SKI TEAMS BOTH TAKE REGIONAL TITLES

The Notre Dame Girls and Boys Varsity Ski teams both earned Regional titles at the MHSAA Regional meet held at Pine Knob this past week. The Girls finished with a perfect score of 20, having individuals place first, second, third and fourth in both the Slalom and Giant Slalom. Sydney Schulte, Meghan Kozole, Claire Kirchner and Delaney Flavin led the run order for the Irish in the Slalom while Kozole, Schulte, Flavin and Kirchner led the way in the Giant Slalom with Hailey Schindler also taking ninth, Cranbrook was second in the Girls Region, finishing with 103 points, 83 points behind the Irish. The Boys had a total score of 35 to take their Regional over second place Orchard Lake St. Marys at 105.5. Jack Lintol (third), Chase Flavin (fourth), Teegan McLeod (seventh) and Kaden Hovey (10th) led the scoring for the Irish in the Slalom while Lintol (first), Hovey (second), McLeod (third) and Flavin (fifth) helped Notre Dame to a near perfect finish in the Giant Slalom. In addition, Frank Roth took seventh and Geordan Bolden took ninth in the Giant Slalom. Both teams will now head to the SEMSL Championships on February 18 before taking part in the MHSAA Finals on February 24.

SWIMMERS DROP MEET TO DEARBORN

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Swim team dropped a dual meet at Dearborn High School. The meet provided an opportunity for many Irish swimmers to swim off events. Notre Dame took two of the events; Anthony Dupuis in the 200 IM and Griffin Gushman in the 100 Butterfly. In addition, there were significant drops in season times including Lars Boehme and Oliver Kayi in the 200 Free, Faris Mahjoub, who dropped 43 seconds in the 500 Free and Nick Mazzola in the 100 Backstroke, Notre Dame will now turn its attention to the SMISL Meet on March 7 and the State Meet on March14.
