Question of: Threats to International Peace and Development caused by Terrorist Groups

THE SECURITY COUNCIL,

Aware of the fact that terrorist organizations are constantly growing in population and are increasing their income through several illegal acts,

Recognizing that IAEA (International Atomic Energy Agency) have helped increase security through providing training to over 10,000 individuals and upgrading the physical protection at different sites in over 30 states,

Recalling the statement of the Secretary General on the importance of eliminating terrorism,
