

Step 1 SPEND PLAN

The District **fee schedule must include a spend plan** that lists the anticipated types of expenditures for each fee that the District charges. A spend plan provides student, parents, and employees transparency by identifying a fee's funding uses. These expenditures can be for the current fiscal year or be carryover for use in a future fiscal year. (UAC R277-407-13)

Step 2 MAXIMUM FEE AMOUNT

The District shall **establish a maximum fee amount per student for each activity**. A fee related to a co-curricular or extracurricular activity may not exceed the maximum fee amounts for the co-curricular or extracurricular activity adopted by the local school board. (UCA R277-407-6(4)(b)(i))

Step 3 MAXIMUM TOTAL AGGREGATE FEE AMOUNT

The District shall establish a **total aggregate fee amount per student per school year**. The District may establish a reasonable number of activities, courses, or programs that will be covered by the annual maximum fee amount. (UAC R277-407-6(4)(b)(ii) and (e))

Step 4 SCHOOL FEE SCHEDULE APPROVAL

Fee schedules and policies for the District shall be adopted **on or before April 1** of each year in a regularly scheduled public meeting of the Board. Before approving the District's fee schedule, the District shall provide an opportunity for the public to comment on the proposed fee schedule during a minimum of two public meetings of the Board and provide public notice of such meetings. (UAC R277-407-6(2))
