On-Line Safety

The speed and extent of which the internet is advancing is staggering. I spent a lesson with Year 2 this week talking about internet safety, and was amazed at how these young, clever childen knew how technology can help them; in fact they took it very much for granted! How do you think Little Red Riding Hood could find her way around in the deep dark forest? "She would use Google maps, of course!" How would Cinderella buy her outfit for the ball using the internet? "She would use on-line shopping, Mrs. Sykes!" - although they weren't sure where the money would come from!

The children also knew that the Interent can be dangerous and they must not speak to anyone on-line who they do not know. Splendid!



However, there is another concern that they could not really grasp: the risk to their wellbeing by spending too much time on a device. Being glued to a screen

can limit social skills and confidence and this can also be seen as anti-social and even rude.

We also know that many of our pupils play computer games that are rated above their age. Ageratings are given because the games are not appropriate for younger children. Games are designed to be addictive on purpose and they can 'pull' children into a world that is unsuitable for their mental wellbeing. Some parents tell me they are not able to stop their child playing inappropriately-aged computer games because all of their friends play them. I would like to appeal to parents to be strong and united; the children will have plenty of opportunity to play computer games when they are older.

Advice on the coronavirus for places of education

How serious is the coronavirus?

- it can cause flu-like symptoms, including fever, cough & difficulty breathing
- the infection is not serious for most people, including children
- · there is currently no vaccine
- most people get better with enough rest, water to drink and medicine for pain

How likely are you to catch the virus?

- you can only catch it if you have been close to a person who has the virus
- the chance of being in contact with the virus is currently low in the UK
- if you have travelled to areas where many people are infected, your chance of catching the virus is higher, i.e. China and any affected areas

How can you stop coronaviruses spreading?

If you need to cough or sneeze



Catch it with a tissue



Bin it



Kill it by washing your hands with soap & water or hand sanitiser

You should wash hands with soap & water or hand sanitiser



After breaks & sport



Before cooking & eating



On arrival at any childcare or educational



After using the toilet

What should you do if you feel unwell?
