The reality is that Springville and SATO support a large student population, simply because of the current population and projected population growth in neighborhoods they service. The schools yield excellent academic outcomes. Two such large schools converging into a single middle school Stoller, which is currently running way above its peak capacity, seems unsustainable. BSD has invested significant resource into brainstorming, collecting realistic transportation data and looking for a solution engineered towards sustainable education informed by demographic projections. Not taking a bold step at this point is likely to bring us back to this table simply on account of unsustainable populations at Stoller in less than 4 years. At that point, redistricting is likely to become more constrained and likely more inequitable to a vast majority of our families. Feeding an elementary school with very good academic outcomes such as Springville, to Five Oaks is a sustainable proposition both in terms of capacity, and academic outcomes at Five Oaks, with just incremental costs for transportation (both time and money).

This includes more than 30 percent of our kids who are in Summa program. Our current fifth grade at Jacob Wismer, 59 kids have qualified for Summa and will be at Stoller in the academic year 2020-21. This is 45 percent of the incoming class. Moving Summa out of Stoller is virtually slicing Jacob Wismer into two. These children are moving to an age that enables them to go to school on their own, Keeping them together gets them safety in numbers as they gain independence, not to mention the strengthening of friendships at an impressionable age. They are often able to help their younger siblings who will still be in Jacob Wismer. In the long run, it will give these children a graceful transition to high school, while helping their younger siblings all the way along. While this benefit does not exist at all middle school/elementary school boundaries, the unique proximity of Stoller and Jacob Wismer does afford this safety and graceful transition for Jacob Wismer students. We wish to ensure this unique experience endures the redistricting.

During the 2/13 Middle School Boundaries committee meeting, I was struck by several inconsistencies in how the Committee is thinking about its recommendations, treating students and schools in the northern areas of the district very differently - and preferentially - compared to students and schools in the central and south areas of the district. These include:1. Committee Priorities: At the meeting outset, Steven Sparks stated the committee's priorities as a) establish new boundaries for the Timberland neighborhood school; b) reduce the number of students at Stoller to approximately 90% of building's permanent capacity; c) balance attendance at other schools; and d) possibly make minor adjustments to other attendance boundaries. The message this sends to the public is that the Committee cares a lot about students at Timberland and Stoller, and that it cares much less about everyone else. This was borne out in the Committee discussions, which spent a majority of the time discussing issues pertinent to these schools and voicing concerns expressed by parents and communities at these schools. The current maps put the interests of these students at the forefront and do little or nothing to improve conditions for students in the rest of the district. While this attention is consistent with the stated committee priorities, THESE PRIORITIES ARE NOT FAIR OR EQUITABLE TO THE REST OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT. You should not make recommendations that prioritize and optimize outcomes only for these two schools and ignore, or treat as a third and lesser priority, recommendations that may be in the best interest of the school district as a whole. For example, the Committee gave almost zero time to discussing how to balance the massive inequities in free and reduced lunch student populations across the district, especially at Mountain View. The maps under serious consideration now do little if anything to address this serious problem. Where the committee has an opportunity to make improvements on this front, its current path will result in further isolating rather than finding ways to lift the schools and communities in our school district most affected by poverty. THIS IS WRONG.A second example: During the Committee members' final comments at the 2/13 meeting, it became apparent that the committee is not hearing the voices of the Oak Hills community. Some of the final recommendations propose &#34;ending the isolation of Oak Hills&#34;; by redrawing high school boundaries to send all its students to Sunset. What the committee persists in not hearing is that the WEST SIDE OAK HILLS AND BETHANY ARE ALL ONE GEOGRAPHIC NEIGHBORHOOD WITH STRONG TIES TO EACH OTHER. You will aggravate &#34;Oak Hills isolation&#34;; if you break up this neighborhood by sending our children to different middle schools. Today this COMBINED community represents a powerhouse in terms of parental, volunteer, and financial support for the schools we attend - Meadowpark and Westview. That is because we are a cohesive neighborhood community that engages neighbors to make a difference in our schools and broader community. Please DO NOT split up this community just because we look like &#34;puzzle pieces&#34;; you can easily manipulate to optimize outcomes for Timberland and Stoller. Please listen to the united parental views expressed at the 2/13 meeting, to either a) Keep all of Oak Hills together with Bethany at Meadowpark and then split OH according to current high school boundaries, or else b) split Oak Hills after elementary school rather than middle school, allowing East Side Oak Hills to attend Timberland with other children heading to Sunset, and keeping West Side Oak Hills at whatever middle school Bethany attends. 2. Transportation. At the meeting we heard one committee member express concern about a map that would bus some Springville students to Five Oaks Middle School, estimating a 20-minute commute each way, and how this would create difficulties for participating in extracurricular activities and other challenges. Why is a 20-minute bus commute a problem for Springville students, but the Committee gave virtually no consideration to the even longer bus commutes happening now for students at other elementary schools? For example: My sons and their Bethany/Oak Hills classmates who attend Meadow Park commute by bus 30-35 minutes each way, and even longer on the frequent days when their bus is running late and they have to wait 10-15 minutes after school for the bus to show up. Commute times affect all students and families across the district. Why does the board not explore these factors and establish a benchmark to help with redrawing middle school boundaries in ways that would be desirable and equitable for ALL STUDENTS across the district? 3. SUMMA. During discussions about the SUMMA program, the program was described as a &#34;neighborhood school program&#34;; that ideally would be provided as part of each neighborhood school. This is at the heart of the question about whether to have SUMMA at Stoller AND Timberland, versus only at Timberland. I want to highlight the double standard apparent in the Committee meeting assumptions here. There was no discussion, and not even a thought, about the fact that SUMMA is not a &#34;neighborhood school program&#34;; in the middle schools south of 26. It's a foregone conclusion that it's available only as a magnet type program in those schools. If it's somehow important to preserve SUMMA as a &#34;neighborhood school program&#34;; in the schools in the north of the district, why does the Committee not even entertain ideas about how to deliver it as a neighborhood school program in the south? It would be much more equitable to redefine SUMMA as a magnet-type program that fits where it can be accommodated, rather than as an entitlement for neighborhood schools but only in the the more affluent parts of our school district. The committee has a challenging task here, and I absolutely see that. But in the interests of ALL the families, students, and communities you're supposed to be representing, PLEASE give due consideration to these issues. Thank you.

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Hello Mr Sparks,

Thank you for agreeing to visit Findley PTO meeting today and all the Findley parents would be eager to meet with you today. Due to some unforeseen circumstances I would miss the meeting and hence I am conveying my request and concerns about boundary change in the email. I have attached some maps to show you that the walkability map to Stoller does not really reflect the proximity of all neighborhoods around Stoller and if a Findley split is on the cards for the greater good of the community please be fair to all the concerned groups of Findley parents both walking and bussed. Dividing the tight knit Findley kids and their friendships and in turn creating a divide in the Findley community should not be considered unless its absolutely inevitable. If such an unfortunate decision has to be made then please be fair to all communities involved. Do not split the SUMMA program north of US 26 to keep the program strong as its the fair thing to do for all SUMMA kids who qualify with the same criteria irrespective of SUMMA site location. Please keep full SUMMA intact at Stoller or Timberland at one site north of US 26. I hope as the long range planning executive head you will look at the big picture for all Findley families. I have attached some maps to show the proximity of my community to Stoller. Please share this PDF with the advisory committee and make it a part of the public records.

I want to first convey my thanks to all the middle school boundary adjustment committee members who have willingly volunteered their time to be on this committee which is no easy task. I would also like to thank Mr. Steven Sparks for his leadership of this committee and the BSD staff who are generating all the data which should be the key factor in the boundary change process. Since all parents want the best for their children, this process has become highly emotional for many parents including me. But I strongly believe that final decisions should be based on data and empathy for the community to heal. Since the kids will be bearing the brunt of the final decisions empathy towards kids and their friendships would be necessary as this is not a business deal just based on facts.

I am a Findley mom and live in the Arbor Cascadian community which is to the west of Findley school and south of Stoller, across Bronson Creek. One of the board policy JC factors is about **neighborhood proximity** and accessibility. In terms of proximity all Findley neighborhoods are proximal to Stoller which includes Bauer Highlands, Willow Creek, Findley Heights, Bannister Creek, Oak Meadows and Arbor Cascadian. Based on the designated BSD walk paths currently 47% of Findley kids walk to Stoller as they are within the 1.5 mile mark decided by BSD.

I would like to bring to your attention that my community can access the THPRD westside regional trail through NW Evergreen Street and my home is within the 1.5 mile mark as shown in the maps 1-4 below. But the 1.5 mile mark rule is not being strictly followed as my home is left out of the walkability map. I am assuming this is to keep my community together and not be split based on the 1.5 mile rule. If not splitting a neighborhood is important to BSD then please do not cause split between neighborhoods too. Maps showing split based on walkability has caused a lot of distress and divide among the close knit Findley families. This divide can cause groupism in elementary kids and their parents who might choose to form their own groups based on which middle school they might feed as many after school activities and sports are continued from elementary into the middle school years.

Ideally it makes a lot of sense to feed all of Findley to Stoller and this will help to keep all the neighborhoods of Findley together.

**Findley is the highest contributor of Summa kids to the Summa program at Stoller.** My Arbor Cascadian community alone has 30 Summa kids according to the Summa heat map published by BSD. So just like the JW walkable kids want to go to Summa at Stoller and do not want to be split, our kids are also wanting to go to the neighborhood Stoller Summa school with all their friends together. This will help JW and Findley to stay together and feed into Sunset for the high school years.

As a mother with young kids I feel **no elementary splits should be encouraged** by the committee. **I am willing to sacrifice for the greater good of the entire community of Bethany and be willing to travel till Timberland but numbers show that Springville cannot be accommodated at Stoller along with Sato even if Findley endures a split.** Then splitting Springville becomes inevitable which in my opinion is worse than them commuting to Five Oaks.

I hope parents fears about FO rating can be assuaged by providing a common middle school experience for all the middle schools and Summa sites.

Walkability is good for the sake of saving fossil fuels and transportation costs for BSD. But only true walkability helps in saving the environment. True walkability only exists for Oakridge estates community which is right in front of Stoller. If Findley has to be split to have enough numbers for Timberland then give this community an option to attend Stoller or Timberland. If saving transportation costs is an important goal for BSD then please allow all neighborhoods of Findley within the 1.5 mile mark to walk to Stoller which includes more than half of the Arbor Cascadian community which was left out in the walkability map.

The long range planning department of BSD should consider future plans of the trails being developed by THPRD like the THPRD Bronson Creek community trail (marked in red dotted line in the maps below) which would greatly **increase walkability for Findley families by 75%**

My community has a road access to directly connect to this trail and when linked to the Oakridge community on the other side of Bronson creek my home will be within 0.5 mile of Stoller (shown in maps 1-4)

Not considering such proximal neighborhoods by stating current lack of designated paths is a very short sighted way of looking at it by the long range planning department at BSD.

Mr Sparks I sincerely request you to look at the big picture as this is your forte. You are the long range planning executive administrative head and as the former principal planner of the City of Beaverton you should consider future long range planning of THPRD which will be using taxpayers money like the upcoming Saltzman Thompson road project getting finished in 2022.

Development of these THPRD trails can be hastened by active public support which will bring down transportation costs even further in the future years for BSD and also keep our Findley community intact. Currently many Findley families are willing to donate as much as they can for the development of the sidewalks in the 200m stretch of Laidlaw road to improve walkability for both Findley and JW kids.

Currently several Safe Routes to School (SRTS) workshops are set for the coming months from March 10th onwards as public schools get ready to apply for the \$26 million funding of SRTS program of ODOT. We would be willing to work with BSD to help apply for this grant to improve the 200m stretch on Laidlaw to help all Findley and JW kids.

Currently the designated safe walk paths by BSD through NW Greenwood drive are not completely accurate as some of these paths have steep terrain and not really easy to walk for example neighborhoods like Bannister Creek as mentioned by James Bock, a Findley parent who lives in Bannister Creek in BSD comments section. He is requesting bus service even though BSD has included his community in the walkability maps.

If BSD values transportation costs and does not really care about true walkability then please be fair and allow all of the Findley proximal neighborhoods (at least the ones within the 1.5 mile mark radius around Stoller irrespective of walking paths) to drop their kids in the long congested



car lines at Stoller created by most parents who do not really walk but want to be at Stoller using the walkability map. Do not arbitrarily state BSD designated paths and leave out other proximal communities saying there are no safe paths.

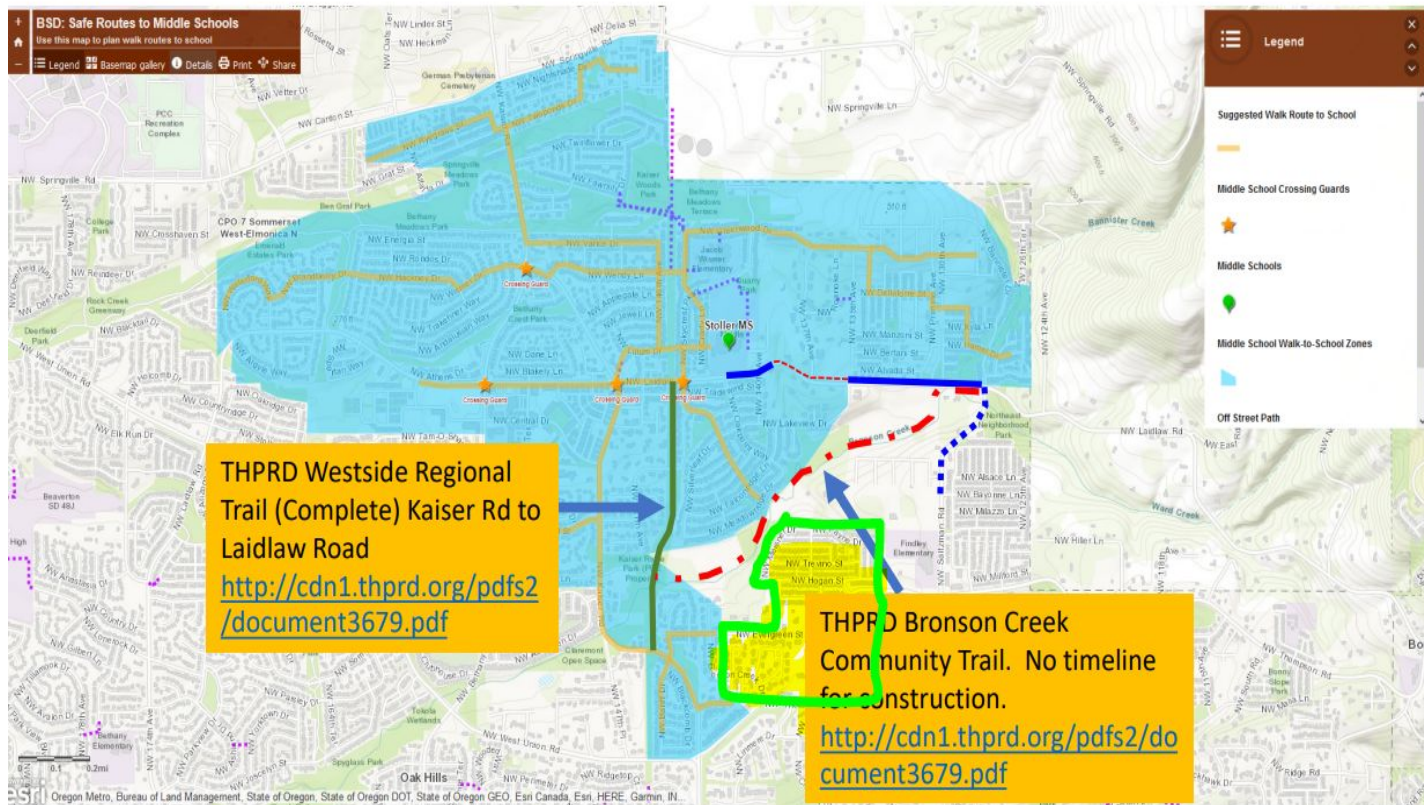
If splitting Findley based on walkability is the only way to help other north Bethany communities then please make sure you are fair to all the bussed Findley kids especially the Summa kids of the bussed portion of Findley. There are almost 78 kids in this group according to the Summa heat map of BSD. This number alone is close to all of the Jacob Wismer Summa students who are getting support from one of the JW-Stoller committee member. These kids belong to the Stoller neighborhood too. If 270 Summa kids are essential to have a 3 tier math program like the one currently at Stoller then splitting Summa would weaken the program.

**We want assurance from BSD that the common middle school experience would be the same for all SUMMA students in all Summa sites as the qualifying criteria is the same for all SUMMA students in the entire district.**

**Do not split Findley three ways by sending walkable to Stoller, bussed to Timberland and the SUMMA bussed kids to another far away Summa location using 2 buses.**

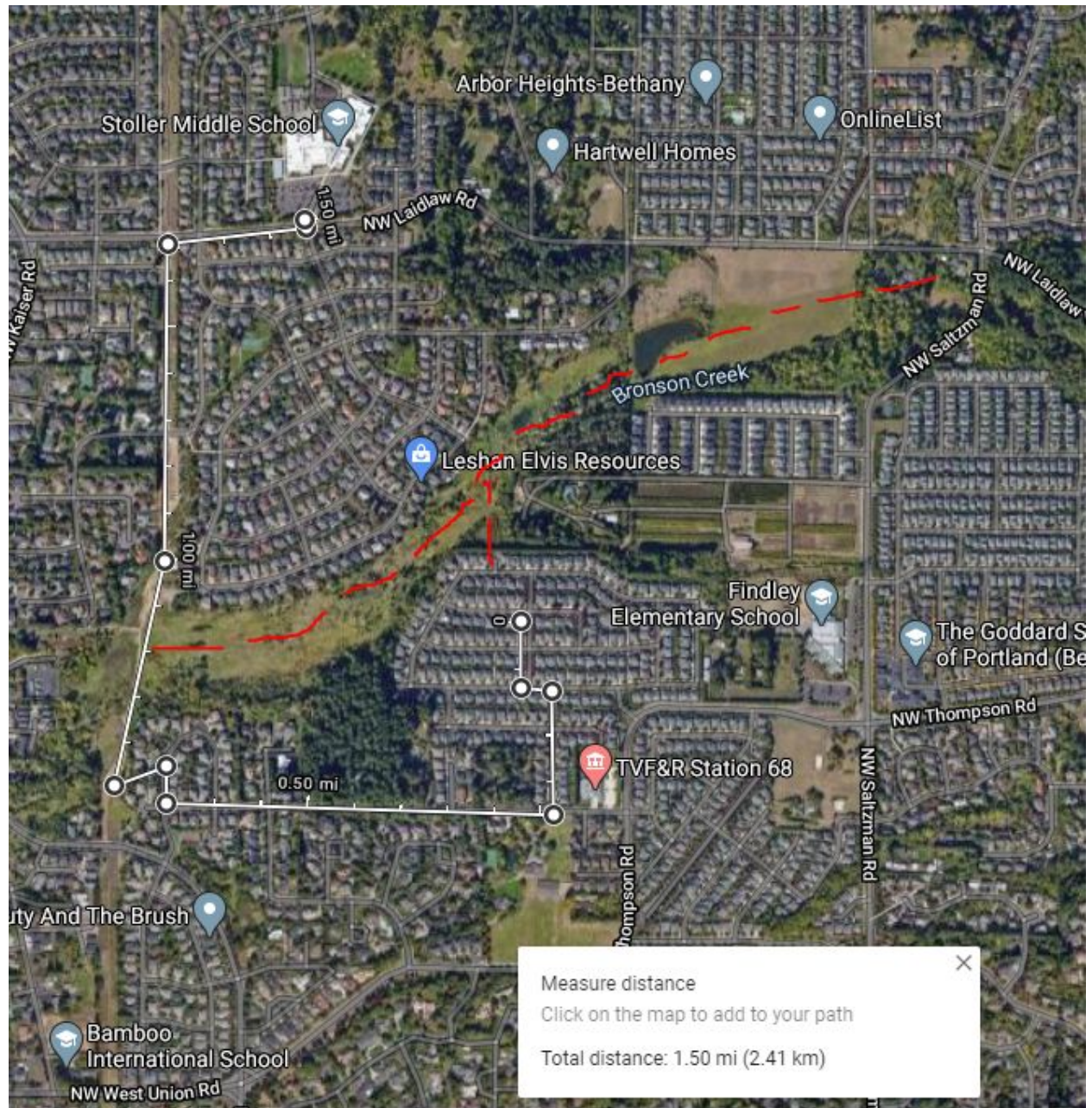
**Keep the SUMMA program intact and strong in one location north of US 26 either at Stoller or Timberland.**

# Walkable areas of Stoller



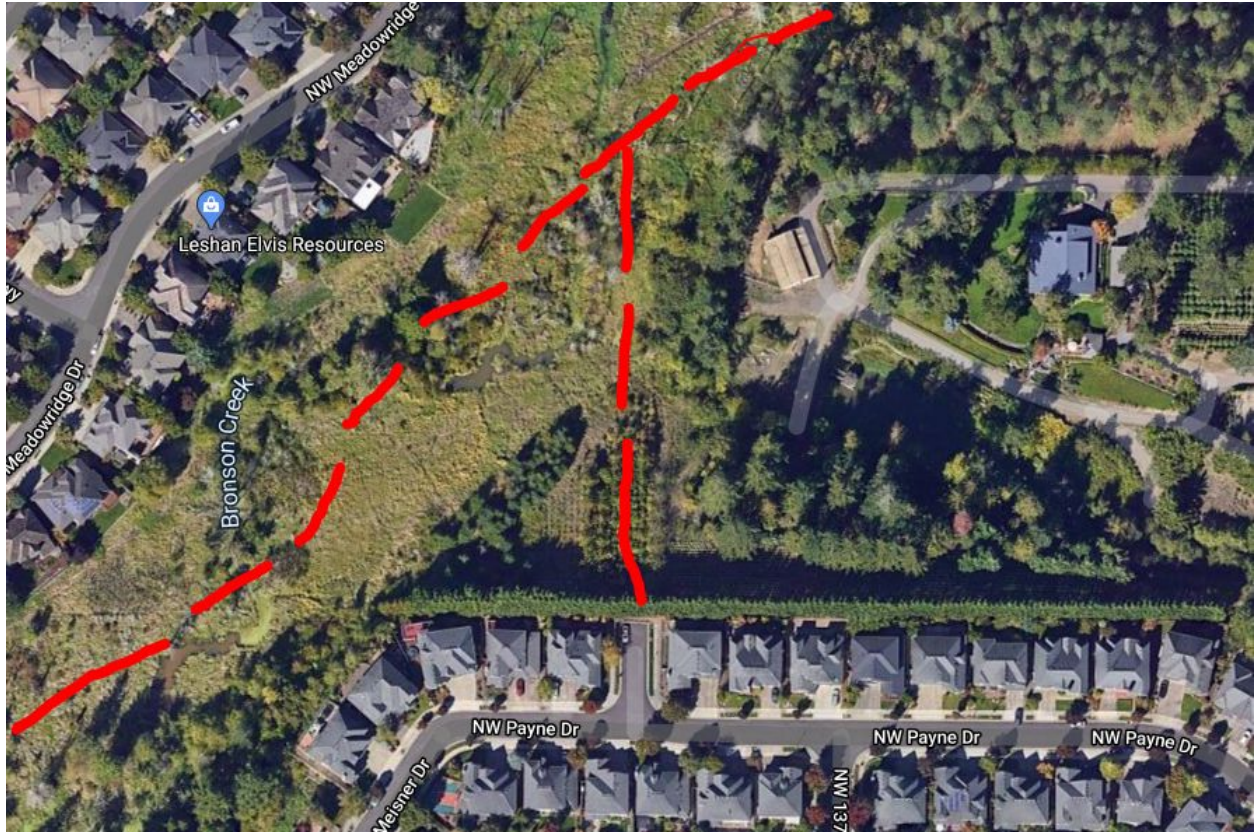

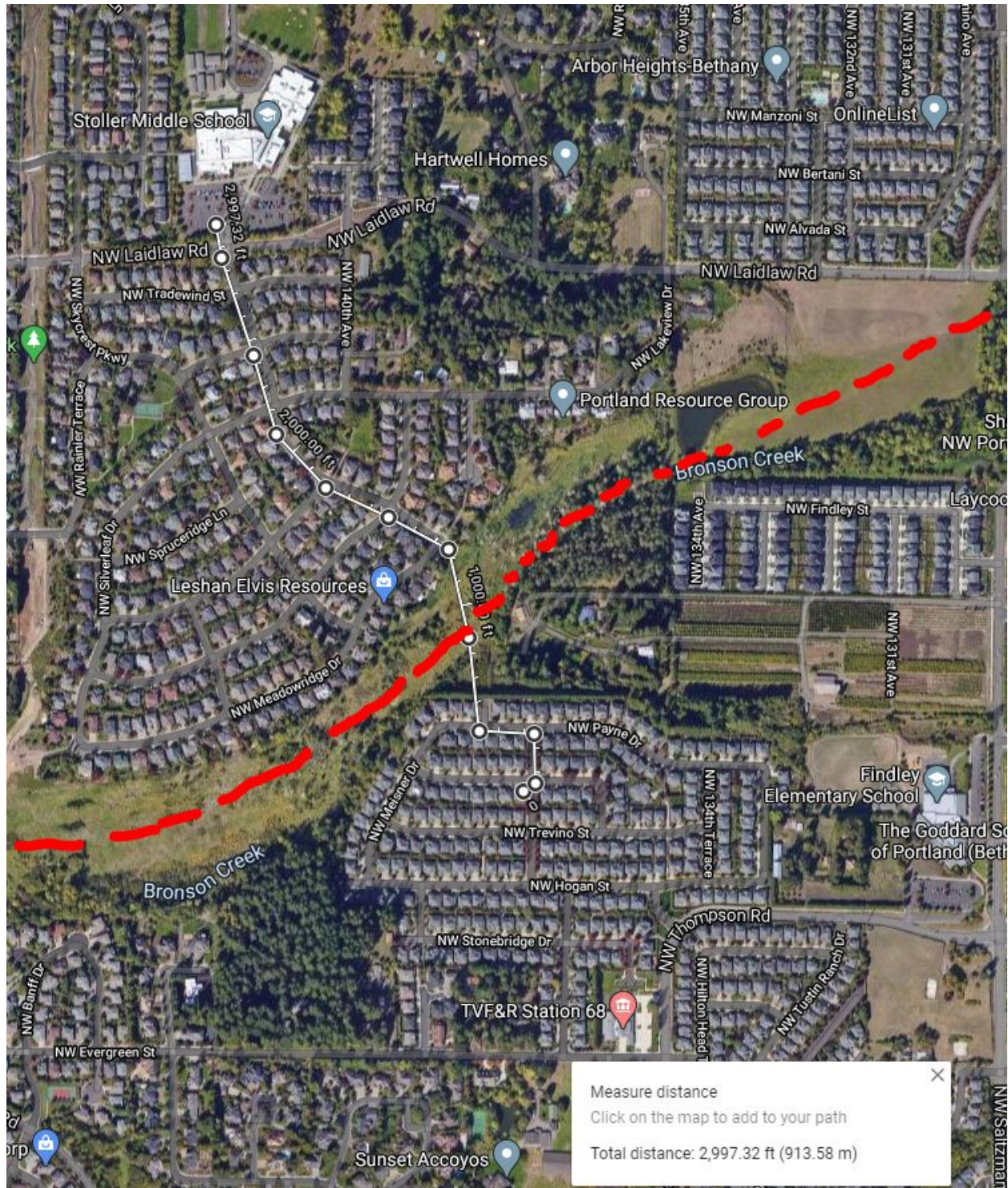
Map 2 - Distance within 1.5 miles of Stoller using measure distance feature on google maps

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Steven, Anne, and Don,

I decided to send this email message to you directly because I'm concerned that it won't actually be heard or acknowledged if I simply post it in the Boundary Committee public comments (which I also did). I want to pose some points to you and hear your responses.

The Superintendent and Middle School Boundary Committee need to make boundary decisions that are fair and in the best interests of ALL students across the district, rather than treating the northern-most schools differently than the rest of the district.

During the 2/13 Middle School Boundaries committee meeting, I was struck by several inconsistencies in how the Committee is thinking about its recommendations, treating students and schools in the northern areas of the district very differently - and preferentially - compared to students and schools in the central and south areas of the district. These include:

1. Committee Priorities: At the meeting outset, Steven Sparks stated the committee's priorities as a) establish new boundaries for the Timberland neighborhood school; b) reduce the number of students at Stoller to approximately 90% of building's permanent capacity; c) balance attendance at other schools; and d) possibly make minor adjustments to other attendance boundaries.

The message this sends to the public is that the Committee cares a lot about students at Timberland and Stoller, and that it cares much less about everyone else. This was borne out in the Committee discussions, which spent a majority of the time discussing issues pertinent to these schools and voicing concerns expressed by parents and communities at these schools. The current maps put the interests of these students at the forefront and do little or nothing to improve conditions for students in the rest of the district. While this attention is consistent with



the stated committee priorities, THESE PRIORITIES ARE NOT FAIR OR EQUITABLE TO THE REST OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT. You should not make recommendations that prioritize and optimize outcomes only for these two schools and ignore, or treat as a third and lesser priority, recommendations that may be in the best interest of the school district as a whole.

For example, the Committee gave almost zero time to discussing how to balance the massive inequities in free and reduced lunch student populations across the district, especially at Mountain View or addressing the imbalance at affluent schools north of 26. The maps under serious consideration now do little if anything to address this serious problem. Where the committee has an opportunity to make improvements on this front, its current path will result in further isolating rather than finding ways to lift the schools and communities in our school district most affected by poverty. This is wrong.

A second example: During the Committee members' final comments at the 2/13 meeting, it became apparent that the committee is not hearing the voices of the Oak Hills community. Some of the final recommendations propose "ending the isolation of Oak Hills" by redrawing high school boundaries to send all its students to Sunset. What the committee persists in not hearing is that the WEST SIDE OAK HILLS AND BETHANY ARE ALL ONE GEOGRAPHIC NEIGHBORHOOD WITH STRONG TIES TO EACH OTHER. You will aggravate "Oak Hills isolation" if you break up this neighborhood by sending our children to different middle schools.

Today this COMBINED community represents a powerhouse in terms of parental, volunteer, and financial support for the schools we attend - Meadow Park and Westview. That is because we are a cohesive neighborhood community that engages neighbors to make a difference in our schools and broader community. Please do not split up this community just because we look like "puzzle pieces" you can easily manipulate to optimize outcomes for Timberland and Stoller. Please listen to the united parental views expressed at the 2/13 meeting and more recently, to split Oak Hills after elementary school rather than middle school, allowing East Side Oak Hills to attend middle school with its Terra Linda neighbors heading to Sunset, and keeping West Side Oak Hills attending middle school with its Bethany neighbors.

A third example: Why are overcrowding issues a point of significant attention for Stoller, but they seem not to be a concern on proposed maps for Meadow Park? These types of inconsistencies are increasingly apparent, at a time when the Committee should be applying a common set of considerations and standards for what is acceptable across all the schools and communities these decisions affect.

2. Transportation. At the meeting we heard one committee member express concern about a map that would bus some Springville students to Five Oaks Middle School, estimating a 20-minute commute each way, and how this would create difficulties for participating in extracurricular activities and other challenges. Why is a 20-minute bus commute a problem for Springville students, but the Committee gave virtually no consideration to the even longer bus commutes happening now for students at other elementary schools? For example: My sons and their Bethany/Oak Hills classmates who attend Meadow Park commute by bus 30-35 minutes each way, and even longer on the frequent days when their bus is running late and they have to wait 10-15 minutes after school for the bus to show up. Commute times affect all students and families across the district. Why does the board not explore these factors and establish a benchmark to help with redrawing middle school boundaries in ways that would be desirable and equitable for ALL STUDENTS across the district?

3. SUMMA. During discussions about the SUMMA program, the program was described as a "neighborhood school program" that ideally would be provided as part of each neighborhood school. This is at the heart of the question about whether to have SUMMA at Stoller AND

Timberland, versus only at Timberland. I want to highlight the double standard apparent in the Committee meeting assumptions here. There was no discussion, and not even a thought, about the fact that SUMMA is not a "neighborhood school program" in the middle schools south of 26. It's a foregone conclusion that it's available only as a magnet type program in those schools. If it's somehow important to preserve SUMMA as a "neighborhood school program" in the schools in the north of the district, why does the Committee not even entertain ideas about how to deliver it as a neighborhood school program in the south? It would be much more equitable to redefine SUMMA as a magnet-type program that fits where it can be accommodated, rather than as an entitlement for neighborhood schools but only in the the more affluent parts of our school district.

The committee has a challenging task here, and I absolutely see that. But in the interests of ALL the families, students, and communities you're supposed to be representing, PLEASE give due consideration to these issues. Thank you.
