

## Course Requirements for the Global Concentration

In addition to consistent engagement, three years of language study, participation in the cohort, experiential interaction, and the capstone project, students must also take courses which qualify for concentration credit. Students will be guided through this process by the Director of the Global Concentration, their advisor, and college counselor.

### 2020-21 Courses for the Global Concentration

*Students must take the Global Concentration Cohort for all four semesters of the program. It must be taken as a 6<sup>th</sup> course and may be taken as a 7<sup>th</sup> course.*

*During the program, eight semesters of coursework from the classes listed below are also required.*

*This is in addition to the three years (six semesters) of language study.*

*Courses should be from **three different departments**.*

*This list will be reviewed annually.*
