School Improvement Plan:

SEL Curriculum is being taught by teachers k-6. We are seeing fewer office referrals and problems on the playground.

HOPE Squad will be having an activity week Nov. 11-15. Activities will encourage inclusion and kindness.

After discussion of the School Improvement Plan a motion was made to approve the School Improvement plan by Jennifer English and seconded by Tjay Frazier, all voted aye.

School Business:

TSSA Money- Teacher Student Success Act- Legislative money given directly to the school to use at the principal's discretion. Teacher input was taken to make the following decision for the use of funds for 2019-2020 school year.

Total Funding- \$65,891

- Extra Contract Day for Teachers (August 14)
- Retention Stipends for Teachers
- Tier II Reading Curriculum - monies were used to purchase books
- Software Licenses for Spelling City, Near Pod, and Infinity Lab - it was shared that this is used in many of our classes 1st-6th grades and will be used in Kindergarten after Christmas.
- Technology-Student Devices
- Reading Interventionist - this is being used with 2nd and 3rd grade students
- InfiniD Lab Manager
- HOPE Squad Leaders Stipend
- Subs for teacher Professional Development - one day of substitutes for teachers to work on professional development.
- Extra Tutor hours

Looking forward to next year-

Team Recess- Hire recess coach to facilitate teaching and organizing student games. This is a possibility we are looking in to. During the discussion it was explained that this would be in conjunction with the PE teacher to teach outdoor sports/games, being part of each recess, if a student is struggling they can be invited to participate. It was also discussed that perhaps the Watch Dogs could be a resource for a program like this.

School Issues- All students viewed a video recorded by Ms. Nichols asking them to "Be the One" to solve 2 serious issues at school.

- 1- Food being taken on the Playground
  - 2- Inappropriate behavior and vandalism in bathrooms
- Joint staff is trying to come up with some solutions. CC input welcome.

A discussion was had regarding the above listed issues. Several ideas were discussed of what could be done to help address these issues, they included having class discussions,

encouraging parents to have discussion with their children, the possibility of making videos available to families to facilitate discussions, creating an incentive program using a sign off slip that could be placed in a drawing.
