

Multiage is NOT Montessori

- Montessori education is student-led and self-paced
- •BFS have curricular expectations, requirements for learning, established objectives, project based learning.
- BOTH have small groupings and individualized supports.

Year 2010 - Booth Free's enrollment was 113 students

• Years 2010-2014 – Booth Free's enrollment dropped by 35 students.

 Year 2014 - Burnham School transitions to multiage with 53 enrolled students

Year 2016 – Burnham School transitions to full multiage

• Year 2016-2019 – Data Collection, Research, Monitoring of Multiage

- School Year 2018/2019 Booth Free's enrollment 71 students
 - Discussion with teachers' union regarding multiage and process considerations
 - Professional development for curriculum, scope & sequence, writing development across elementary schools
 - Evaluation of curriculum, student data
 - Discussions with administration and town officials about possibility of multiage in Roxbury
 - Facilities analysis
 - Listening tour culture and morale
 - Budget for 2019/2020 no cuts to the BFS support in preparation for potential shift
 - Building teacher capacities with grade moves and training

- Fall 2019 Booth Free's enrollment 71 students
 - Discussion with Booth Free School administration regarding multiage models
 - Long Range Planning for Region 12 and Booth Free
 - Prowda Enrollment Report
- Winter 2020
 - Kindergarten enrollment
 - Morale
 - Retirement notifications
 - New hires contracted to the end of current school year
- Spring 2020
 - Decide on Booth Free structure
 - Post for the Booth Free positions (Three classroom teachers, one math teacher, one reading teacher)
 - Professional development for the teachers chosen to teach at Booth Free
 - Social opportunities for students with multiage peers

- Summer 2020
 - Professional Development for Booth Free Teachers
 - Classroom Visitations
 - Ice Cream Socials
 - Teacher Meet & Greet
- Fall 2020
 - Social Events
 - Additional Support Placed at Booth Free
 - Multiage Starts
 - Teachers given additional planning time to support the model
 - Professional Development throughout



Feedback – Question 2 Concerns for children

- Academic "How will advanced students stay challenged?", "How will repetitive curriculum be minimized?"
- **Social** "Social differences between the ages", "My child may not like the multiage experience"
- Time restrictions
- Size "Not getting enough individualized attention", "Students who struggle will get lost", "Losing the close connections with teachers"
- Return to Grade leveling "Transitioning back at Shepaug"

Suggestions made by families

- BFS students shadow Burnham students
- Transition in the multiage, one grade level combination at a time
- Start in 2021-2022
- Move staff from Burnham to help the transition
- Tours of Burnham or Cornwall

Synthesis of Information

- 92% of survey responses choose dual grade level over tri-figured
- Choice of dual over tri-figured level response does not mean endorsement of multiage classroom
- Information parents are seeking is specifically about their child's adjustment to the multiage grade levels
- Families are concerned with the transition process
- Trust issues exist
