School Strategic Action Plan

At Inglemoor High School we provide a safe, caring environment that fosters life-long learning and inspires students to develop their full potential as contributing members of a global society.

Each year, we review our student data and identify goals that guide the work we do to ensure each of our students learns at high levels and, ultimately, is prepared for success in career, college, and life.

Our goals the 2018-19 school year and their related measures for success are listed below. These goals and measures are aligned with Northshore's Strategic Plan.

GOAL 3: Growth for Every Student, Elimination of Outcome & Opportunity Gaps

 100% of Hispanic students who took a higher-level year-long course for the 2018-19 school year will stay in that course during the second semester.



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Goal 3 continued:

• GPA of Hispanic students in Higher level courses will average 3.0 or higher during the 2018-19 school year.

To work on this goal, we have chosen the following instructional strategies that are culturally responsive, high leverage, and adhere to universal design for learning. These strategies will be used in Inglemoor High School's classrooms and throughout all learning environments. These strategies we have chosen are based on best practices and have been shown to make a positive impact on student learning.

- MTSS focus with data and information coming from students, families, counselors, administrators, and teachers to help find successful strategies for struggling students.
- Teachers will focus on relationship-building with all students to help learn about their students as individuals, in order to help meet their specific needs.
- Teachers will be asked to focus on PBIS in lieu of punitive discipline. Specifically, teachers will try to focus on a 5:1 ratio of positive interactions to negative interactions for each student.
- Teachers are asked to look at their curriculum to determine whether their content is representative of the students in their classroom. If not, they will be asked to come up with some content that will be more applicable to their students who are not represented.
- Teachers are asked to utilize culturally responsive teaching strategies in their classroom. These strategies will be taught/modeled by administrators, SDLT, and guest speakers at PD sessions.
- Administrators will focus on culturally responsive practices when looking at Criterion 5 of the Danielson model for eVAL.

GOAL 5: Ready for Lifelong Success after Graduation

- 96% of Inglemoor High School Seniors will graduate on-time with the class of 2019.
- 97% of Inglemoor High School Seniors will graduate on-time with the class of 2020.
- 98% of Inglemoor High School Seniors will graduate on-time with the class of 2021.
- 99% of Inglemoor High School Seniors will graduate on-time with the class of 2022.
- 100% of Inglemoor High School Seniors will graduate on-time with the class of 2023.

To work on this goal, we have chosen the following instructional strategies that are culturally responsive, high leverage, and adhere to universal design for learning. These strategies will be used in Inglemoor High School's classrooms and throughout all learning environments. These strategies we have chosen are based on best practices and have been shown to make a positive impact on student learning.

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Goal 5 continued:

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- Teachers are asked to look at their curriculum to determine whether their content is representative of the students in their classroom. If not, they will be asked to come up with some content that will be more applicable to their students who are not represented.
- Teachers are asked to utilize culturally responsive teaching strategies in their classroom. These strategies will be taught/modeled by administrators, SDLT, and guest speakers at PD sessions.
- Administrators will focus on culturally responsive practices when looking at Criterion 5 of the Danielson model for eVAL.
- Teachers are asked to share successful strategies for struggling students with that student's other teachers to help meet the student's needs across their entire day.
- Advisory teachers will be utilized to help build strong relationships with each student in order to help keep students on track.
- Advisory will be used to promote SEL-based strategies for success.
- Advisory will allow students time to catch up on work or engage in a club, which can connect students to the school. Club participation has shown to increase probability for on-time graduation.

Facility Information

Inglemoor was built in 1964 on 49.2 acres. An extensive remodel was completed in 1995. Our one-story school contains 68 classrooms, four computer labs, thirteen computers-on-wheels labs, performing arts center, comprehensive health room, career/counseling center, library media resource center and a state-of-the-art planetarium. Telecommunications, technology and data/video networking are integrated into all facets of our instructional program.

An outstanding athletic complex surrounds our campus. Lighted synthetic turf baseball, softball and football fields provide Inglemoor with excellent instructional and competitive facilities. Our gym is one of the largest in the KingCo Conference, and major upgrades were added to our baseball field, soccer field, tennis courts and rubber/asphalt track.

Inglemoor's complex is used during the evening and on weekends by youth and adult sports programs, PTSA groups, community organizations and other Northshore schools. This partnership provides multiple opportunities for our community to engage in life-long learning experiences in a first class facility.





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About Northshore:

Northshore is the 10th largest school district in Washington with almost 23,000 students in 20 elementary schools, six junior high schools, four comprehensive high schools, an alternative high school, a preschool program and an independent contract program grades 1-12. The district encompasses over 60 square miles and includes the cities of Bothell, Kenmore and Woodinville as well as part of unincorporated King County.
