LETTER FROM THE CHAIR



MSA's 2018-2019 school year was marked by great change with the unexpected passing of our long-time Head of School, Robert W. Moore. Robert was a uniquely gifted, generous, and uncharacteristically humble man who left an indelible mark on our community. And as I reflect on the depth and breadth of Robert's impact on our school, I feel it's important to look back to where it all started.

Mill Springs Academy was founded in 1981 by Robert's mother, Tweetie Lewis Moore. Back then, it was known as The New School and was housed in the Sandy Springs home and artist's studio of Ed Dodd, Creator of the Mark Trail comic strip. Tweetie was a true trailblazer with a passion for teaching kids who learn differently. She was a remarkable woman who had an innate ability to connect with kids, especially kids who were struggling. And while it was her vision, determination, and passion that led to the founding of Mill Springs Academy, it was Robert who grew the school to what it is today - a leader in non-traditional schools.

When Tweetie's health started to fail in the mid-'90s, Robert was asked by the Board of Trustees to run the school. At the time, he was young, dynamic, had a ton of energy, and he too loved and was dedicated to Mill Springs Academy and especially our students. And while I had the privilege of getting to know him only in the recent past, I admired that his energy, passion, and dedication for the school and our students never seemed to wane. Instead, it grew deeper and stronger.

In 1991, the school's leaders changed the name to Mill Springs Academy to highlight its lovely setting in Sandy Springs off of Brandon Mill Road. Students continued to flourish at Mill Springs, and after 15 years of making loan payments to Ed Dodd as well as SunTrust Bank, the final payment was made on the property in early April 1996. With the deed for the property in hand and the loan payments in the rearview mirror, roofers were promptly hired to fix a leak that had been put off until there was extra cash available. But later that same month on April 28, contractors working on the roof left a hot spot, which caused a fire that essentially destroyed the school.

During this time of crisis, and under Robert's leadership, the MSA community stepped up, and the school was only closed for one day before re-opening for classes. However, Robert knew that the Sandy Springs property wasn't big enough to support the future needs of our growing school, so instead of formulating a plan to rebuild on that same property, Robert turned north to Alpharetta. He looked at several properties but felt that the 85-acres we are on today, held the most promise. Convincing the Board that moving to Alpharetta was the best thing for the school was a tough job, and Robert was really challenged on the idea. But he did not waver as he knew that in addition to classroom buildings, our students deserved facilities like a gym, baseball field, track, and soccer field.

By the fall of 1997, Mill Springs Academy officially began its first year on the Alpharetta campus in a row of modular buildings that still stand at the top of our campus today. Over the next 23 years, MSA more than doubled in enrollment, and with that growth in students, Robert, along with the many

individuals who served as Trustees and volunteers, led the school through four successful capital campaigns – all while remaining debt-free. All of this was accomplished under the leadership of Robert Moore and with the love and support of an amazing community of individuals and families, many of whom still support the school today.

We are grateful for Robert for expanding on the foundation that Tweetie created. His hands, mind, and heart are reflected in every square inch of our campus. And his vision, dedication, and commitment have allowed Mill Springs Academy to continue to impact the lives of countless students every day.

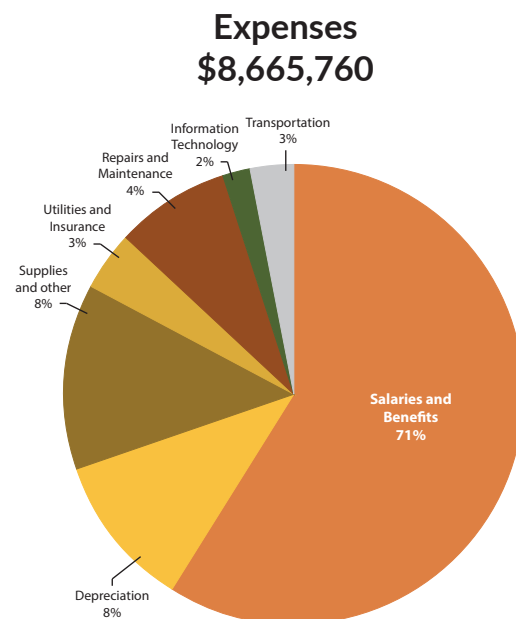
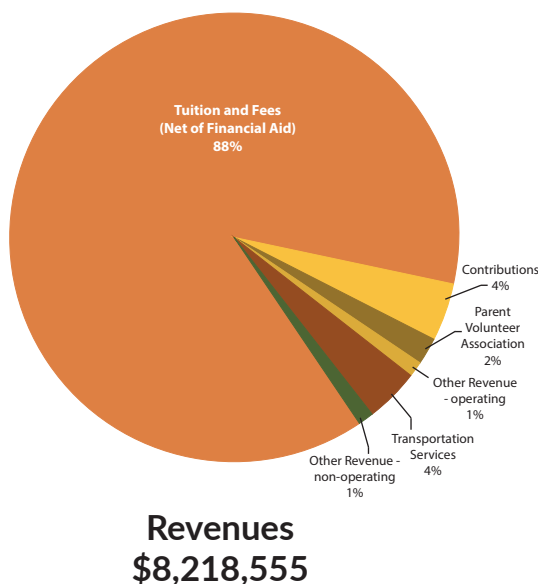

The Annual Fund is the most important fundraiser the school conducts each year as tuition and fees only cover approximately 90% of the actual cost of educating each student. Each and every gift to the Annual Fund helps keep tuition increases down, and directly supports the school's robust academic, fine arts, and extra-curricular programs. Also, local foundations on whose support we rely to help us fund the construction of our permanent buildings, look directly at the level of support and participation we receive from our school families through the Annual Fund, to gauge their level of support.

The following are just a few ways in which Annual Fund dollars are spent:

- **Keep tuition increases down**

(annual tuition increases at MSA have remained at 3% over the past 5 years; much lower than the national average of 7%)

- **Allow us to attract and maintain valuable staff**

(through competitive salaries and benefits like 401k, insurance, continuing education)

- **Fund our Scholarship Endowment program**

(5% of the monies raised each year are set aside to help fund our scholarship endowment program)

- **Broaden our Fine Arts curriculum**

(giving students full access to program in art, theater, chorus, band, and media)

- **Provide funds for various classroom enhancements**

- **Covering unanticipated operating expenses**

(unscheduled repairs, etc.)

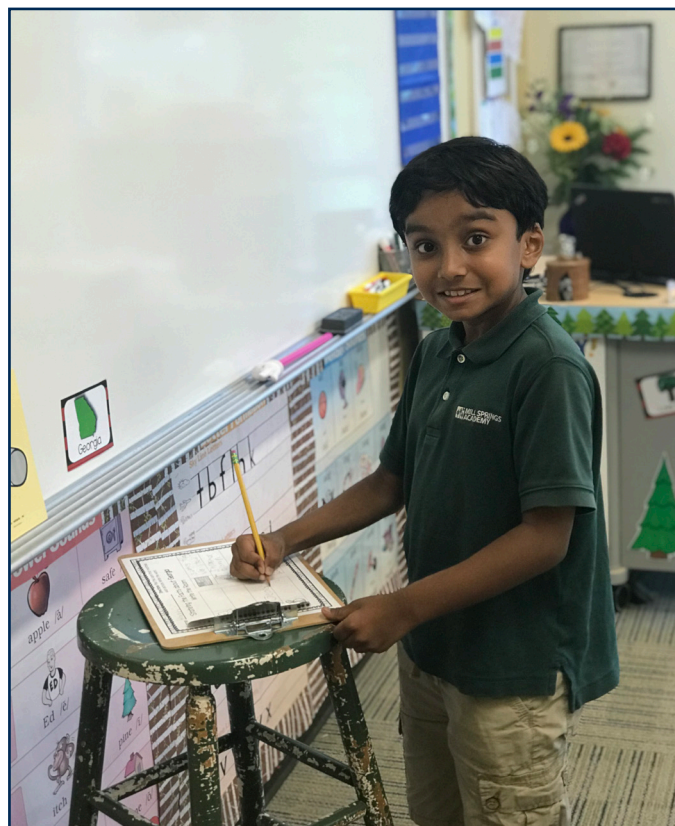
