Great things continue to occur at Lincoln School. I really appreciate how you, the Lincoln parents, have stepped up to support our school and community programs. Please look at the events coming up at Lincoln.

BEAR SCARE RUN/WALK – Saturday, October 26th (9:00a.m. Registration, 10:00a.m. Run/Walk)

- The PTA is working together with the Otter Lake PTA and Bear Power to promote our fifth annual Bear Scare Fun Run and Walk on Saturday, October 26th. The event will begin at Otter Lake with check in beginning at 9:00a.m. and the run/walk beginning at 10:00a.m.
- All ghosts and ghouls can come in costume for the race with a costume contest before the race begins. Also, there will be three routes. A Freaky Four Miler going to Lincoln and back from Otter, the Terrifying Two Miler and the shorter 1/2 mile Skeleton Skip that will stay on Otter Lake's School Grounds.
