



SIXTH FORM UNIFORM

The Sixth Form set an example to rest of the school in maintaining high standards of grooming and appearance and we expect them to look smart and business-like. The general rule of thumb is that if you wouldn't wear it to an interview, don't wear it to school. On Wednesdays we require all students to wear the official school games kit, including those students undertaking community service.

APPEARANCE

Pupils should look neat and tidy at all times. Hair must be kept clean and tidy; hair must be of a natural colour. The Sixth Form uniform should be worn at all times, both on school premises and when travelling to and from school. Only school badges may be worn with the uniform. No coats and scarves may be worn around the school buildings. No leather, suede or denim outer garments are to be worn. N.B. Plain white blouses/ shirts must be worn for formal occasions (e.g. Speech Day, photographs, cathedral services etc.).

GIRLS' UNIFORM

- SUIT:** Dark suit (black, grey or navy) with skirt, trousers or plain dress/pinafore. Professional skirt/dress length - knee length or just above the knee. Dresses must not be sleeveless unless worn with a shirt underneath.
- BLOUSE:** Any white/pastel colour blouse with a collar may be worn. This may be checked or striped and either short or long sleeves, but not sleeveless.
- JUMPER:** Plain black, grey or navy jumpers may be worn. These can be either v- or crew-necked. Jumpers should be worn in addition to the suit jacket (not as a substitute).
- TIGHTS:** Black, blue, grey or natural.
- SHOES:** Black or brown: plain style with a small heel. No casual shoes or trainers. Boots may be worn to and from school in bad weather but may not be worn around school. Ankle boots are not permitted as a substitute for shoes.
- COAT:** Any smart, outdoor coat. Hoodies are not permitted as a substitute for a smart coat.
- SCARF:** Own choice, may be worn to and from school only, not around school and not on formal occasions.
- HAT:** As scarf but a school hat with red hat band to be worn for services in the cathedral.
- OTHER:** Head scarf worn for religious reasons should be plain and of a suitable dark colour. Girls may wear one pair of small earrings and minimal jewellery in addition to a watch. Piercings other than ears are not permitted. Should girls choose to wear makeup, we expect them to use a minimal amount.

BOYS' UNIFORM

- SUIT:** Dark suit (black, grey or navy).
- SHIRT:** Any white / pastel colour shirt may be worn. This may be checked or striped, either long or short sleeved. Shirt collars must be buttoned up.

- TIE: Sixth Form tie (purchased from school): must be worn in the conventional manner.
- JUMPER: Plain black, grey or navy jumpers may be worn. These can be either v- or crew-necked. Jumpers should be worn in addition to the suit jacket (not as a substitute).
- SHOES: Black or brown (no casual shoes or trainers).
- COAT: Any smart, outdoor coat. Hoodies are not permitted as a substitute for a smart coat.
- SCARF/HAT: Own choice, may be worn to and from school only, not around school and not on formal occasions.
- OTHER: Boys are to be clean-shaven unless excused for religious reasons. Jewellery is not allowed with the exception of a watch.
