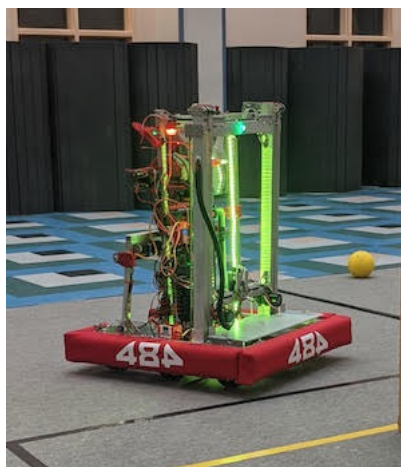
### Hi Q headed to the Finals

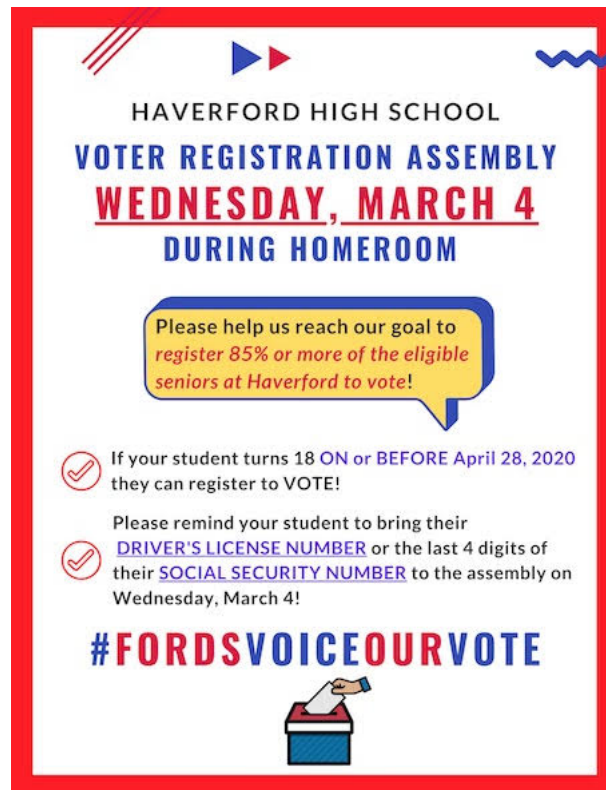

## Delaware County Community College's Placement Test:

Any student interested in taking Delaware County Community College's Placement test here at Haverford should register in the Counseling Office by March 18<sup>th</sup> to reserve your spot. The test will be given on Thursday, March 26<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am in room 138. Please be aware that there are limited seats and they will be filled on a first come, first served basis. You do not need to take the placement test if you had the following scores on the SAT or ACT: SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing (500), Math (530) or ACT English (18), Math (20).

## Senior Survey:

Prior to graduation, every senior will be required to complete the Senior Survey. It is considered an obligation. The survey will be used to update the information in Naviance regarding where you applied, the outcomes of your applications and where you plan to attend, or what your plans are following graduation. If you are planning to attend a post-secondary institution, this is also where you will complete your final transcript request. The senior survey will open in Naviance on May 1<sup>st</sup>.

There is an active list of scholarships posted in Naviance. These scholarships may be local or national. Students should check the list to see if they meet any of the scholarship criteria and use this as an additional resource in their scholarship search.

## Scholar Snapp

Common App has made it easy for applicants to access scholarship opportunities directly through their admissions application by giving you the option to connect your information with Scholar Snapp! Scholar Snapp makes it easier to apply for scholarships by allowing you to apply to multiple scholarships without having to re-enter your information each time. Instead, you can reuse your information from one application to another. Fill out one application and simply import it, or "snapp" it, to a Scholar Snapp profile to use again next time. ## You've been accepted to college, now what should you do?

Congratulations! Being accepted to college is the hardest part. You now need to figure out which college is the best fit for you. Looking at several different options will hopefully help you and your family to make the best decision.

1. **Celebrate!**  
You have worked hard and should be proud of all that you have accomplished!
2. **Be patient and consider all of your options**  
You may have been accepted to one or some of your schools, but it is best to wait until you have all of your decisions back to weigh all of your options, unless you applied Early Decision. If you applied Early Decision, you will need to submit a deposit and withdraw all of your other applications.
3. **Compare the \$\$\$**  
Sometimes you will receive a financial award letter with your acceptance, but in other cases, it may come later. It is important to compare the financial details of each school. This can be done using a spreadsheet to compare the bottom lines. What initially appears as the cheapest is not always the least expensive when you consider grants and institutional scholarships.
4. **Attend an accepted students day or visit the campus again**  
Visit the campus to see how it feels and if you feel like it is a good fit for you. This will

also give you a chance to connect with other students who have been accepted.

5. **Research**

Do a little extra research and make a pros and cons list. Look at what students are doing who have graduated from the school, what options are available to students who are there, and the co-op/internship opportunities.

6. **Commit**

Once you have decided on your school, send in the deposit \$ and make your decision official. Remember that you have until May 1st to decide, but can make a decision prior to then as well.

7. **Keep working hard**

Getting into college is the hardest part, but you must remember to keep up your grades and keep working until the very end. You have been accepted, but your acceptance is conditional until the school receives your final transcripts.

### Official SAT Practice on Khan Academy:

- Big results – 20 hours of practice was associated with an average of 115 point increase from the PSAT to the SAT.

### Creating good study and work habits now will help you to be more successful:

As you are progressing through second semester, this may be the time to look for new ways to change your study habits and improve your grades. If you are struggling to keep up with a class or are falling behind, here are some things you can do to help improve your grades and work habits. Please remember to reach out to your teacher or counselor if you have any questions or you need some support.

1. Create a homework schedule and a process for reviewing what you need to complete for each class. Block out a time after school and eliminate distractions.
2. Find a new place to complete homework. Maybe visit the HHS Library or the Haverford Township Library after school to find a quiet place to get work done.
3. Develop and vary your study methods. You can review study guides, complete practice problems, create flashcards or create a quizlet.
4. Organize a list of what you need to accomplish each day and cross off each item as you complete it.
5. Attend a session in the math center or writing center for extra help. These services are offered every week and give you an opportunity to get some help in a smaller setting.

The Math Center is open on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 2:30-3:30 pm in room 337

The Writing Center is open on Wednesdays from 2:30-3:30 pm in the Library

6. Ask your teacher if you can meet with them outside of your regular class time. Some teachers will meet with students before school, after school, during homeroom or during lunch. Touch base with your teacher and see when they are available to meet.
