Care and Support



Excellent care is at the forefront of our vision of success. Personalised learning and provision of effective support underpins our work with all our students.

When children join the school, they are placed in a tutor group in the care of a Form Tutor. The tutor is responsible for monitoring all aspects of the students' development, including their general welfare.

Form Tutors build strong relationships with each student through regular one-to-one meetings and are also the first point of contact for parents. Each year group is under the overall care of a Head of Year and Progress Leader, who supports the Form Tutor in their work with students.

Effective home-school partnerships are essential and we work closely with parents and carers sharing information about their children's progress on a regular basis through face to face meetings,

telephone contact, written reports, parent mail, newsletters and email.

At Lynch Hill we will support parents and carers and work with the local community to nurture all young people. We seek to deliver an education provision which develops the life skills of all young people working in close partnership with external agencies and organisations.

Our Code of Conduct

At Lynch Hill Enterprise Academy we have high expectations of our students, and expect everybody to come to school ready to learn and to make the most of the opportunities available, and for everyone to show respect for themselves, each other, and achievement. Our code of conduct clearly sets out these expectations and has a structured system of rewards and sanctions which promotes high standards of work and behaviour both on and off the school premises.

Curriculum



The curriculum at Lynch Hill Enterprise Academy is innovative, inclusive and designed to meet the needs of all children irrespective of abilities.

At Lynch Hill we challenge students in their learning experiences, recognising both skills and knowledge, which encourage their development into confident and successful life-long learners.

We aim to deliver personalised educational experiences for each student. We provide a range of learning pathways to GCSE which takes account of the range of student abilities and aptitudes.

Lynch Hill Enterprise Academy has excellent facilities; the school occupies a purpose built, state-of-the-art building with flexible spaces that offer exciting learning opportunities.

Academic Monitoring

All students receive a review of their progress in learning each term so they and their parents are fully aware of their current level of progress.

Parents/carers are able to discuss their child's progress with staff at consultation evenings.

There are numerous opportunities for students to take on additional responsibilities which develop self-confidence, leadership and presentation skills.

The Enterprise and STEM Curriculum

A full range of sports will be on offer through PE and enrichment.



Individual Learning

We are committed to personalising our provision for all students, including those with special talents or educational needs, in an inclusive, supportive environment. Through our careful monitoring we identify students with particular needs and they benefit from additional support so that they are able to access the curriculum effectively. Likewise, students with marked aptitudes receive specialist support to make sure they reach their full potential.

We prepare our students to be future leaders; in doing so we provide them with every opportunity to develop their wide ranging talents and skills so that they leave

us confident, mature and successful citizens who take their full and equal place in a rapidly changing world.

Our overall aim is to build a nurturing community, in which all are able to grow and flourish.
