Keri Marquand, our Director of Student Support Services, recently made the following comments in a meeting:

When I am in a conversation with staff members about a student who academically answers a question or problem incorrectly I find myself intensely curious as to why the child has made this error. If I can find and understand the "why" then I just might be able to better support the child's learning.

However, when a student makes inappropriate behavioral choices, I discovered I didn't ask myself the same questions of curiosity.

When I discovered this, I made it a goal to become intensely curious as to why a child has made inappropriate behavioral choices for the purpose of better supporting the student.

I found myself pausing and reflecting about this line of thinking. I believe there is power in pondering about the why when supporting our students. One of our four strategic plan goals is building a tiered system of support for our students in the areas of academics, behavior and attendance. **Being intensely curious in getting to the why** will be an essential component of building this tiered system.
