








WHY SHOULD I GO TO COLLEGE?

- High school students with permission from parents and school can take advantage of our concurrent enrollment









WHAT YOU NEED TO TRANSFER

- Units 60 semester/90 quarter transferable consisting of LOWER DIVISION classes
 - ➤GE + Lower Division Major Prep = Transfer
- GPA
 - > CSU: 2.0 +
 - > UC: 3.0 +

NOTE: These are MINIMUM GPA requirements for eligibility.

The key to acceptance into the university of choice is a **COMPETETIVE GPA**.

- Degrees With A Guarantee!
 - Associate Degree for Transfer (AAT/AST) = CSU System
 - ➤ TAAs/TAGs with UC System


Types of Financial Aid

Gift Aid

- Grants: Free money!
- Scholarships: Free money!

Self-help Aid

- Work-study: Part-time job
- Loans: Must be paid back



Financial Aid is any money given, paid or loaned to help pay for education.

Students receive federal financial aid for a maximum of 6 years. This is why AB705 is such an important bill

PROMISE PROGRAMS

CA Promise Grant (formerly known has BOGFW)
Students should submit their FAFSA or Cal Dream Act

- Waives enrollment fees
- Income eligibility requirements



College-Specific Promise Programs

- 2 year program, which has a "CA Promise Gant," eligibility requirement attached to it.
- Enrollment fees covered through the fee waiver program
- All other fees are also covered, including books and supplies.
- Additional support services

Two Year Promise Program

- New students who are recently graduated and ineligible for the CA Promise Grant
- Enrollment fees waived for the first year
- Must be full-time, and have submitted a Cal Dream Act or FAFSA


