Athletics:

Winter Sports:

- **Girls Hockey** Currently have a 14-0 record, sitting in 1st in Division 3. They have recent wins over Kingdom Blades (North Country, Lyndon Institute, Lake Region combined team) 5-1 and U32 7-3. Tournament Hockey pairings come out on Thursday Feb 27th. Playdowns (if necessary) are scheduled for Feb 28th or 29th. Quarter-finals March 3rd or 4th. Semi-Finals March 6th or 7th. Championship game is scheduled for March 9th @ UVM.
- **Boys Hockey** Currently have a 8-5-1 record and are sitting 6th in Division 1. They picked up a 7-3 win @ South Burlington. Tournament Hockey pairings come out on Thursday Feb 27th. Playdowns (if necessary) are scheduled for Feb 28th or 29th. Quarter-finals March 3rd or 4th. Semi-Finals March 6th or 7th. Championship game is scheduled for March 11th @ UVM.
- **JV Girls Basketball:** Are having a great season, they have been highly competitive with the Division 1 teams. I have been impressed with the amount of growth this team has had this season. They have their final game on February 27th vs Burlington.
- Varsity Girls Basketball: Currently have an 8-5 record and sit 4th in Division 2. Recent wins 38-33 over Burlington, 41-24 over South Burlington and 45-38 over St. Albans, all Division 1 teams. Girls Basketball pairings will be announced on March 2nd. Playdowns are scheduled for March 3rd or 4th, quarter-finals March 6th or 7th, semi-finals March 9th or 11th, and finals March 14th. Semi-Finals and finals are played at the Barre Auditorium.
- **JV Boys Basketball:** Have played in a lot of fun, competitive, back and forth games all season long. They are a highly skilled team and I am excited to see what the future brings them.
- Varsity Boys Basketball: Currently have a 4-12 record and sit 14th is Division 2. They have recent win over Division 1 Essex 63-50 and #2 seed in Division 2 U32 65-47. Boys

Basketball pairings will be announced on February 24th. Playdowns are scheduled for February 25th or 26th, quarter-finals February 28th or 29th, semi-finals March 2nd or 4th, and finals on March 7th.

- Spaulding High School is proud to announce that **Jacob Washburn** has been accepted into the GW Plastics' Apprenticeship Program for the Summer of 2020. This is the first for WBL STEM programming with various partners in manufacturing and training through the Generator, a leading makerspace in Vermont. We wish him well as he embarks on his career pathway.
- As an Aspirations School, we have been invited to engage with legislatures on Wednesday, February 12th, thus giving students the opportunity to tour the statehouse,

sit in on House Committee work, and engage in conversation with their local representatives. This is an annual event and will be all day.

- Post-Secondary Night will be held on March 10th (weather day will be March 12th) from 6:30 PM to 8 PM. This event is open to all students and parents to explore college options, training and apprenticeship programs/opportunities, military service opportunities, and flexible pathways.
- Thirty-six members of the drama club and chorus traveled to NYC for a whirlwind weekend. Students attended two (and in some cases three) Broadway musicals, did a musical theater workshop with a team from Beetlejuice the Musical, and toured the beautiful Radio City Music Hall. Some also toured NBC Studios, where they bumped into cast members from Saturday Night Live, shopped on Fifth Avenue, and wandered through Central Park, where they crashed a marriage proposal at the Bethesda Fountain. On our last day, we took a boat to the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island and visited the 9/11 Memorial before heading home. They both started and ended the trip with a very boisterous rendition of "Glory to Spaulding."
- In the September <u>Newsletter</u>, the new Office Hours and Plans for Academic Success (PAS) system was outlined. Students that had earned a Below or Unsatisfactory in their academic courses received an email, along with their parents, indicating that they would need to work on their plan. The teachers worked closely with the students needing to make a plan, receive support and complete work. Parents should have received a follow-up plan for each course their child needed to work on.

After each implementation, we seek feedback and ways to improve our system. The Call Back Day is reserved as a final opportunity to reassess at the end of the semester if a student has a few performance indicators to complete and has attended their Office Hours (see the January <u>Newsletter</u> for more information).

After a semester of implementation, we have sent out several surveys to staff and students to solicit feedback and gather data. Although this system of support is still relatively new, the data indicates that students are more aware of deadlines and are utilizing their academic time more effectively. We are awaiting some data reports to fully review the comparison of student performance for this past semester compared to previous years, as well as analyzing student performance for those that attended Office Hours. Although we are encouraged by our initial semester, we will continue to refine our system in support of meeting the needs of our students.

Student of the Week

- **Richard Torre** (nominated by Alicia Tosi) *He is such a friendly and kind young man. It is a pleasure to have him in class.*
- Abigail Stacy (nominated by Michelle LaFrancis) I nominate Abigail Stacy for Student of the Week. Not only is she a WBL Bumblina, but also an office aide. She is interning at Head Start and she is beginning to step into the toes of an empathetic teacher. She interacts with students with great needs and in one case, began talking.

Athletics Update: 2/20/20

Boys Basketball: Lost to Colchester 71-51 on Thursday 2/13. Senior night was Tuesday 2/18 where we recognized, Taylor D'Agostino, Dylan Hebert, Matt Tacey, Brandon Brunner and manager Jada MacDonald. In that game they lost to Burlington 54-41. There are two games remaining in their regular season, @ CVU on Friday 2/21 and @ Rice on 2/22.

Girls Basketball: Lost to St. Johnsbury, Friday 2/14 54-37 (earlier in the season we lost to St. Johnsbury 40-15, much improved). Lost @ BFA St. Albans on 2/17 48-40. 1. Call to Order

The Chair, Mr. Folland, called the Tuesday, February 11, 2020 BUUSD Communications Committee meeting to order at 5:36 p.m., which was held at the BUUSD Central Office in the First Floor Conference Area.

2. Additions and/or Deletions to the Agenda None.

3. Public Comment None.

4. Approval of Minutes

4.1 January 2, 2020 BUUSD Communications Committee Meeting The Committee agreed by consensus to approve the Minutes of the January 2, 2020 BUUSD Communications Committee meeting.

5. New Business None.

6. Old Business

6.1 Annual Report

A draft copy of the 'BUUSD 2020 Annual Report to the Community' was distributed. The Committee reviewed the document. Mr. Allen advised that most of his requested changes have been made by the vendor. Once the document has been finalized, it will take a little over a week to starting printing and get the reports into people's homes. Annual Reports will be delivered to every residential home in 'Barre', and 300 extra copies will be printed for distribution at other places.

6.2 Budget Promotion

Mrs. Spaulding has the list of events that Mrs. Kerin-Hutchins created. The list is mainly sporting events. Mrs. Spaulding has obtained a copy of Mrs. Akley's list that was used for community outreach during Act 46. Mrs. Spaulding will amend the budget outreach list to include other events. The list will be circulated for Board Member sign-up. Board Members should commit to attend some of the events and service club meetings. Mrs. Spaulding also suggested that Board Members attend 'Meet and Greet' events at various venues, such as Expresso Bueno. Mrs. Spaulding has developed a list of venues and Mr. Allen has prepared half sheets for distribution at such functions. Mr. Isabelle suggested that the Annual Report be e-mailed to entire service club memberships if possible. The Annual Report should also be sent to State Representatives and Senators. Mrs. Spaulding has also listed the Exit Survey on the sign-up sheet. A rough draft of the Exit Survey will be presented at next week's Board meeting. Mr. Isabelle would like to focus the discussion more on budget promotion than on the Exit Survey. Mr. Isabelle suggested that perhaps students could assist with the Exit Survey. Mr. Allen will contact Brenda Waterhouse and Margo Austin regarding outreach to students to assist with the

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Exit Survey as part of their Community Service Graduation Requirement. It was noted that the vote is three weeks from today and it is important to assure that the Annual Report is distributed as soon as possible. The Committee agreed that Mr. Allen should request that a few minor changes be made and that the vendor proceed with printing and mailing the Annual Report.

Mr. Allen would like to use some funding for Facebook ads. The Committee agreed that Mr. Allen should proceed with this option as the cost is minimal and the Facebooks ads will reach many individuals.

Mrs. Spaulding and Mrs. Akley will post information on Front Porch Forum and will include links to the video and the budget page.

Mr. Allen has reviewed Barre Town data and advised that three times the number of voters turn out for the Primary Election. Mr. Allen does not have data for Barre City.

Mr. Pandolfo advised regarding legal posting (in the newspaper) of the Warning, ballot, and Special Article for the SEA property.

Mr. Isabelle suggested that Mr. Pandolfo may be able to get a guest editorial spot in the Times Argus.

Mr. Isabelle believes early voting is very important. It was agreed that message blasts should be sent to all staff and parents.

It was suggested that Mr. Ferland, as part of morning announcements, should encourage 18 year old students to register to vote and vote by absentee ballot. This information should also be put in the Tide Pride (daily bulletin). This information should also be shared with CVCC students and staff.

Mrs. Spaulding advised of possible questions for the Exit Survey, including how individuals voted and why they voted the way they did. Mr. Isabelle reiterated that he would prefer to focus discussion on budget promotion rather than the Exit Survey.

Other budget promotion discussion includes; use of 'lawn signs'. Mrs. Spaulding has the signs used last year, and will discuss sign placement at the Board meeting.

It was discussed and agreed that the electronic message board at SHS should also be used for budget promotion.

Mr. Allen will have more 'half sheet' budget promotion documents printed. Copies will be available for Board Members at the next Board meeting.

6.3 Mission, Vision & Strategic Goals – Barre Education Coalition

Mrs. Spaulding advised that she has spoken with a representative from Portrait of a Graduate and obtained pricing information; Full package/services (including travel expenses) \$25,000 - \$32,000, low end "Portrait Lite" (a semi-virtual option) \$17,000 -\$18,000, and a one day kick-off service \$3,500 - \$5,000. Mr. Pandolfo suggested reaching out to independent consultant, Sue McCormick to see if she has any advice or could assist. Mr. Pandolfo also suggested that Dave Baker be contacted regarding creative funding ideas. Mr. Isabelle suggested that the Board consider postponing the project until after a new Superintendent is hired. Mrs. Spaulding will forward a copy of the proposal document to Tina Gilbert, for inclusion in the Board packet.

6.4 Logo/Branding

Mr. Allen reported that Ms. Chamberlin approves of CVCC students working on the logo/branding project. Additionally, Mr. Allen advised that Ms. Chamberlin provided additional information relating to the CVCC branding/logo project, which included the use of a firm from the Burlington area, Place Creative Company. Ms. Chamberlin felt the process was unifying and a morale booster. Exactly what is being requested needs to be defined prior to CVCC students doing the work. Mrs. Spaulding reiterated her desire to rename the district. Renaming of the district is not very probable at this time.

7. Other Business

In response to a query regarding recently received information relating to the "Best of Barre" designation received by the BUUSD, it was noted that this is probably not a legitimate award and appears as though it is an attempt to obtain funds.

Mr. Isabelle circulated a copy of the CVCC Annual Report that he received in the mail. The mailing list for this document is not known. Mr. Isabelle will check with Ms. Chamberlin to find out who the CVCC Annual Report is mailed to.
