- Nancy shared the new information from the state, which dealt with updated requirements for school safety. Council members will review the fliers about the new requirements and will discuss them at the meeting in April.

Farmington High School Site Visit Feedback

Visiting feedback: *Marcalene Randall (PTSA); Terri Hall; Current FHS parent/ prior teacher, FHS student, LJH teachers*

- The visitors shared how the Summit Learning Management System (LMS) works and what it looks like from the student side. They also discussed how the work can be done at the student's chosen pace or with the pace set by the teacher.
- There are rubrics set by the Summit system to be used with the cognitive skills that are embedded in every subject area. However, the content covered by the teacher is still chosen by the teacher and measured by the teacher. Teacher created content can be uploaded into Summit.
- One requirement of using the Summit system is that there needs to be a Mentoring period in the schedule. Students are randomly assigned to a mentoring group and a teacher. The students stay with that group and teacher all three years at the school. The teacher meets with the students in

their group one-on-one every other week to set goals and check in on how the students are doing. Content assessments and other classwork can be completed during that time as well.

- There are still grading period (end-of-term and midterm grades), but they can be changed throughout the year.
- The council members discussed how it could look at our school when implemented. They would like the teachers to provide more guidance to the students as they work through the Summit system, especially at the beginning of the year. Teachers should also be compensated for their time spent being trained on the Summit system.

- Possibly provide or link to an informational video for parents on the Summit system at the Back-to-School night at the beginning of next year.
