




INTERNATIONAL STUDENT PROGRAM AT AWHs

Through the combined efforts of our school community, Theology Department, and Campus Ministry Program, AWHs promotes and nurtures cultural growth in all members of the school community. We integrate faith with learning to develop the whole person – spiritually, academically, morally, and physically. Seventy five percent of our students identify as Catholic, but we welcome all faiths and backgrounds and encourage everyone to explore their personal spirituality.




ACADEMICS

BECOMING A HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT: FRESHMAN

The process begins in the fall of their Freshman year. Students are assigned to one counselor who will establish academic and extra curricular goals for the next four years. Counselors will speak with each student about grades and GPA, course level selection, and extra-help or tutoring opportunities.


In the fall of 9th Grade, students will be given the opportunity to take the PSAT.



THINKING ABOUT THE FUTURE: SOPHOMORES

In the 10th Grade, counselors will talk to each student about building on their successes, defining new pathways, and strengthening relationships. Students will also be introduced to Naviance, the college and career planning website.


Sophomores take the Preliminary SAT (PSAT) in the fall. The resulting scores help to identify areas of academic strength and indicate areas where additional practice can yield improvement.

EXPLORING COLLEGE POSSIBILITIES: JUNIORS

In the fall of Junior year, students take the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT). High scores will qualify students for national merit scholarships to universities in the U.S.

In the second semester, Juniors will participate in a once-per-cycle Junior Guidance class, meeting in small groups with their counselor. Each unit will include lessons on transcripts, SAT registration, Khan Academy prep-courses, Common App account set-up, Naviance research, resume writing, financial aid and scholarships, NCAA registration, the Common App, and college essay.



PREPARING FOR COLLEGE: SENIORS

The Guidance and College Counseling Office empowers seniors to pilot the college application process with confidence and success, with over 85% of our students applying “Early Action” in the fall.


Over the summer, rising Seniors are invited to participate in the AWHs College Boot Camp. Students will receive 1-on-1 help from an AWHs faculty member, create numerous versions of a draft essay, receive peer editing feedback, and continue the Common App.








FINE ARTS







