

The Counseling Office would like to thank you for taking the time to read though the following information in an effort to collaboratively support student success.

Mid-Year Grade Report Request Process:

Seniors began requesting Mid-Year Grades on January 17, 2020. (Grades will be sent out after February 3rd.) You should have already requested Initial Transcripts prior to requesting a Mid-Year Grade Report.

- 1. Log in to Naviance. If you are having trouble logging in please see your Counselor.
- 2. Scroll all the way down to the bottom of the home page and under Pages, click on Mid-Year Request, and right click on the survey link. Select Open in New Window. Complete the Mid-Year Transcript Request. (Opening the survey in a new window will allow you to refer back to Naviance to view the schools and methods of transcript delivery for each school.) You must complete this survey for each Mid-Year transcript that you are requesting.

AP Exam Registration:

Students who signed up to take a fall semester or full year AP Exam will be required to pay for their exams by February 21, 2020. If you signed up to take an exam and you wish to cancel, you will still be responsible for the \$40.00 unused exam fee (as per College Board). You must provide a note from a parent or guardian to cancel an exam. Check or money order can be made out to "Haverford High School" and given to Mrs. Novino in the Counseling Office. AP Exams are \$94.00 each.

We will begin taking registrations for semester two AP classes on February 10, 2020 (following an assembly on February 7, 2020). Full payment will be due at the time of registration for semester two AP exams.

Local Scholarships and Awards:

Each year, over 20 scholarships and awards provided by local organizations, alumni groups, and community members are awarded to Haverford High School seniors. The application for these local HHS scholarships and awards will be available on the Haverford High School Counseling Department website from Monday, March 2nd until Friday, March 20th. At 3:00 pm on March 20th, the application will close.

Scholar Snanr

Common App has made it easy for applicants to access scholarship opportunities directly through their admissions application by giving you the option to connect your information with Scholar Snapp! Scholar Snapp makes it easier to apply for scholarships by allowing you to apply to multiple scholarships without having to re-enter your information each time. Instead, you can reuse your information from one application to another. Fill out one application and simply import it, or "snapp" it, to a Scholar Snapp profile to use again next time. You've been accepted to college, now what should you do?

Congratulations! Being accepted to college is the hardest part. You now need to figure out which college is the best fit for you. Looking at several different options will hopefully help you and your family to make the best decision.

1. Celebrate

You have worked hard and should be proud of all that you have accomplished!

2. Be patient and consider all of your options

You may have been accepted to one or some of your schools, but it is best to wait until you have all of your decisions back to weigh all of your options, unless you applied Early Decision. If you applied Early Decision, you will need to submit a deposit and withdraw all of your other applications.

3. Compare the \$\$\$

Sometimes you will receive a financial award letter with your acceptance, but in other cases, it may come later. It is important to compare the financial details of each school. This can be done using a spreadsheet to compare the bottom lines. What initially appears as the cheapest is not always the least expensive when you consider grants and institutional scholarships.

4. Attend an accepted students day or visit the campus again

Visit the campus to see how it feels and if you feel like it is a good fit for you. This will also give you a chance to connect with other students who have been accepted.

5. Research

Do a little extra research and make a pros and cons list. Look at what students are doing who have graduated from the school, what options are available to students who are there, and the co-op/internship opportunities.

6. Commit

Once you have decided on your school, send in the deposit \$ and make your decision official. Remember that you have until May 1st to decide, but can make a decision







Getting into college is the hardest part, but you must remember to keep up your grades and keep working until the very end. You have been accepted, but your acceptance is conditional until the school receives your final transcripts.

The Counseling Office is currently accepting transcript requests. As of January 31, 2020, 2,226 transcripts have been requested by a total of 348 students

For a deeper understanding of our role as a School Counselor, we are sharing information from the American School Counselor Association (www.schoolcounselor.org).

The School Counselor maximizes student success by helping them to:

- Apply academic achievement strategies
- Manage emotions and apply interpersonal skills
- Plan for postsecondary options (higher education, military, work force)

Student success is maximized through the implementation of a comprehensive School Counseling program that includes:

- · Direct student services including:
 - o Instruction teaching the School Counseling curriculum to students.
 o Appraisal and advisement assessing student abilities, interests and

 - achievement to help them make decisions about their future.

 Counseling: providing professional assistance and support to a student or small group of students during times of transition, heightened stress, critical change or other situations impeding student success. School counselors do not provide therapy or long-term counseling in schools; however, school counselors are prepared to recognize and respond to student mental health needs and to assist students and families seeking resources.
- Indirect student services including:
 - Consultation share strategies supporting student achievement with parents. teachers, other educators and community organizations

 Collaboration - work with other educators, parents and the community to
 - support student achievement
 - Referrals support for students and families to school or community resources for additional assistance and information

Delaware County Technical School:

Any current 10th or 11th grade student who is interested in attending the Delaware County Technical School for the 2020 - 2021 school year should get an application in the Counseling Office and submit their applications to their counselor by February 14, 2020. Medical Careers Program at the Delaware County Technical School (DCTS):

Any current 11th grade student who is interested in attending the Medical Careers program for the 2020 – 2021 school year should meet with their counselor and attend an information meeting on February 7, 2020 during homeroom. Please check in with your homeroom teacher and then go down to room 126. The Medical Careers program is a full-year, honors-level, DCTS program that is available for students in their senior year. It is geared toward students who are interested in pursing a medical career in college. The Medical Careers students leave Haverford High School at 6:30 every morning and travel to their assigned hospital and return in time for second block. Students interested in participating in this program need to have a grade point average of at least a 3.0, and be in good standing.

Grade Point Average (GPA):

Grade Point Average or GPA is calculated each semester as classes are completed. Each final course letter grade is assigned a point value. The unweighted GPA is calculated by taking the credit for the class and multiplying it by the point value assigned to the letter grade. Then, add up all of the multiplied values and divide by the total number of credits.

Classes taken at the honors or AP level have a different point value (unweighted point value $x \cdot 1.25$ = weighted point value). Students who take honors and AP classes will have a weighted GPA that differs from the unweighted GPA. There are no points awarded to classes that are taken Pass/Fail.

Course Selection assemblies will take place this month for the 2020-2021 School Year: Students, their parents, counselors, and teachers should all be involved in the course selection process. An ideal schedule should challenge, but not overwhelm, students leading them toward an occupational or educational goal. Follow these steps to choose courses, which will interest you and fulfill your personal and academic goals:

- 1. Become familiar with the requirements of the occupation, technical school, or college in which you are interested.
- Become familiar with the requirements for graduation from Haverford High School. Review the Course Selection Guide which can be found on the Courseling website.
- 4. Listen and ask questions as your teachers discuss course selection in class
- 5. Schedule a time to meet with your school counselor if you need assistance.

Mid-Year Transcript

Seniors can begin requesting mid-year transcripts beginning on Friday, January 17th. Mid-year transcripts will be sent beginning on February 3rd. You can find the mid-year request form at the bottom of the home page of Naviance. You must complete the form one time for each school.

AP Registration and Fees





If you are experiencing problems with the Safe Arrival AP, please follow the steps below:


If you have been experiencing issues with the app, please follow the below steps.

The steps to perform this refresh are:

- 1. Open the SchoolMessenger app.
- 2. Go to the menu in the upper left corner.
- 3. Choose contacts.
- 4. Once in contacts, press the refresh button in the upper right-hand corner.
- 5. This screen will still show an error, but when you open the menu from the upper left the second time, you will have access to Attendance. Messages will also be populated with all recent messages you were sent.
- 6. At this point, your app should be functioning normally again.
