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Camp Webb's No-Longer-A-Secret S'mores Bars Recipe



(Yields 12 bars)

1 1/4 cup all-purpose _ _ _ _ _
 3/4 cup graham cracker crumbs
 1/4 tsp. baking _ _ _ _ _
 1/4 tsp. _ _ _ _ _
 1/2 cup butter, softened
 1/2 cup light brown sugar, packed
 1/4 cup granulated sugar
 1 _ _ _ _
 1 tsp. _ _ _ _ _
 4.5 oz. chocolate chips, semi-sweet
 1 small bag _ _ _ _ marshmallows

Directions:

In the bowl of an electric mixer or with a hand mixer, beat butter and sugars until light and fluffy. Add in _ _ _ and _ _ _ _ _ and mix to combine.

In a separate bowl, mix all dry ingredients together. Add dry ingredients to wet and mix just to combine.

Line an 8x8 inch baking dish with parchment paper.

Press mixture down into pan to make a crust. Bake at 350 degrees for 12 minutes or until slightly browned. Let cool slightly, then spread chocolate chips evenly over crust. Spread marshmallows evenly over chocolate and return to the oven for about 5 minutes. Or you can turn on the broiler feature and cook until the marshmallows are just toasted. Let cool before cutting.

- 1 Go to www.campwebb.com. Click on Register Here.

- 3 Create or enter your login and follow the directions on the screen. Make sure to choose your billing preference and e-sign the parental agreement.
- 4 Complete all mandatory forms in Forms and Documents: health history, pick-up authorization and medication policy forms.

AFTER THAT...

You will receive an email confirming receipt of the application, which will provide details about your camper's enrollment status. We will notify you via a separate email if a camp is full. If so, you'll have the option to go on the wait list. In late May, we will email you our *Guide to Camp Webb*, which will have details you'll need to know before camp starts. Finally, on the Friday before each camp begins, you'll receive an additional email with more information specific to that particular camp.

EXTENDED CAMP DAY OPTIONS

Early Care is available each morning, beginning at 7:30, and is free of charge. Campers will need to be dropped off at Webb's Lower School front porch. At Early Care, campers are supervised by our Adventure Camp staff and participate in indoor and outdoor activities until the time arrives to move to their designated camp drop-off areas. At that time, counselors will lead campers to drop-off and connect them with their camp instructors.

Aftercare

Campers who cannot be picked up at the end of their camps may stay for extended supervision for an additional charge. Aftercare is available for Adventure, Sports and Specialty Camp campers. Aftercare is offered on a weekly or daily basis. The hours are from 2:15 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Campers must be entering

kindergarten-8th grade. At Camp Webb's Aftercare, children can form new friendships and strengthen old ones during structured downtime. Aftercare provides a variety of choices for campers during their afternoon time; socializing on the playground, participating in sports activities in the gym or on the basketball courts, or getting creative with various craft projects are some of the many things available to campers.

Aftercare Cost

Daily – \$25 or weekly – \$60 (three days or more). You may sign your camper up for Aftercare at the time of registration or on the day you need it. Location: Haslam Center. Note: We cannot prorate, nor can we give refunds with this program.

Lunch

Tired of getting up every morning and throwing together lunches in a lunchbox? We provide lunch and

it's included in the cost of all camps! Campers and staff cool off together inside and enjoy a nutritious, hot lunch. In addition, we are a "nut-aware" camp and work directly with families when children have specific allergies.

Nurse

A nurse is on site and available every day of the Camp Webb season. Our nurse will call you if your camper comes to visit and requires more than minor medical attention. The nurse is here to dispense medication when required, provide top-level health care if needed and TLC all the time! Our ultimate goal is to be proactive and to practice prevention by safeguarding against accidents and illness as much as possible.

T-Shirt

Each camper will receive one free Camp Webb T-shirt per summer.

REGISTRATION & POLICIES

Online registration for 2020 opens at 12:00 p.m. EST on March 4, 2020 at www.campwebb.com

An initial \$50 deposit is required for each camp and each camper you register. The deposit holds your camper's spot in their desired camp(s), is applied toward your final balance and is nonrefundable. Credit cards are the only method of payment accepted when making your deposit at the time of registration. You will then be offered a choice for how you would prefer to pay the remaining tuition costs.

To pay with credit card:

- Pay in Full
- Standard Payment Plan – Tuition for each week of camp is due two weeks prior to your camp date. You may choose to pay in advance through your camp account or we will bill your card automatically for the balance due.
- Installment Payment Plan – 3 equal payments – more details can be found on our website.

(If your check is returned for insufficient funds, we will charge you the fee that the bank charges us. In this case, all future payments will be required in cash.)

CHANGE & CANCELLATION POLICIES

- Any changes to a camper's schedule must be made in writing by sending us an email. No phone calls please.
- A change is defined as switching to another camp within the same week or to a different week of camp.
- If a change is requested between ten (10) and five (5) working days before the first day of the camp, there is a \$25 change fee.
- A change made within five (5) working days of the first day of the camp will incur a \$50 fee. Please refer to the Fee/Date Schedule. There are no exceptions.

CANCELLATION/REFUND POLICY

Amount of refund is determined by means and timing of notification.

Means: Requests to cancel a camp must be made in writing. Notify us of a camp cancellation by sending an email. No phone calls or voicemails. We must have a record of the date and time of the request, and e-mail provides this data. Notification Email: campwebb@webbschool.org.

Timing: No refunds will be given, nor will the deposit be transferable, if the request to cancel is received after the cut-off date and/or in a phone call or voicemail. Please refer to the Fee/Date Schedule for specific dates.

If cancellations are made before the cut-off date and in writing, families have 2 options:

Option A: Add another week of camp and don't lose your deposit! The required deposit may transfer if another session is added to a camper within the family, but it can never be applied to a family balance.

Option B: Get a partial refund. A partial refund equal to the cost of the camp minus the \$50 nonrefundable deposit will be issued. The required deposit still may not be applied to a family balance.

In order to be fair to all camp families, there are no exceptions to this policy. This is for any reason, including vacation plan changes, sickness or injury. If Camp Webb must cancel a camp for any reason, applicants will receive a full refund. There are no refunds for Aftercare, as refunds hinder our ability to staff this service.

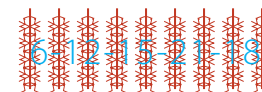

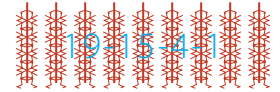

CAMP WONDEROO

Camp Wonderoo is the perfect way to introduce your child to the day camp experience and offers a whole slew of things for your **4-year-old** to do! We limit enrollment so that we meet a 1:5 counselor-to-camper ratio.

The “Wonderoo Crew” includes Webb Lower School faculty, local teachers and mature, college-age students. So pack your bags, put on your cape, and off we go for an adventure-filled week of wonder and whooping it up, Camp Webb style!

TO BE A WONDEROO: Campers must be four years old by the beginning of their camp week. They should not be entering kindergarten.

All children must be fully toilet trained. We realize that accidents do occur, and we are prepared to respond in a compassionate and reassuring manner. However, if these accidents occur more than once a week, the child will not be able to continue to attend camp.

A WONDEROO EXPLORER BACKPACK SHOULD BE FILLED WITH: swimsuit, water bottle, sunscreen, towel, water shoes (not flip-flops), naptime friend, and a change of clothes. (All items should be labeled!)

How it works: Boys and girls, entering kindergarten through 7th grade, are put into groups according to the grade they will be in for the upcoming school year. These groups rotate through a variety of activities during the day.



WHAT WE DO FOR FUN

ROPES COURSE

Our state-of-the-art ropes course provides low and high rope challenges in a beautiful, wooded setting. Campers of all ages can take on the “Vertical Playpen,” the climbing wall and swing on our giant “Swingshot” while building their teamwork skills and confidence.

NATURE DISCOVERY

Campers explore the local ecology through crafts, hikes, turtles, frogs, bugs, and slugs.

ARCHERY

There’s nothing like hitting the ol’ bullseye! Our instructor teaches both beginners and more experienced archers the safety and art of archery.

ARTS & CRAFTS

Creative expression in our fully-equipped art studio is a great way to cool off during an action-packed day. Led by our arts and crafts counselor, campers make everything from melted crayon paintings to footprint fish.

DRAMA

Under the direction of our experienced drama counselor, campers learn and enjoy improvisation, theater games, storytelling, and skit production for older groups.

SPORTS & GAMES

Campers find it irresistible to run around and be part of a team. Here they can participate in basketball, soccer, tennis, Capture the Flag, or goal-oriented group challenges. Games and activities are age-appropriate, of course.

SWIMMING

You can’t have summer without cooling off in the pool! Your child is briefly evaluated and then can enjoy recreational swimming time.

KID’S CHOICE (Electives)

Campers choose from a number of activities such as Scatter Ball (a Camp Webb original), parachute games or jewelry making. Activities vary week-to-week according to the theme.

The Adventure Camp Staff

A program is only as good as its people.



When parents enroll their child in Camp Webb, they are entrusting us with their most prized possession. We at Camp Webb take that responsibility very seriously by hiring the best people we can find.

Counselors are chosen based on their maturity, ability to be positive role models, experience with children, and level of enthusiasm. It is essential that the camp counselors we hire understand the important balance between creating a super-fun experience for our campers and keeping them safe. Our senior counselors must be at least 18 years of age and have passed a screening and interview process. We limit our Adventure Camp enrollment to an overall 1:4 staff-to-camper ratio.

All staff members at Camp Webb participate in orientation and training programs prior to the arrival of the campers. Training covers (among many other topics): child development, professionalism, risk management/medical, "why we are doing this" and Camp Webb's culture, activity leadership, group and behavior management, the organization and logistics of our program, and creating fun.

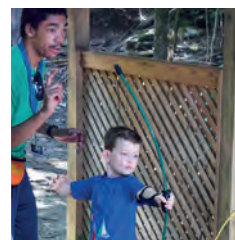

Counselor-In-Training (CIT) Program

Many of our older Adventure Camp campers look up to our senior staff and are interested in training to become leaders/counselors at Camp Webb. The summer after their 7th-grade year, campers may apply for the Counselor-In-Training (CIT) Program. If accepted, a CIT will train for one or two weeks with a camper group. Counselors-In-Training assist senior counselors in the guidance of a group or the management of an activity. This is an opportunity to develop independence, learn responsibility for others and practice strong leadership skills. After successfully completing the program, they'll be ready to assume additional responsibilities as Junior Counselors the following year.

A CIT's role is that of an assistant; you are not directly responsible for the safety of campers, but it is your responsibility to assist in the prevention of unsafe situations through your leadership and involvement in the activities. Before you apply, please know that using your cell phone while supervising campers is not allowed. You should also be dressed appropriately to mentor and lead young children.

Our CITs are not campers, nor are they counselors; they are in an in-between stage. This means that the camp staff are still supervising CITs in addition to training them. As a result, there is a charge for this opportunity (\$130 per week), except for Mini Week which will be \$105 for the week.

The CIT application process begins at the same time as camper registration. The following two steps are required:

- 1) Parents will need to complete a Camper Application for all the desired CIT weeks of the summer.
- 2) The potential CIT will then need to complete the "CIT Overview and Application" that is located in the "Forms and Documents" section. Please allow your camper to complete this part on their own and treat it as an online assignment. Counselors-In-Training work a maximum of two weeks (but may apply for more). Junior Counselors may work up to four weeks. In May, you will receive a response to your application via email.

Most Sports Camps run from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Campers who cannot be picked up by 2:15 p.m. may transfer to our fun Aftercare program.
