This map keeps communities intact and makes it possible to reach both objectives easily. --- Ideally, I would love to remedy the poor feeder pattern for Oak Hills. I believe the best solution for this would be to move the Spanish immersion program and the Beaverton Barnes students to Cedar Park. With this program at Meadow Park, Sunset Barnes students do not interact much with Sunset Oak Hills students, so the two Sunset factions there are essentially isolated. Moving the immersion program would allow these students to share classes and make friendships. I would also like to see all of Oak Hills made a Sunset-feeding school to help with this issue and decrease Westview overcrowding. --- I understand that JW is concerned about their own Sunset feeding pattern. Luckily for them, the majority of their students feed Sunset. They have hundreds more Sunset students than Oak Hills and the non-SUMMA students in Stoller will rejoin their SUMMA elementary friends in Sunset in high school. JW students will have plenty of familiar faces in Sunset, but Oak Hills does not. Additionally, Stoller MS could help mediate the JW feeder issues thanks to their hallway/neighborhood set up. With 4 halls, two could be made 100% Westview feeders and the other could be roughly 50:50 Westview:Sunset to negate any issues from boundary adjustments. For example: My daughter currently belongs to the 6th grade Summa Orange Hall at Stoller, however her needs place her at 7/8 grade Math, Science and English. The program is radically unlike other Option schools such as ACMA, where the main focus is on Arts and Communication or Rachel Carson where the focus is on Environmental Science etc. Teachers in all elementary schools are trained to identify such students with differing needs early. No single test, measure or score is to be the sole criterion for the identification of these students. The school collects behavioral, learning and/or performance information and includes this information in all procedures for the identification of students. Plus, the BSD webpage specifies that schools shall make efforts to identify students from ethnic minorities, students with disabilities and students who are culturally different or economically disadvantaged.[https://www.beaverton.k12.or.us/about-us/school-board/policies-and-regulations/section-i-instruction/igbb-talented-and-gifted-program-and-services] It[?]s a neighborhood school program, which should absolutely exist in as many schools as can be, to serve those children with unique educational needs. I understand that BSD probably can[?]t afford to maintain it in all schools and that not all schools may have high number of students to take full advantage of the program. However, there is an absolute need for this program at schools where surrounding neighborhoods encompass high numbers of TAG identified students. But, if a high number of students feed into one centrally located middle school, it MAKES TOTAL SENSE to keep it in that school.It[?]s meant to be in neighborhood schools because this program is not just for Summa qualified students but also who show their talents in any one subject. For example: My friend[?]s daughter who was TAG-identified only in Math, attended only Summa math and took the rest of the subjects with Non-Summa kids. In Stoller there are a lot of kids like that in addition to Summa kids. If Summa is moved out of Stoller, then what is BSD[?]s plan for TAG-in-any-one-subject-identified kids?Will they also be bussed to another school to attend one subject, or will more teachers be hired to provide specialized instruction. Either way, the quality of the TAG program and the school's instruction will be impacted. Not to mention that these kids will be disadvantaged, for even though they are talented, they will have to forego an opportunity to interact with other peers in a challenging environment, leading to a failure of school district. The neighborhoods served by Oak Hills (West side) and Bethany are a cohesive and highly interconnected community, joined geographically with a common green space/trail system and also joined through sports programs, cultural and community organizations. Similarly, the Terra Linda and Oak Hills (East side) share similar, common associations. The committee should preserve these essential community alignments with the Middle School Boundary recommendations. By taking this step, the committee will address problems with students experiencing isolation and related disadvantages as they move from middle school to high school. Also, the committee should recognize that these pre-existing community affiliations form the backbone of the strong parental and neighborly networks that provide volunteers, community, and financial support for the BSD schools our children attend. To fulfill the committee's objective #4 (improve the alignment of attendance boundaries between all school levels), we ask you to strengthen the middle school to high school feeder path for Oak Hills students, and to do this with the middle school boundary recommendations described above. Currently, just 20 Oak Hills students start at Sunset High School each year in a school population of 2000. These students typically recognize just 1% of the student body, creating a difficulty and disadvantages for these students when they do not have the opportunity to form broader social connections that are an important part of the high school experience. This defies logic given these are the two largest potential Stoller communities with the fastest growth in the future. As the data put forth by the district has shown, there is NO combination of both intact elementary attendance areas feeding into Stoller that allows for any hope of meeting this 90% target. The February 25 AC document references that the possible solution for this perennial overcrowding is to move the Stoller SUMMA program out of Stoller to Timberland. Instead of identifying part of SPV (or all of SPV) and sending it to Five Oaks, the committee seems to feel busing fully 52% of the ENTIRE district[?]s SUMMA students from their neighborhood SUMMA program down to Timberland is the answer. I am glad that you have finally heard our concerns with a working map that keeps communities together.This map shows Stoller overcrowding reduced and Timberland filled. It clearly shows that Summa needs to be moved to a school that has space, in this case, Timberland. This will fill the new 61 million dollar school, which is one of the main reasons we are re-adjusting boundaries in the first place. Findley will also be also kept ALL together as a community in a school that is still within proximity in their neighborhood.Regular middle schoolers must be prioritized over OPTIONS programs. 86 JW Summa kids (23% of JW) who chose to be in SUMMA can't be prioritized over 100% of Springville Elementary School kids. The Summa program demographic also changes and will not be forever just at the Stoller walkable zone or exclusively fed by JW students.As for the 2025 numbers, do keep in mind that these are merely projections and estimates. Do not sacrifice our children's well-being and community relationships over "what ifs" and empty lots. Springville is already built out and established community with no new developments. Do remember that BSD also tend to overproject enrollment rates, as evidenced by the recent over projection that caused the budget deficit. As a Springville Parent of a 4th grader and 6th grader, our family is directly affected by your decisions. 10 years ago, we specifically moved into the Arbor Oaks neighborhood because of the Springville K-8 EL model. My oldest daughter is thriving in the program as a 6th grader at Springville., and both my girls have had excellent experiences at our neighborhood school. Our family enjoys all that Bethany has to offer: the walking trails through the Parks, Bethany Village, and Springville School events. We have truly felt a sense of belonging in this culturally and economically diverse community of Springville and the larger North Bethany area. We were sad to hear that the district had decided (rather abruptly and with no community input) that they were ending the Middle School option at Springville. My 4th grader, in particular was devastated to learn that she would not be able to join her sister when the time came. But we accepted the district's decision because we knew that Stoller was also an excellent option for her as our NEIGHBORHOOD school.Thus it was with dismay that we found out that there was a movement to displace the Springville Community out of our neighborhood school Stoller. For the reasons listed below, Springville needs to stay with Stoller as our Middle School.1. As the Northern-most school in the district, Stoller is our closest and only Middle School option. All other schools are too far away to even be considered. The maps that have us going to Five Oaks would ship a large group of kids all the way from their own neighborhood to a school that is 4.5 to 5.5 miles away, through several busy, congested intersections, strip malls, high schools, and several other elementary schools that are MUCH closer to Five Oaks. 2. Taking us out of our North Bethany neighborhood would destroy the bonds that we've built for the past decade. My kids were born here and have grown up here. Bethany is like a small town, where everybody knows each other through school, sports, and extra-curricular activities. You would literally be tearing them away from their community and shipping them to one in which they have no connections to, and which would be very hard for them to form a connection as all their activities are centered in the Bethany area.3. Some have argued that the commute time is only 5 minutes longer on the bus to Five Oaks versus Stoller, and is using the Bus Test Data to push the agenda that the commute is not a hardship for Springville Kids. I have looked at the data and videos and have found it to be hopelessly flawed and its conclusions dubious at best. 30 seconds stops to load and unload kids? Is that even possible? Others have commented here on the flaws of the bus test studies. Either re-do them with basic and real-life assumptions or scrap them altogether. However long the commute time, you are still bussing kids away from their own community and isolating them from their North Bethany neighbors.4. Keeping Springville together in Middle School is so important for the health and welfare of our kids. Please do not split our kids up to artificially inject diversity in any particular school. Studies have consistently shown that minimizing transitions results in better academic performance and emotional health for children. We are strongly supportive of the current Feb 25th working map which does not introduce any additional ES splits.Do not divide communities. Springville cannot be separated from its eastern neighbors, Sato, whom they are closely intertwined with. Rock Creek is naturally tied to Springville and Bethany; it should not be removed from both. 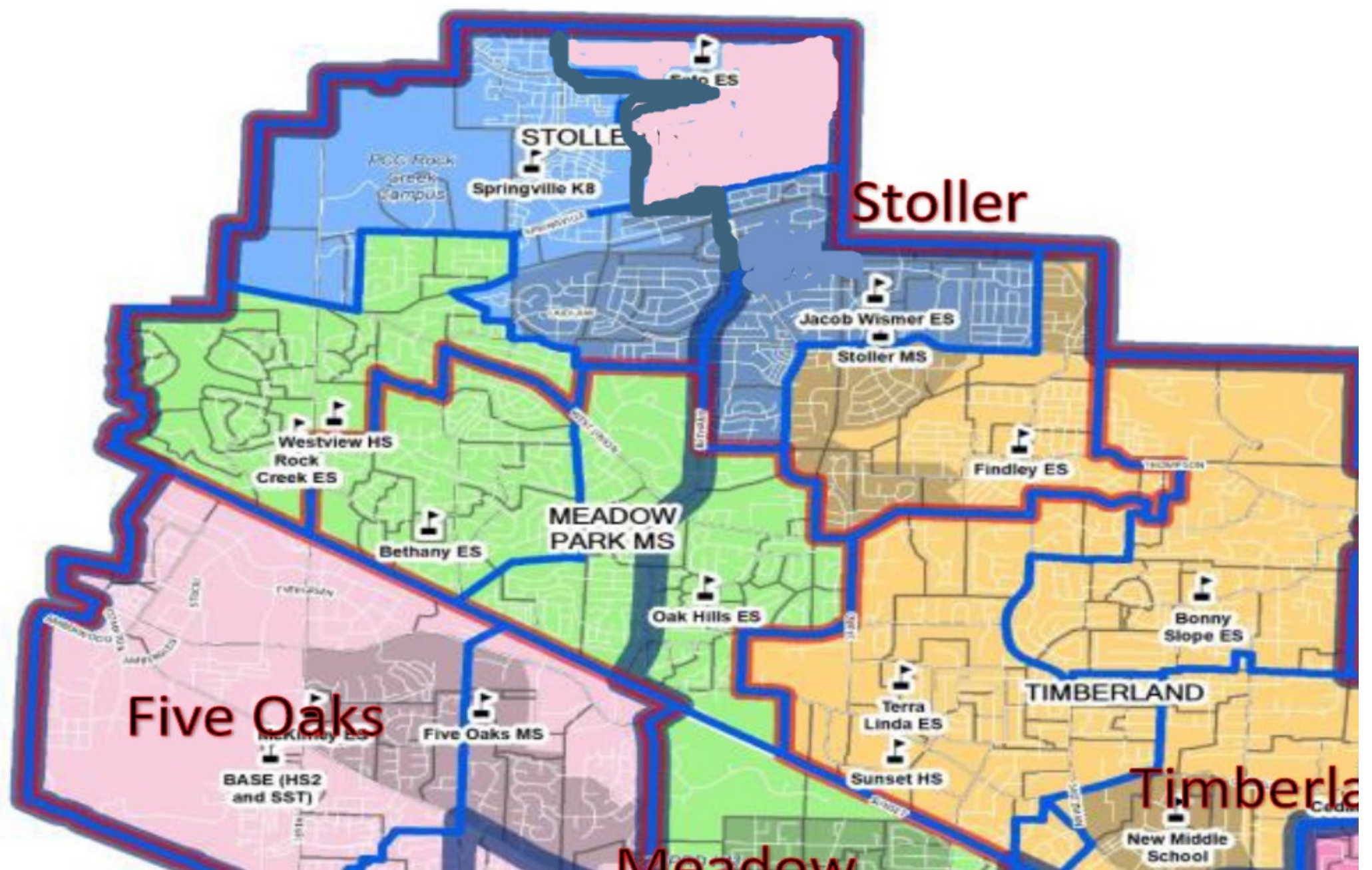

Mr. Sparks,

I currently have a daughter in 2nd grade at Findley ES and my son is entering Kindergarten at Findley next year. Like many, I am very concerned with the pending MS Boundary changes being discussed. My family lives in the Bannister Creek subdivision (Laidlaw and Saltzman are the cross streets as you enter the neighborhood).

Our primary school concern is the potential splitting of students from Findley ES when they move on to MS. Making the transition from ES to any MS is already very hard on young students from an emotional and social standpoint. Findley ES is a very tight knit community that we want to continue to grow with. If Findley is split and our Bannister Creek neighborhood is among those moving on to Stoller, then our children would have to endure a second split from their peers when they move up to HS (Stoller splits to Sunset/Westview). With Stoller already facing overcrowding, keeping the Findley students together can help ease the crowding issue while also keeping the Findley community intact. Perhaps more importantly, it protects the Findley students from additional emotional and social stress as they graduate to MS (and for our family, a second time when they go to HS).

Secondly, I have seen potential map changes that indicate the Bannister Creek neighborhood would be split to Stoller and our neighborhood would be deemed a "walkable" neighborhood without bus service. We currently utilize the bus service to Findley from our neighborhood which is actually closer in proximity than Stoller. We are not the only family. The bus from our neighborhood to Findley is very full and would continue to be highly utilized as these children go on to MS. There is not a safe walking path from our neighborhood to Stoller.

In conclusion, please do not consider an option that splits Findley MS. Most importantly, we must protect the children from the social/emotional impact that the split would have. Secondly, our neighborhood would be left without bus service which is highly utilized within our neighborhood. While keeping Findley together will help from these standpoints, it will also help to alleviate the overcrowding at Stoller MS. Keeping Findley together is a step in the right direction to lower the enrollment at Stoller, which is why the boundary changes are being discussed in the first place.

Dear Advisory Committee,

Thank you for volunteering on such an important committee for our community. Respectfully the proposed map still requires more work and so below are comments to move us closer to a workable solution.

a. Our goal is to improve the school feeder pattern for Oak Hills Elementary by designating another Sunset bound feeder school at Meadow Park. Barnes is a dual language OPTION SCHOOL and should be regarded as such. Barnes students will attend Beaverton HS to continue dual language learning, which is what they agreed to through 12th grade when they enrolled. Adding a small part of Barnes as another Sunset-bound school at Meadow Park is a flawed plan because those kids are unlikely to attend Sunset HS. In addition, Barnes students due to the dual language option, will only have one 1 out of 3 core classes with the mainstream kids, therefore, not allowing them to assimilate with other Sunset bound students.

b. Meadow Park said that only 13 Oak Hills-Sunset bound students will go to Sunset HS this Fall. 13 in a school of 2,141. The current map does not create a reasonable feeder plan for the Sunset bound Oak Hills students. Meadow Park currently feeds 3 high schools unnecessarily. Move the Sunset bound Oak Hills students to Timberland and propose expanding the Barnes HS boundary to Beaverton HS where there is a dual language program.

c. The current map still fails to achieve balanced capacity across schools. Timberland remains under-utilized at 88% and Meadow Park over-utilized at 107%. Moving Oak Hills-Sunset bound kids to Timberland, helps support both objectives and improves the overall map.

d. Shifting Oak Hills-Sunset bound kids from Meadow Park to Timberland is cost neutral for busing because it is already built into the budget with similar mileage.

e. And finally, moving Oak Hills-Sunset bound students to Timberland will reduce the isolation and depression that the proposed map will continue to perpetuate for Oak Hills-Sunset bound students. Avoid sending more kids into this isolation trap.

I am concerned that the proposed boundary changes affecting students in the Oak Hills community through middle school and high school do not address the legitimate concerns of parents about the isolation of some students from their peer group and school friendship bonds if some Oak Hills students (currently only 20 students each year) are sent to a middle school feeding students to Sunset High School while the remainder of students are sent to a middle school with a path to two different high schools. I recommend that the District strengthen the middle school to high school feeder path for Oak Hill students. Send Oak Hills (East) students to Timberland with Terra Linda and Oak Hills (West) to Meadow Park with Bethany. Please support the Oak Hills community agreement to an East/West split at middle school to ensure students continue onto high school with a sizable peer group. We represent over 200 families across Sato, Rock Creek, Springville & Findley Elementary schools. Our members are from walking and non-walking areas of Stoller. **This note is in support of the latest Feb 25th working map.** We have come together as a community to advocate for each other in support of a solution that will not isolate or marginalize any of our schools. We understand the various tradeoffs between walkability, split feeders, equity, proximity and community. We support the Feb 25th working map as the best balance across these vectors and ask that it be recommended and the progress that has been made so far, be taken forward:

Do not split elementary schools. Springville, Sato, Findley, Rock Creek and Oak Hills have all been shown split in various maps proposed by the committee or BSD. Studies have consistently shown that minimizing transitions results in better academic performance and emotional health for children. We are strongly supportive of the current Feb 25th working map which does not introduce any additional ES splits.

Do not divide communities. Springville cannot be separated from its eastern neighbors, Sato, whom they are closely intertwined with. Rock Creek is naturally tied to Springville and Bethany; it should not be removed from both. If any portion of Rock Creek is removed from Springville, it should be placed with Bethany. West Oak Hills is part of the Bethany Elementary community and should remain so. East Oak hills is part of the Terra Linda community and should remain so. We should also not use uncertain 2025 projections to divide existing communities especially when populations decline after 2025.

Summa should not split communities. The Summa program should go where the highest concentration of feeding school kids go, in order to minimize splits. We across these four schools agree that the entire North Summa program should go to Timberland with Findley who constitute ~40% of Summa students in Stoller.

We realize that this map isn't perfect, but nothing ever is, and this is the most balanced path going forward with broad support across a large group of northern families. We realize that there are still some issues with high-school feeder patterns for Oak Hills and Jacob Wismer and hope the committee will also look at ways to address those issues. We also support our neighbors in Barnes to not be the only Beaverton or Sunset feeding school at Meadow Park. We understand that all of us have to sacrifice something for the greater good. But, in balance, this map provides the most optimal path forward, given all the difficult constraints. We all hope that the committee and the superintendent will move forward with the Feb 25th workmap with minimal changes.

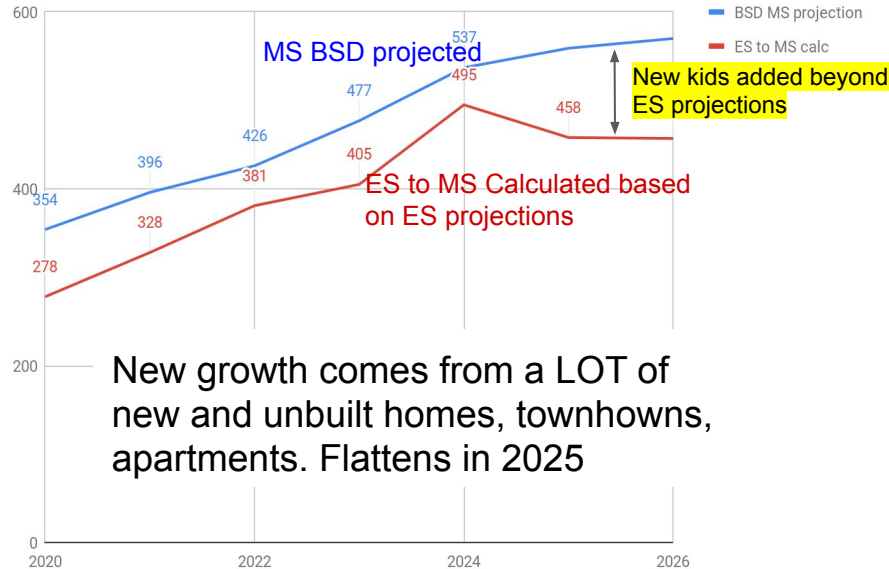

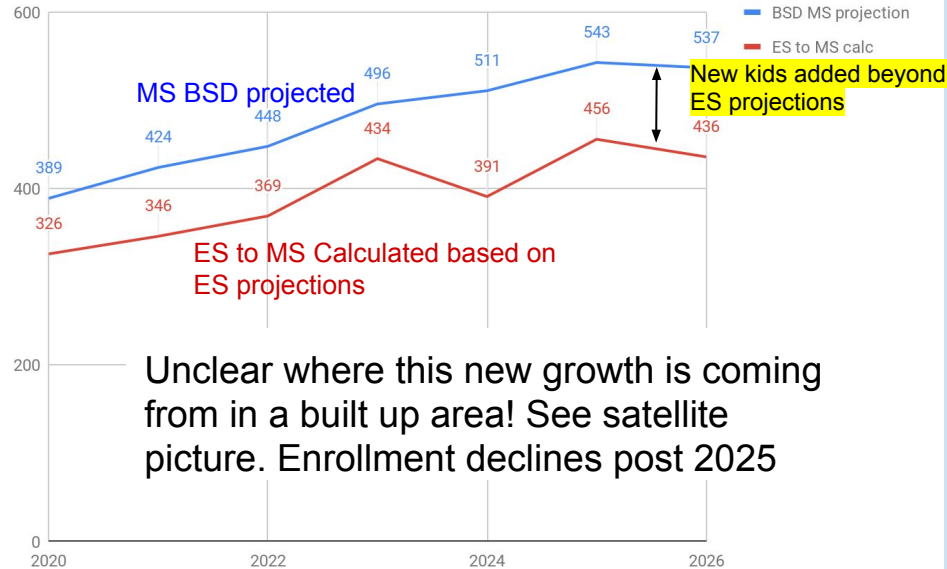

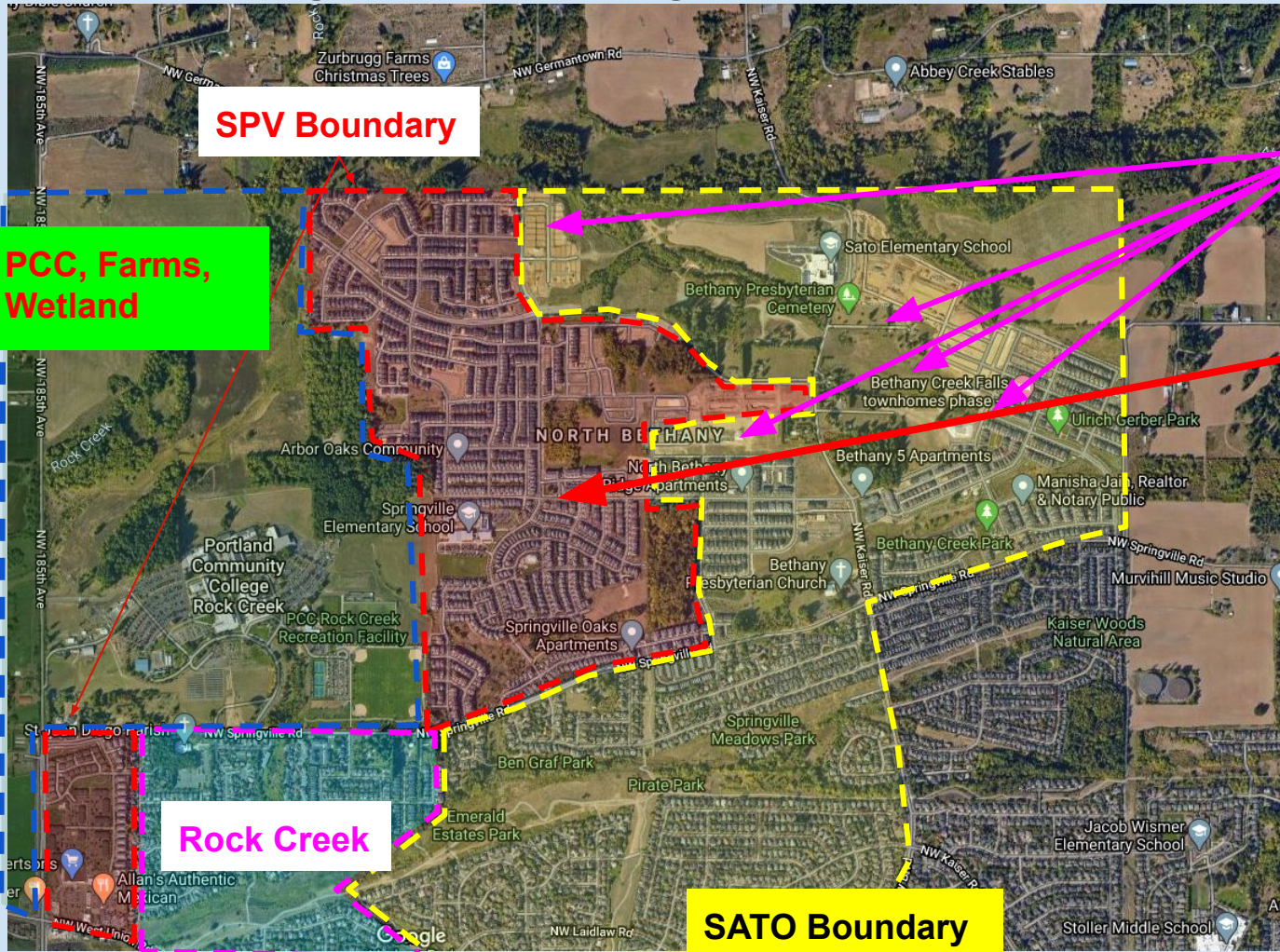

ES to MS calculated value takes previous year projections or actuals where available for 3rd, 4th and 5th graders from the previous 3 consecutive years, and adds them up. The difference is the expected additional growth beyond what is already comprehended in the ES projections

Summary

- The projections show an inexplicable influx of Springville kids into Middle School
 - **Even higher than Sato**, which is the growing neighborhood.
 - Not explainable based on construction in the satellite pictures
 - BSD projections are also much higher than the PSU projections
- Long term forecasts are hard, and have lots of error bars:
 - BSD had budget shortfalls in 2018-19 driven by enrollment overprojection
- Even with this, the Feb 25 workmap is well under total capacity for Stoller, and is likely much lower than that - And flattens/declines after 25
