Nursery, we will be permanently reminded about our founding Head Teacher, Mr Edge. Staff at the Junior School and DASPA Junior, the parents' association for the Junior School which donated the required funds for the yurt, dedicated the outdoor facility in Mr Edge's honour in tribute to the service he has provided to our schoolchildren for the past 17 years. A plaque naming the yurt 'The Edge' was unveiled at the Junior School as teachers and pupils joined in a whole school Royal Tea Party to mark the occasion of Mr Edge's retirement this week. It was a joint celebration as another pivotal member of staff at the Juniors, Mrs Pollock, similarly called it a day after two decades of serving the Schools. Mr Edge's involvement with Dame Allan's Schools started way back in 2001 when he was appointed as Head of the Junior department. Ever since then, he has been a



big hit with students, parents and colleagues, his infectious positive attitude and gregariousness rubbing off on everybody and brightening up their days. Mr Edge took on responsibility for Linden School for a period of time and was then appointed Head of the Junior School in March 2008. His biggest achievement was undoubtedly overseeing the move to the current Junior School and Nursery in Hunter's Moor six years ago. He will be a huge miss around school and the pupils all had touching tributes to pass on to their funny, pleasant and kind Head Teacher. We would all like to thank him for his fantastic work at the Junior School and Nursery,

and we wish him and his family well in his retirement.

We now look forward to the next chapter when we welcome Mr Laidler, his replacement, in September.

Mrs Pollock has close to 40 years of teaching under her belt and she joined us at Dame Allan's following the acquisition of Linden School 21 years ago. She has held a number of roles throughout her time, serving as Deputy Head Teacher, Head of Early Years, Nursery Class Teacher and Special Needs Co-ordinator.

She has been indispensable to the Schools and hundreds upon hundreds of children have benefitted from her teaching. Another big thank you to such an important member of staff.

- Year 7 Boys won the Northumberland Athletics team championships.




Bo as she was crowned champion of the 11-16 years category for her poem called 'This Too Will Pass.' A big well done girls; keep up the great work.
