They give the kids 30 seconds to board the bus, which is impossible. There are 3 stops on the route that I was looking at. If you compare it to the Springville to Stoller bus, it takes 15 minutes from start to finish. It only takes 6 minutes to actually drive to Stoller. So those extra 10 minutes is purely boarding time, which would necessitate an earlier start time, which would then butt up against the Springville drop-off traffic, not to mention traffic on 185th. So in this scenario, a 40 to 45 minute commute is probable.

02/14/2020	Trinh Vu	trinhthuyvu@yahoo.com	Springville K-8				Dear Mr. Sparks and Committee Members, In looking at the bus test run data that the district provided for the February 13th meeting, the results showed that most routes were around 20 to 25 minutes. However, looking at the data closely, you'll see that the stop time to load and unload students is around 30 seconds. I'm questioning whether 30 seconds for loading and unloading is reflective of the actuality, and seems to me to be an under-estimation of the actual length of time it would take for kids to get on and off the bus. From Springville to Stoller, it takes 15 minutes on the bus. It only takes 6 minutes to drive. So with those extra 10 or so minutes, I am assuming is the length of time it takes for the kids to board and un-board. To extrapolate, if we add the actual time to board onto the test run time, the kids could be on the bus 30 to 35 minutes, which would then force earlier pick up times in the morning. Those earlier pick up times would coincide with Springville School's drop-off traffic, which if you lived in our neighborhood you would know is bumper to bumper with only one small street to Springville Road. So in this scenario, a 40 to 45 minute bus ride is more likely than a 20 to 25 minute ride. So my point is that the bus test run data is questionable at best and shouldn't be counted on to make such an important decision. Thank you for your time. Trinh Vu

It is truly appreciated.I was at the meeting last night and I do not understand how you are moving to one map when you have not talked about my school and the 2 maps so far have vastly different experiences for the children of my community.-why are we only talking about the bus rides for Springville and Findley. What about Terra Linda? We are not densely populated and our streets are small. How long would my children need to ride to get to meadow park vs the .5 mile walk to Timberland? Please present this data if you are still considering sending us to Meadow Park.-why are we talking about not sending schools in the far north out of their neighborhood to make room for summa and not doing the same for Terra Linda into Timberland? Please address why it is ok to send us out of our neighborhood schools but not ok to do that to other kids? Particularly when our school is under enrolled and we provide needed socioeconomic diversity.- why are we taking about not sending kids far away of the can visually see another school from their house? But not Terra Linda? I can Timberland from my bathroom window. - why are we talking about re-doing elementary boundaries to allow for a walkable middle school for JW and Findlay, but not for Terra Linda? I beg you not to start that slippery slope, but if you must then you would need to do it district wide. I am 1 mile to Bonny slope, 1.2 miles to cedar mill and a 2.1 mile drive to Terra Linda. I don[?]t want to be adjusted but if you are doing it for JW and Findley then you need to look at it across the board or else it[?]s favoritism.-why are we talking about not sending kids to a middle school where they would be the only one to feed into their HS for everyone but Terra Linda? We are 60, sunset part of oak hills is 25. 75-85 kids feeding into sunset from meadow park in map A is the equivalent of a single school feeding into sunset. That is unacceptable and easily avoidable.-why are we taking about continuous Map areas and not about Terra Linda? I am closer to Timberland than 100% of Findley, and about 95% of both Bonny slope and Cedar Mill. I am right by 119th and Cornell. Why should all these hundreds of kids go directly past my house to get to a school my kids can go to?-why are all of the proponents of A talking about every school feeding into meadow park except Terra Linda? This one I can answer-we don[?]t belong with west view kids and they aren[?]t considering us. We don[?]t belong with rock creek, or Bethany, or most of oak hills. To copy some Springville sloganeering- Terra Linda is an integral part of The Cedar Mill community. You have heard from Terra Linda and the Cedar Mill community that we do not want to be split up. You know the importance of feeder patterns. You know we are the poorest school north of 26. You know that controlling for socioeconomics is important. You know Timberland is under enrolled. Send Terra Linda to Timberland along with the sunset portion of oak hills.The last minute suggestion of closing meadow park is an interesting one. I have been thinking about something similar in theory but different in application. Meadow park is in the middle of the district and keeps making for these awful splits in feeder patterns. Let[?]s pull out summa from overcrowded neighborhood schools and optimize feeder patterns to high school for neighborhood kids first. Then let[?]s consider moving all of northern Summa to meadow park. They are centrally located. It may be easier for a lot of farther west families or get to. Meadow park needs the socioeconomic boost. Meadow park enrollment is predicted to keep going down, this would bring a steady stream of new students and ease the burden off of the northern schools. Meadow park ready has summa.A final thought. Rachel Carson. If there is room at Timberland perhaps they should go there? Timberland has a roof top weather station they could use. There seems to be tons of space for a garden there. Since it is my neighborhood school I am well versed in its surroundings. We have wetlands with a local egret and blue heron (nutria too, yay) about 5 blocks away to the south. To the west you have cedar mill creek and falls with wildlife and potential water quality to examine. You are also about 1 mile from Jordan woods natural area if you head north west and south Johnson creek to the south east. So if at the end, AFTER you place neighborhood kids who feed into sunset into Timberland, you may want to see if it makes more sense to place summa into meadow park and have Rachel Carson at Timberland so they can use the weather station and surrounding natural areas and wildlife to their advantage.I hope that the reason you are not talking about Terra Linda is because you have made the obvious choice which is to send us to our under enrolled local school at Timberland. After the 1/30 agenda packet came out, the CMES community was spurred to action submitting a total of 152 comments through 2/12. Unfortunately, the overwhelming sentiments put forward by the school community are still not being given the credence that they deserve. Since the last meeting, there have been 152 comments coming from Cooper Mountain families, the vast majority of which are backing the option sending all CMES students to Highland Park. - 106 comments have indicated that they support a single feed into HP, yet there is no option provided to fulfill that request.- 18 comments request keeping the feeder patterns as-is with a split to HP & Mountain View which is shown on all 5 working maps.- 3 comments request a clean feed to one MS or the other with no preference- 1 backed a single feed to MV- And 15 that are just asking for the families in the southern boundaries be given the time and respect in the process that has focused on the Norther boundaries to date.Reading through every one of these 152 comments, as I am sure you have done as well, it is clear to see that most of the comments come from families that already are in the current HP boundary.Looking a bit deeper for comments that self-identified as CM families that currently attend MV; there were 10 comments.- 5 of those requested a move to clean feeding into HP- 2 for keeping the feeder patterns as-is - 2 for a clean feed regardless of the MS and- 1 for a single feed to MVWhile there is a concerted effort to eliminate existing split feeding of other ES's like Chehalem, Cooper Mountain is not being given that option although 82% of family comments are requesting that. In many of the working maps, there is adequate capacity, without making any other changes, to include the ~100 Cooper Mountain students that go to MV into the HP boundary as 70% of the comments have requested. Please hear our voice and look at an option to combine all of Cooper Mountain at Highland Park. Thank You

							Dear Committee Members: Thank you for your continued dedication to this important boundary adjustment process. I was not able to attend the 2/13 meeting but was watching the feed online. I have to say that it was extremely disheartening to see so much anger and rhetoric in the room. I know that it is easy to feel sympathetic towards a group trying to be heard but signs? T-Shirts? Media? I truly hope that each one of you will see past the rhetoric and consider factual data. Fact 1: The argument from SPV families around bus commute times being upwards of 45mins each way is untrue and invalid. The longest ride is 22:58 in the morning, which is well within BSD averages. That is a fact that has been proven and cannot be disputed no matter how many signs are made or how much booing takes place. Fact 2: According to the BSD memorandum, "The committee has asked about SUMMA at Stoller MS and if that program were removed from Stoller, would sufficient capacity result to accommodate Springville ES. Working Maps C 2.0 through C 2.2 illustrate the projected SUMMA numbers for Stoller MS. Moving SUMMA from Stoller will not create sufficient room for all of Springville ES to remain at Stoller MS. I cannot understand why this FACTUAL information is being discounted. The committee asked the question, received an answer and it seems to have been ignored or lost in the distractions of booing, signs, t-shirts and TV cameras. Fact 3: Sato and SPV CANNOT feed into the same MS now, in 2025 or potentially even after that, unless continued overcrowding is something we can all accept. When we are adjusting the boundaries again in 2025, SPV kids will end up at FO anyways with the same 22 minute commute on a bus. Whether the decision is made now or in 5 years, it is inevitable. As a parent of 3 who are heavily involved in multiple after school programs (hockey, gymnastics, lax, soccer, baseball, football, basketball, guitar) a 22 minute commute will NOT affect their ability to attend practices or games. Again, a complaint that is NOT valid or factual. FACT 4: Equity? Was that fact completely forgotten? ALL versions of Map A lead to our lowest income communities being segregated. This is NOT what BSD stands for, nor is it a proper message to send our kids. Fact 5: "Summa is NOT an option, it is a program. Unlike option schools, Summa students also take non summa classes and are engrained in the overall school community offering benefits not only for summa kids but for all students. Removing Summa from Stoller also splits a 3rd of JW students and will force many Summa families to opt out of the Summa program entirely. The PROGRAM was designed to exist in neighborhood schools. Why are we discounting clear facts as stated by BSD employees who are at the forefront of the program? Looking at the &#34;summary working map results&#34; document option map C 2.1 most accurately accomplishes this task while also being mindful that we are facing a budgetary shortfall and unnecessary spending on busing leads to a zero-sum decrease in other outlays, to include hiring teachers. map C 2.1 holds this percentage at 99% in 2021 and 106% in 2025. What is most crucial to realize, however, is that the two feeder elementary schools with the greatest projected long-term growth are Springville and Sato. Any combination with both feeders largely in the same middle school (similar to map A) will continue past 2025 to further exceed the Board mandate to strive for a 90% of permanent capacity utilization heading forward. This is not hyperbole but instead simply an inescapable conclusion of any simple analysis of the data. Focusing on Sato, Jacob Wismer, and Findley (which has a shrinking demographic) as the primary feeders to Stoller is the most logical way to simultaneously preserve full walkability (and to avoid unnecessary busing) while striving to adhere to the Board mandated 90% of permanent capacity utilization.I realize with map C 2.1 Meadow Park is over utilized and Timberland is under utilized. As was suggested in the meeting, I support moving Oak Hills to Timberland thus providing that school with a unified high school feeder program, decreasing Meadow Park's numbers and increasing Timberland's numbers.Some have argued that moving all of SUMMA from Stoller would help augment Timberland's numbers and relieve crowding at Stoller. I simply highlight what Divya said last night, that the majority of current district wide SUMMA students currently attend the Stoller SUMMA program. Further it is worth noting that at present 27% of current district wide Summer students are in a walkable zone to Stoller. Here again we need to realize we are facing a zero-sum game. Map C 2.1, does not needlessly bus a majority of the districts SUMMA students out of their home attendance area to Timberline. Map C keeps SUMMA at Stoller and especially walkable SUMMA at Stoller which saves money. Further, as per the testimony of Mr. Struckmeier last night, the SUMMA program is NOT an option school but instead is a component of the proximate nieghborhood and thus given over 52% of the district's SUMMA children now hail from Stoller, it is only in keeping with the notion of preserving that neighborhood bond and maintain a robust SUMMA program at Stoller.Finally, I want to state clearly that the rather vocal contingency from non-walkable Findley proclaiming that Findley must not be split does NOT represent my opinion or many of the other families that live directly across Laidlaw from Stoller within the rather expansive walkable area of what is currently Findley. We are grateful that the Committee has chosen to continue to analyze map C 2.1 with all of Findley and SUMMA in Stoller given its prudent cost savings and approach to minimizing unnecessary busing of children to Timberline. While we would MUCH prefer that the entire Findley community attend Stoller, many in our neighborhood do not ascribe to the [?]no split Findley[?] mindset given the expansive numbers of Findley students who are within a walkable distance to Stoller. What occurred at the last meeting brought up concerns and many unanswered issues. It was apparent at the committee meeting on 2.13.2020 that the premediated topic of discussion was the Summa program. The majority of the 1.5 hours of allotted time was spent discussing that topic solely. The motive remains quizzical if you consider statistics that are presented by the district; Per the 2018/2019 enrollment statistics (public information), of the 7,841 enrolled students in Middle Schools, only 682 were enrolled in the Summa program. That is approx. 11.5 % of total enrollment. Doing simple math would indicate that 88.5% of the students are not accounted for in discussing only the Summa program. Which brings up the question of why is nearly 90% of the total population being ignored? If best intentions are assumed, what is the rationalization for the skewed nature of the discussion by the committee? During the discussion, it was voiced by a committee member that there were minimal differences between Map A and Map C. Is Terra Linda not in BSD? The word Terra Linda was uttered on two occasions during the entire 1.5 hours of discussion by the committee. Yet in viewing the comments submitted by the parents of Terra Linda, it is unanimous that the community is not in agreement with Map A. Why are the needs of the Terra Linda community being bypassed and not addressed during the meetings? Meadow Park is ranked 85th in the state with respect to other middle schools. Cedar Park (historical school for area) is ranked 44th by those same rankings. In other rankings Meadow Park is rated 3/10 and Cedar Park is a 6/10. By most measurable objectives Meadow Park is not achieving satisfactory school ratings. As parents who care about the quality of education that our children receive, the statistics are nothing short of alarming and concerning. Now is the time for BSD to prove it can make the hard decisions for the greater good in order to provide an equitable learning environment at each of the schools. An example of a change that would benefit Mountain View would be to incorporate Cooper Mountain ES as a complete feeder into Mountain View. But by allowing Springville to stay at Stiller, instead of Five Oaks, will displace two other communities by making Findlay (which is in walking distance to Stiller) to bus to Timberland, and then by making Terra Linda (which is in walking distance to Timberland) bus to Meadow Park. In Map A, two communities would be displaced out of a school in their immediate neighborhood and into another community. Map C would not to do this.It is unfortunate that Map C would send Springville kids to Five Oaks, but only one community kids would be displaced. The tough situation is that the communities on the fringes is the boundary/school district will be impacted the most as the infrastructure (lack of schools) is lacking as home builders were allowed to build without thinking of school. First, let me thank you for the trial run and making the data public. However, there are several problems on the data that are leading BSD to erroneous conclusions. Let me comment on 1 specific issue I see: 1. Buses are shown leaving Springville neighborhood around 8:55AM in the morning and getting to Five Oaks around 9:05-9:10AM. (Note the route cuts through Tannasbourne shopping center, which can have unpredictable traffic volumes, but let's ignore that for now.) This seems reasonable. 2. Assuming buses get there by 9:15AM latest, then middle school kids typically require 15-20 minutes to get to lockers and put things away before start of school. (See schedules at other middle schools within BSD.) So school should start around 9:30AM. 3. Assuming a regular 6 Hour 45 Minute schedule, kids should be out of school at 4:15pm and start to get to buses around 4:15pm. 4. Looking at bus cam footage and GPS track, trial buses leave at 3:50pm. 5. This is a problem. It implies middle school children are being short changed by approximately 30 minutes in their day. (Note 3:50 pm is when last class ends at Stoller and buses typically leave around 4pm.) 6. Parsing GPS track and confirmed by cam footage, school buses transit back to Springville around 20 minutes. 7. However, note the 20 minute time is based on a 3:50pm departure, which is prior to traffic build up in 185th at 4pm. 8. Based on public transit data from public buses, I calculate that 3-6 minutes should be added to the commute time in the PM if school buses leave around 4:15pm. If these are added in, then the bus commute for Springville kids are nearly double of their commute time from Stoller. In conclusion, I believe BSD bus route trial time is erroneous and is leading to wrong decisions, or the intent of school district is to cut short middle school kids time in school by 30 minutes. Can the committee explain which of these is happening? Thank you

The time and energy that our kids will have to commit to joining a new community will take away from academics and ensure that our kids will not have an equitable middle school experience. There continues to be inequitable challenges for this small percentage of RC because of high school feeder patterns. I attended the boundary adjustment public meeting at Five Oaks middle school yesterday, 2/13/20. It was my first time attending one of the meetings, so I am not yet very familiar with the boundary adjustment process or the options that are being considered, but I do have some questions after listening to the discussion of the committee last night. 1) As far as I understand, Aloha-Huber Park is going to remain a K-8 school for the time being, is that correct? Are there any plans to eliminate the middle school levels from AHP in the future?2) Students in the TWI Spanish immersion program at AHP can elect to stay at AHP for middle school (assuming they get in during the lottery), but at the moment, there are no middle school level Spanish dual language options being offered to the middle schoolers there. Are there plans to restore the middle school dual language program at AHP? If not, will TWI students at AHP have the option to enroll in a dual language program in another middle school like Meadow Park if they wish to continue in dual language classes? The TWI/dual language program has been such a wonderful experience for my two children, and it is so important to me that the TWI programs in the district are considered when the boundaries are adjusted. 3) There were several comments at the meeting last night proposing the possibility of Summa programs being moved from one school to another. If the Summa programs are moved, will the Summa teachers move with the students? If not, are there teachers in the other schools who are appropriately trained to teach Summa students? If not, what training will be made available to the teachers, and how will the school district be able to maintain the quality of the Summa program? As I mentioned above, my son is in Summa at Meadow Park, and I believe it would be incredibly detrimental to his education and social/emotional well-being if the Summa program at Meadow Park was moved to another school, especially as the change would take effect when he will be an eighth grader. I strongly object to this option and request that it be avoided if at all possible. 4) I can't be sure, but I am reasonably certain that I was the only parent with a child at Aloha-Huber Park in attendance last night at the meeting. Have any other AHP parents voiced their opinions/concerns about the proposed middle school boundaries to date? I am very concerned that the population of parents (57% of AHP families are Hispanic/Latino) in the AHP attendance area are not able to engage in the public listening sessions for these boundary meetings, and I am worried that the needs of the AHP families may not end up being adequately considered by the committee. I do not feel like I can speak for other AHP families, but I do believe that since AHP has a very high percentage of low-income families (79% qualified for free and reduced lunch in 2018-2019 according to the Oregon At-A-Glance School Profile), they could be at risk of falling through the cracks during the boundary adjustment process. I feel that it is imperative that the committee prioritizes meeting the needs of the most vulnerable students in the district prior to accommodating the demands of wealthier and more vocal parents/communities. The potential impact of inequitable boundary changes would have a disproportionate effect on the families in the AHP attendance area, as well as on other students of lower income schools in the district.5) Several parents in attendance at the meeting mentioned their objections to having their children bused to other schools in the district due to the long bus rides. I would like to remind the committee that AHP students who do not stay at AHP for middle school currently have a very long commute to Five Oaks middle school every day. Mountain View middle school is within sight/walking distance of many of the homes of families at AHP, yet the students are bused more than 20 minutes away (in peak traffic, maybe longer with stops). I am certain that low-income families in the AHP attendance area would benefit from attending Mountain View, as it is so much closer to our homes, but how would their attendance affect the percentage of low-income families in Mountain View school if this were the case? I am concerned that having a very high population of students at Mountain View who are experiencing poverty, and possibly even housing and/or food insecurity, could negatively impact the ability of the students to succeed and go on to successfully graduate from high school. With this in mind, is it better for the students from AHP to attend Meadow Park, despite the fact that it is farther from home for most of the students? From an equity standpoint, would AHP students have better opportunities if they are included in the Meadow Park boundary? I think this may be the case, particularly if the TWI students at AHP can gain access to the dual language program at Meadow Park. I hope that the committee will consider my questions and thoughts on the boundary adjustments. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have comments or questions for me. I appreciate your efforts to make the most equitable decisions possible for all of the students in the district, and I understand that not everyone will be happy about the decisions you make. 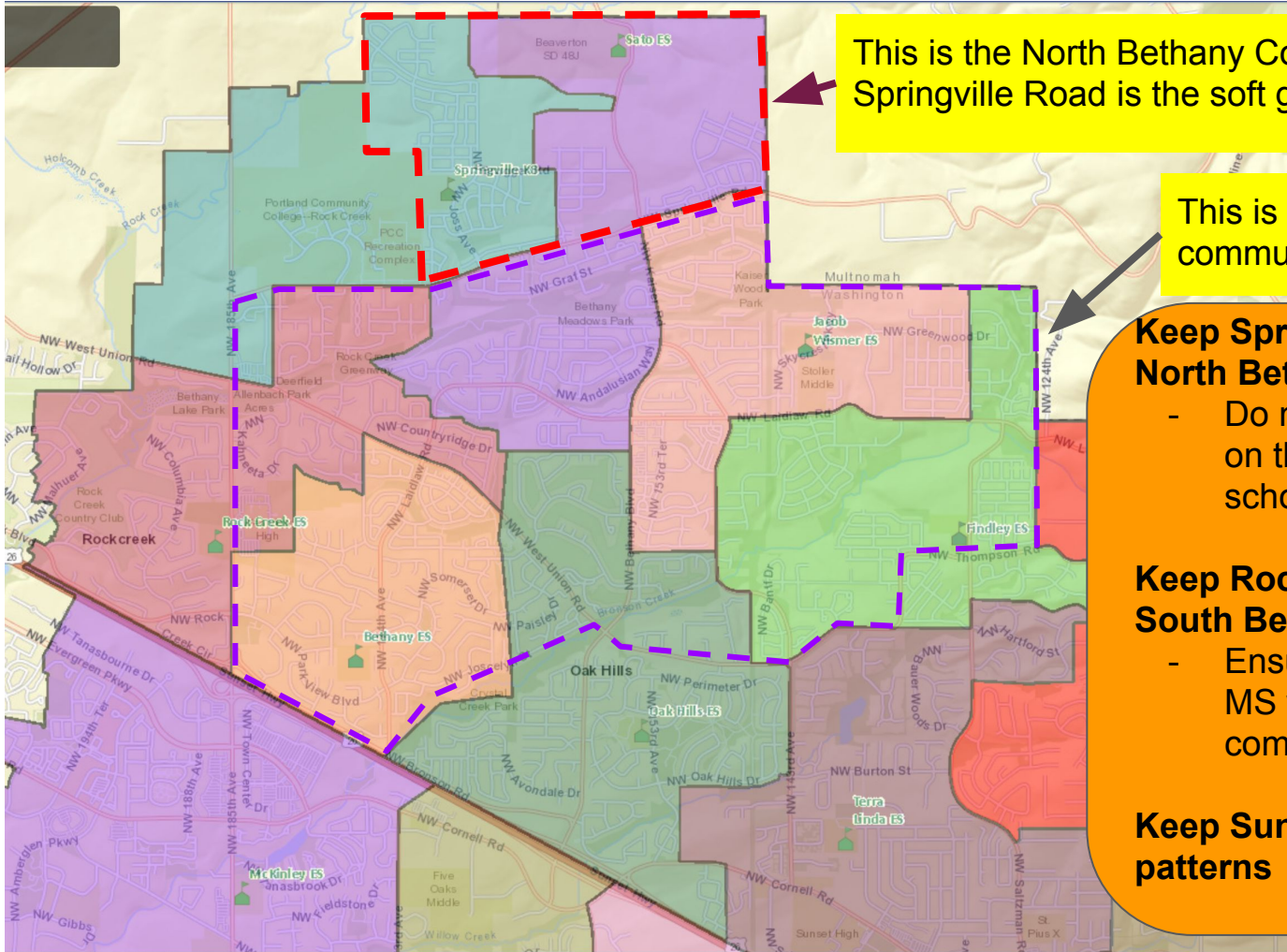

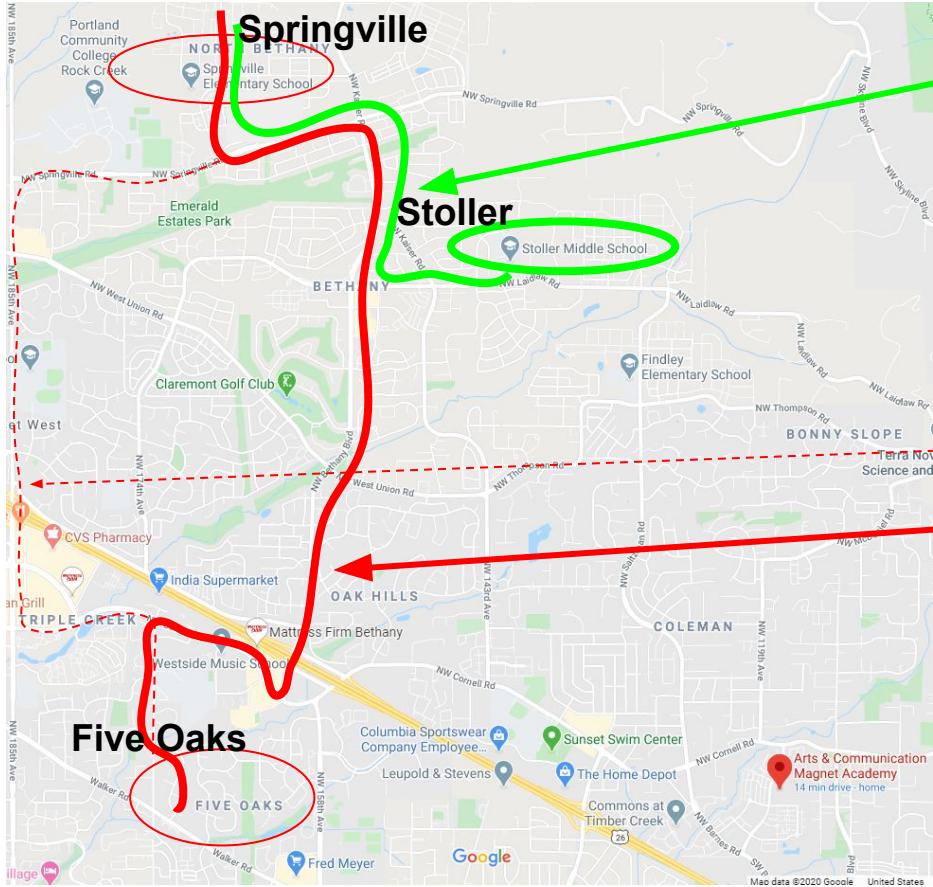

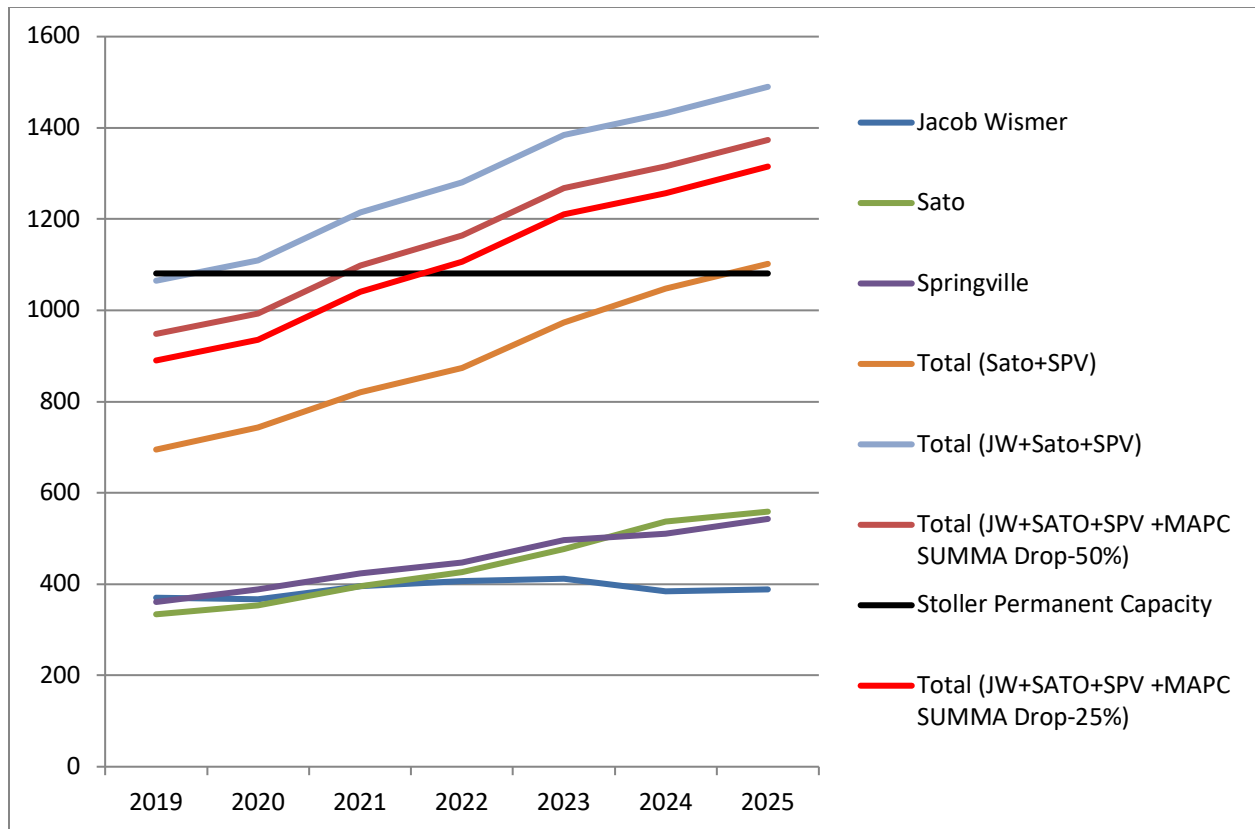

Dear Mr. Sparks,

I just attended the meeting at Five Oaks. I was frankly scared to be the non-red shirt wearing minority in the audience but happy to report that I made out of there in one piece.

We have seen the commute times posted for public by BSD. **Maximum ride time from Springville to Five Oaks is 25:06min.** Not 45 min. Not 2 hours round trip, as claimed by hundreds of comments. It is 25:06min, exactly 5min longer than the maximum ride time from Springville to Stoller. Yet, we have seen multiple banners, t-shirts, Flags, Facebook, Whatsapp, Twitter, TV channels and public testimonies refer to this commute as "unfair". Yet, I heard committee members take the side of 'long commute times of Springville'.

We have seen the memorandum from BSD dated 02/07/20 that said **"Moving SUMMA from Stoller will not create sufficient room for all of Springville ES to remain at Stoller MS"**. This is further confirmed by the numbers from map C.2.2 which ONLY puts a part of Springville at Stoller and puts Stoller utilization at 121% in 2025, and at 101% WITHOUT SUMMA. Let me reiterate that this is ONLY a portion of Springville. Imagine what Stoller utilization would be if entire Springville were to feed Stoller! Yet, we have seen multiple committee members back the proposal to move entire Springville to Stoller.

We have heard Mr. Carl Mead address SUMMA at today's meeting. We have heard him say that SUMMA is a program for resident students of a neighborhood school, much like a bilingual program, and not an option. We have heard him say that such programs are typically held where there is need. You won't put a Spanish program 5 miles away from the neighborhood that needs it! **Why would you take SUMMA program away from a school where one in every three students qualify for it?** Yet, we have heard many committee members disregard Mr. Mead's comments and continue to treat SUMMA as an option school- one that gets moved wherever there's room.

We have seen dozens of fake email IDs commenting as "Jacob Wismer", "Oak Hills" and "Rock Creek" **parents but voicing opinions that are only in the best interest of Springville.** We have seen Springville banners flying all across the cafeteria today, obstructing the view for the majority of the duration. We have seen our Springville neighbors engage in personal interaction with each of the committee members and explain to them why the Springville to Five Oaks ride times are 'unfairly' long. Yet, we have always taken the high road, and are proud of our community's conduct throughout this grueling process. We have always believed in the system.

Our requests have always been straightforward and reasonable:

1. Jacob Wismer feeds both West View and Sunset. Let us not be the only sunset feeding school at Stoller! Please send Findley or Oak Hills or part of either of those two schools! Please don't isolate us!
2. Jacob Wismer is 100% walking zone to Stoller, as is the north portion of Findley neighborhood. Let us walk to Stoller! It just does not make any sense not to!
3. One in every three JW students is in SUMMA program. Please don't break up these precious friendships! These are resident JW students that walk to school every day!

We have been attending every meeting- followed the guidelines, sent our comments and hoped that our voices are being heard. Today, I walked out of that meeting with absolutely no hope. We felt that the committee did not hear us- we did not hear support for our feeder pattern request. SUMMA was considered an option and not the **neighborhood divider** that it is for Jacob Wismer. We felt that the committee just does not see the value in increasing walkability. We felt that the committee has no interest in seizing this opportunity to bring some much needed diversity to Stoller- a.k.a the 'elite' Middle School.

We have no banners, flyers, flags, t-shirts, twitter handles, Facebook pages or KPTV coverage, and as of today, no hope, that our voices would stand a chance amidst the squeaky wheels.

I am sorry to say that I have lost faith in the system- one that I was proud to be a part of, not long ago. We will just have to see you again in 2025 to discuss Stoller overcrowding, if you decide to put Springville in Stoller.
