I feel strongly that the admin/staff at Rachel Carson should be consulted when you are considering relocating the school. Parents are having input throughout the process on which elementary schools feed into the middle schools, but it appears that the decision on where to relocate this option school is being based solely on where there is available capacity after allocating the elementary schools. Staff know the needs of the school and the environment that is necessary for the school to thrive. They should have input as part of the process. Mr Sparks,

Mr Beaver offered us a lot of perspective on transportation costs. I would like to offer an alternate perspective taking into account the fact that BSD gets ~\$10,000 per student from state funds. If Springville is shoved all the way to Five Oaks, I expect at least 1% (if not more) of our neighborhood to shift to private schools. In that scenario, here is what happens to the transportation math as shown in the below table.

Total number of Children in BSD	40725
Total state funds for BSD	\$425,884,046.00
State Funds Per Child	\$10,457.56
No: of SPV kids to FO in 2021	424
If 1% of kids go to Private School versus FO	382
BSD lost state funds	\$443,400.46

Net cost increase to ship SPV to Five Oaks	\$155,735.46

It ends up costing a lot more to ship SPV off to Five Oaks and wipes away any of the transportation savings.

We need to stop looking at transportation costs in a vacuum and focus on the objectives of filling Timberland, and reducing Stoller and avoid ripple effects throughout the district with tunnel vision on transportation. I would like for this perspective to be made available to the committee as well.

Map C 2.2 splits Springville's Arbor Oaks neighborhood and sends it without any of its other immediate neighbors to Five Oaks. Springville Road is a major divide between the southern communities and this part of Springville. It also adversely affects the diversity numbers by keeping only the most affluent part of Springville in Stoller. I would suggest the following fixes:

1. Move all of Springville north of Springville Road to Stoller and avoid that split
2. Move Summa out of Stoller
3. Move walkable Findley to Timberland along with Summa, and avoid that split.
4. Move all of JW to Sunset to avoid the current split and give JW enough critical mass to Sunset, and move all of Oak Hills to Westview and avoid their school going alone to Sunset.

My husband and I will be attending the meeting this Thursday at Five Oaks, 6pm. I hope to see some of you there.



Dear Mr. Sparks, Committee members and BSD School Board,

We have seen revisions to Map C: 2.0, 2.1, 2.2. We understand that Map C 2.x were responses to the feedback that “Springville is an island.” Yet Map 2.x continues **to isolate and divide communities**. Our Springville communities are now divided between north and south of Brugger Road. Now, our students are worried that the friendships and camaraderie they had developed for the past 6 years at Springville will now be broken. Furthermore, our community is centered at Bethany/Laidlaw intersection, 2 blocks away from Stoller, where there’s a plethora of after school activities that is **unique to this neighborhood**. Will BSD not care about our students’ missing after-school learning opportunities?

It also does not resolve the persistent problem of under utilizing the new Timberland Middle School (74%) since (a) a portion of Findley ES is now back at Stoller and (b) Stoller’s SUMMA program, with 209 students continues to be at Stoller. Since Findley and Stoller are **physically closer** to the new Timberland MS, it makes sense to fill those unused capacity to the full prior to reassigning Springville students elsewhere.

Most importantly, Map C 2.x **discourages equity and diversity**. Nowhere is this more evident in the maps below. There are little or no disadvantaged students in the Stoller feeder system, with the removal of that **RED** Springville island that once fed Stoller. **Instead the Committee keeps pushing “walkability” and added the non-diverse Findley, purple**. Has the Boundary Committee assessed the demographic (both poverty and ethnicity makeup) of Stoller 2.x? I will not be surprised that it will be populated with only privileged Asian and White kids. Will it still be in line with JC criteria? The action of this committee might not meet the non-discrimination legal test.



Map C 2.x continues to be unfair to the united Springville community. Furthermore, in the map, PCC Rock Creek is still shown in PINK, even though there are no students there.

Let’s all work towards a fair solution that meets the main JC criteria of proximity and diversity and inclusion for all, especially for our disadvantaged neighbors.

Moving all of Findley and the SUMMA Options program at Stoller to a school that has SPACE (the new Timberland or Five Oaks) will make way for Springville to stay in their ONLY current middle school option STOLLER, together with sister communities, SATO and Jacob Wismer.

Thank you for your time and commitment to making our community better and fairer for all.

Mr. Sparks,

I am aware that there are forms on BSD's website for submitting comments but I have posted countless comments that I just don't feel have made an impact. The comment form also greatly limits our ability to express the whole of what we are feeling. I have wished to attend the boundary meetings in person to make my appeal to the committee, but as a military wife with an absent spouse and as a mother of 5, my attendance has been limited to the LiveFeed. I have come to feel hopeless about my ability to protect my children in this boundary adjustment process. I know that you are incredibly busy and I apologize for asking for your time, but I humbly request that you please hear my testimony. I believe my voice should matter whether I am able to speak publicly to the committee or not.

As previously stated, I am an Army wife and mother of five. I have 2 in middle school, 2 in elementary at Springville, and 1 in preschool. Less than a year ago my husband made a career change for the sole purpose of being able to bring our kids back to North Bethany where we have previously lived. For our (at the time) 5th grader, her return to Springville was the SIXTH school move she had made in 5 years. For our (at the time) 1st grader, Springville was the THIRD elementary school she had attended in 2 years. For our preschooler, returning to North Bethany was his FOURTH move in the 3 years since he was born. Our children were ecstatic when we returned to the North Bethany community they loved so we could FINALLY plant some roots. My husband and I were hopeful that our military kids would, for the very first time in their lives, have stability and a hometown community once and for all.

Unfortunately, shortly after we arrived back in North Bethany we heard about this boundary adjustment. I never for a moment thought it would impact my children. We live in the northern most point of the district and there is only one middle school anywhere close to our neighborhood, whereas every other North Bethany community has at least one other proximal option for middle school. But here I am, desperately trying to protect my children from losing the stability and community we had promised them.

If my children are excised from their North Bethany community and sent to Five Oaks they will no longer bump into their friends from middle school when shopping at our local grocery store, they will no longer be able to call up their middle school peers from around the community to ride bikes or meet up for study sessions, they will no longer be able to walk to Starbucks to socialize with their North Bethany peers, they will no longer look around at the crowd gathered at our local Christmas tree lighting and see the familiar faces of their middle school friends. My children will become

strangers in their own town.

I understand the desire for kids to walk to school despite the fact that that option is not afforded to my middle schoolers regardless of where they attend. I'm also aware that both the committee and the district have already stated that walkability is desirable but also a luxury that is "subordinate" to meeting the boundary adjustment objectives. So much time and effort is being spent attempting to maintain optional programming and walkability at Stoller without any consideration for the objectives of this boundary adjustment or for the impact on the wider community.

The attempt to prioritize Summa leaves every map presented thus far over capacity. It is clear that Stoller cannot accommodate Summa. In addition, the attempt to maintain Findley's walkability to Stoller is creating a ripple effect that leaves 8 elementary schools split, creates an extreme lack of diversity at an already very elite school, requires an elementary school to be ripped from their community, necessitates other options programs (such as Rachel Carson) to be relocated, and calls for high school boundary adjustments to be made. How can we cause all of this disruption throughout the district simply to protect the walkability of roughly 150 kids?

There is a very simple solution to solve the cascade of problems caused by trying to squeeze Springville into Five Oaks: move Summa (all maps have already proven this must be done regardless) and feed all of Findley to Timberland. Yes, a small subset of Findley students will no longer walk to middle school, but those same students will GAIN a clean feeder alongside their Findley peers. Not a loss, but a tradeoff. A tradeoff for what the committee, the district, and the majority of parents have indicated to be a high priority: a clean feeder and keeping communities together. This tradeoff also provides clean feeders for Springville and Rock Creek in addition to Findley's, prevents the necessity of making so many disruptions that have upset so many families in the south, allows ample room to ensure Springville can attend the ONLY middle school that will allow them to remain within their local community, and provides the desperately needed economic diversity that is lacking at Stoller.

Many in the Springville community have submitted revised maps and data analysis over the last two weeks to prove that these two small adjustments will:

1. Bring Stoller to 90% in 2021 (without creating a quantifiably greater burden in 2025 than occurs in Maps 2.0-2.2)
2. Fill Timberland at 80% or greater to ensure that this expensive asset is utilized effectively
3. Provide diversity at Stoller that is severely lacking (and doing so WITHOUT having to create split feeders and islands)
4. Eradicate THREE split feeders (Findley, Rock Creek, and Springville)
5. Provide a proximal middle school for all students, allowing North Bethany children to attend school with neighbors that are easily accessible and familiar to them

We are eager to see these solutions (and the data that supports them) posted to the comments for the committee's consideration.

When all is said and done, I want no more for my child than is being afforded to every one of our North Bethany neighbors. I want my children to live, play, study, socialize, and build relationships within their community. I want them to know what it's like to see a familiar face inside and outside of school. There is a reason that school boundaries grow bigger and wider as children age: when they are very small we keep them extremely close to home because they lack the ability and maturity to face such a big world, when they become tweens we begin to allow them room to expand their horizons but they are limited by how far they can go alone and by lack of experience and maturity, then they become high schoolers and we begin to broaden their circles even more as they've gained more skills and maturity for facing a bigger world. We should not forget how important this step-by-step process is to child development. We cannot expect to throw our children in the deep end before we've taught them to swim. They need their community to grow in small increments relative to their stage of development. They NEED their community. This is what Springville wants for their children: keep us within our North Bethany community. Keep our children where people and places are familiar.

Thank you for taking the time to hear my plea. I have been brought to tears and endured many sleepless nights throughout this process. I fear for my children's safety and age-appropriate development. My heart breaks at the thought of losing the North Bethany community our children love. I hate to see them face additional years of feeling separate, "other", and a stranger. No child should have to feel that way.

PLEASE KEEP SPRINGVILLE IN THEIR NORTH BETHANY COMMUNITY.

Dear Mr. Sparks and the BSD Middle School Boundary Committee,

First and foremost, We would like to thank you for all of your time, hard work, and patience. Our community is grateful that you're taking on this task and we hope that you find the right balance of retaining a sense of community, keeping transportation costs to a minimum, investing in our students (rather than their transportation), and spreading diversity/socioeconomic to all of the middle schools. This is no small feat and I commend each of you for weighing these issues and relying on the factors of the JC Policy.

Map C captures the core fundamentals of policy JC. Keeping children as close as possible to their schools and within their communities while increasing continuity is common sense. The fact of the matter is that there is no easy fix or solution. The northwest region of the district's exponential growth cannot be supported by Stoller alone. Westview bound students need to be allocated more heavily to Five Oaks. Springville families drive by the construction daily and are reminded that they chose to live in an area that does not have the infrastructure in place for the current demand (schools, roads, emergency services, etc.), let alone projected numbers. Rather than displacing many schools from their established neighborhoods and schools, Map C is an immediate solution to reducing numbers at Stoller and keeping forecasted attendance manageable. This Map also utilizes capacity targets (current/future), diversity, free/reduced lunch numbers, etc. across all of the middle schools.

During inclement weather, lock down and lockout situations, Map C will help families utilize proximity, carpools and established relationships to transport their students safely and efficiently. Families can get to their children more quickly in Map C. Safety is a very real concern for parents.

SUMMA is an amazing program and it is unjust to not keep a Westview student bound program. Stoller has an established SUMMA program in place. There are many students who reside very close by, usually walk and are slated to not attend Sunset. Displacing them at Timberland for 3 years and then

continuing on to Westview is a difficult transition during an already fragile emotional and physical period in their lives. This can be avoided by retaining an already successful and thriving SUMMA program at Stoller that would allow continuity to Westview.

Collaboration between students on projects will also be more successful with the suggested Map C boundaries.

Once again, thank you for taking on this monumental challenge. We are grateful to have the opportunity to collaborate and be a part of the process.
