2. Following Up on Monday's Letter from Sharyn Mehner

You all received a letter from Assistant Principal Mehner on Monday regarding a fight between some students at North Creek. Fights are always scary to those who watch them (even if they say they aren't) and as the letter stated:

"Any time a student or students resort(s) to physical means to resolve conflict, it is a serious concern for us. Of course, we respond with appropriate disciplinary measures in line with state laws and Northshore's policies and procedures. We also take steps to work with the students and their families, as well as the peers or friends of any students involved.

We are deeply committed to each student feeling safe, welcomed, and appreciated. We encourage all students to tell an adult if they have any safety concerns and to report any threatening behaviors immediately. If you or your student have an urgent concern or are aware of an incident that is in progress, dial 911. Otherwise, there are many ways to share your concern. Tell a teacher, administrator, or use our <u>SafeSchools alert system</u> to report the concern anonymously."

If you, as a parent, need to report information, you can use the SafeSchools Alert system, you can email or call the Administration at North Creek, or you can connect with your student's counselor. Connecting with the Administration is also the best, most accurate way to get information about what's happening. We'll give you as much info as we can in as timely a fashion as we can - which sometimes is not immediate due to the fact that we might be in the middle of investigating events. If possible, I do request that you refrain from posting on Facebook as almost always those posts cause more fear than is necessary and most of the time, the folks posting have not yet checked with Administration for accurate info.

3. Rumours about the "Senior Assassin" Game

Credible rumor has it that Senior Assassin has started up again this year, and that it is happening at several schools in the area (and across the Nation - this has been a game going on for a decade or more). Senior Assassin in a game where kids pay \$50 (at least that's what I've heard it costs at NCHS) to play and they "shoot" each other with Nerf guns. Each student has a "hit list" of other kids in the game they are supposed to get. If you get "shot" you are out of the game. This continues until there is one winner. Most of the action takes place in the community, and honestly, at many of your houses.

I cannot emphasize to you as parents and families how important it is that kids DO NOT bring any Nerf guns to campus - either in their cars or in their backpacks. As the <u>District Student Rights and Responsibilities</u> states, "toy, "dummy" or look-a-like objects that appear to be a firearm" can result in a Suspension.

Thanks in advance for talking with your teen about the game, about why they would spend \$50 on such a game, and for making sure they do not under any circumstance bring any Nerf (or other) guns to school. As you can imagine, a suspension that mentions "weapon" is not something you want in your child's discipline file.
